




So the title Timelass excites universall to the basis of a normal adult life. High school is simply the prequel to an exciting, abundant life.






A Superlative Afternoon

From one year to the next, advancements are necessary and thrilling. Sophomores now have a year of school under



And so the stress begins, and teachers and students begin missing the seemingly carefree days of summer. However, because this is a new year, everyone has hope that this year will be better than the






## The Language of Numbers

Senior year is a way to celebrate graduating high school by taking part in your school's activities and making your mark. After all, you're only a senior once, so try your best to make it count!








### Let's Get





# Scoring with Girls Soccer




# Stepping Up the Act with Performing Arts

### Directing the Marching Band



Senior bowling team member, Tyler Walton, once said, "Bowling is a whole lot of fun. It takes the stress from the day away."




#### Valedictorian John Garland
