The Board of Trustees of Florence County School District Five met for regular session on Monday, March 27, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. at the District Office Boardroom.

- 1. **Call to Order, Welcome, and Pledge of Allegiance** Chairman Timmons called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. He welcomed those present and asked everyone to stand and join in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- Confirmation of Notice to Media Chairman Timmons stated that in accordance with the S.C. Code of Laws, 1976, as amended, Section 30-4-80(E), the following were notified of this meeting: *Morning News, NPO News, WMBF-TV, WPDE-TV, and www.fsd5.org.*
- 3. Approval of Agenda The Agenda was approved by general consent of the board.
- 4. **Public Forum** There was no one present to address the board in Public Forum.
- 5. **Consent Agenda** (A-C) Chairman Timmons reviewed the items of the Consent Agenda which included Board Minutes for February 27, 2023, Monthly Financial Statement for February, and School Food Services Statement for February. All items passed by general consent of the board.

### 6. Regular Agenda

- A. Superintendent's Report and Updates:
  - 1. Legislative Mrs. Prosser said the bill creating Academic Choice in Education (ACE) was amended, approved and sent to the House.
  - 2. Student Highlights On March 22, students from JES participated in Special Olympics in Pamplico. In student highlights, Mrs. Prosser said the JHS Bass Fishing Team finished 4<sup>th</sup> in the region. She said the JES Adjective Fashion Show was a success. In Athletics, Mrs. Prosser invited the board to come out and support Flashes baseball and softball. She said the Academic Challenge Team finished 5<sup>th</sup> in the region.
  - 3. Academics In an academic update, Mr. Goins reviewed the Learning Walks data with board members. He outlined the March, April, and May academics calendar for districtwide testing. Mrs. Powell asked Mr. Goins about algebra credits in regards to NCAA eligibility requirements. A discussion ensued, and Mr. Goins later provided further information to the board concerning the course requirements.

- 4. Operations Mr. Kennedy gave the following information:
  - A. Technology All schools and district office copiers have been replaced under a new lease agreement with Carolina Business Equipment with a cost savings to the district. All teacher and staff computers are being replaced over spring break and covered under a three-year onsite repair warranty.
  - B. Food Service National School Breakfast week was recently celebrated with incentives for students eating breakfast.
  - C. Maintenance JHS Gym renovation planning is continuing smoothly. The pre-bid meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, March 29, at 10:00 a.m. for the JHS Field House renovation, and the RFP has been published. A vendor has been selected to run sewer connections for the new track building. RFP to be published soon for buildings for JHS track building and JMS storage building.
  - D. Safety Wiring of the JHS PA system has been completed. Install of equipment is anticipated to begin mid-April.
