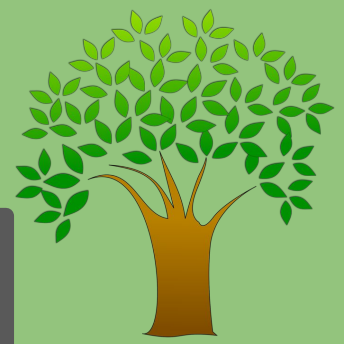
Students used their pumpkins on Halloween for pumpkin math day to weigh and measure and explore their pumpkins with the help of the 6th grade class.
