**Welcome & Agenda**

- Mrs. Huggins opened the meeting by welcoming everyone and reviewing the agenda for the night.
- Agenda:
  - Vision Statements (Reading and Math) Review
  - I-Ready Data Update
  - Revisit/Revise School Improvement Goals

**Discussion of HQIM and Vision Statements for FSD5**

- Mrs. Huggins introduced what HQIM (High Quality Instructional Materials) are and how they are implemented at JMS with i-Ready (Math) and HMH (Reading).
  - Discussed the shared vision that was created for our district that will be implemented for all 3 schools.
    - One vision was that all schools would use the same HQIM.
    - Strengthening PLCs to support teachers with HQIM implementation.
    - Exploring and using observation tools to strengthen implementation.
- Mrs. Huggins presented the FSD5 Literacy Vision Statement and had paper copies available for participants:
  - All students in FSD5 deserve access to meaningful, standards-aligned, grade-level, high-quality curriculum that builds confident, capable readers, writers, and communicators.
    - Mrs. Huggins also presented how this relates to each level of stakeholders, including students, teachers, and parents.
- Mrs. Huggins then presented and discussed the FSD5 Math Vision Statement:
  - All students in FSD5 deserve access to meaningful, standards-aligned, grade-level, high-quality curriculum and instructional materials that develop conceptual understanding, procedural fluency, critical thinking skills, and competence.
    - Mrs. Huggins described again how this relates to all stakeholders.

**i-Ready Spring Data Reading**

- Mrs. Huggins presented the data from students' Spring diagnostic testing for reading and math, including showing the growth that has been made from the fall diagnostic to the spring.
- Mrs. Huggins also presented the incentives that students will receive for meeting their typical and stretch growth goals on their Spring diagnostic.

## **SC Ready Prep**

- Students will be regrouped in Enrichment classes to fill in gaps. This will help to target students and to show growth at all levels.
- Tutoring: Student tutoring sessions are starting this week to target students who are close to scoring “Met” on SC Ready.
- Reading/Math Classes: Continuing to implement HQIM, making sure all standards are covered before testing.
- Mrs. Huggins also presented the dates that SC READY will be administered at JMS.

## **SIC Goals**

- Improved Communication: Achieved by using the Remind App and email updates
- Fundraising Ideas: Using the digital sign instead of a Spirit Rock
  - Allow parents to purchase, for a small fee, an announcement on the digital sign for birthdays and for highlighting student achievements
- Other Ideas:
  - Using the digital sign as an improvement goal – highlighting more student achievements without it being a fundraiser
  - Reinstating and advertising for our school PTO and gauging interest from other parents.
    - Reinstating a PTO would be beneficial for more parent and community involvement, assistance with events that are taking place, and potentially helping with fundraising and funding incentives.

- Mrs. Bellflowers informed the committee that we will be having a career day again this year.
