Dear Shasta County Board of Supervisors,

On behalf of Shasta County school districts, we write to urge you to consider setting aside 10% of the recently allocated opioid settlement funds to support school-based prevention and intervention efforts that address youth substance use within our community. As our county received a substantial \$10.5 million to date, with an expected total of \$38.9 million through the 2038-2039 fiscal year, we have the opportunity to invest in the health and well-being of Shasta County's future generations.

We recognize the many needs within our community and the variety of ways these funds could be utilized for impactful purposes. However, the opioid settlement funds offer a unique and timely avenue to make strategic investments in our schools to address the root causes of substance use and addiction. By investing in programs designed to educate, engage, and support our youth through school-based initiatives, we create a pathway toward a generation equipped to live free from opioid addiction and its ripple effects on their lives, families, and communities.

The urgency of this effort is underscored by data. According to the California Healthy Kids Survey, 48% of Shasta County 11th graders report having tried alcohol or other drugs, while 25% report current use. These numbers reflect the scale of substance use among our youth—a reality compounded by the increasing presence of fentanyl in recreational drugs, which has transformed casual substance use into a potentially fatal risk. Nationally, fentanyl is now the leading cause of death for adults ages 18 to 45, a statistic that reflects the life-threatening danger our youth face as they transition to adulthood. These alarming trends highlight the critical need for school-based prevention and intervention programs that target substance use early, before it escalates into a long-term or life-threatening issue.

Increases in youth substance use rates and the forever-changed fentanyl-laden recreational drug landscape highlight the urgency of addressing youth substance use in our schools. Rising substance use trends among our students indicate not only a need for immediate intervention but also for sustained, preventative measures that reach youth early and consistently. This approach aligns with allowable activities for these funds, particularly in education and student engagement. For Shasta County, directing a portion of settlement dollars to develop and strengthen these types of programs means taking critical steps toward reversing the troubling trends we see in substance use among young people.

The existing framework within our schools already strives to support youth in need; however, the increasing complexities of substance use have stretched these resources thin. A recently established workgroup examining our countywide expelled youth plan underscored the struggle to adequately serve students who have been affected by substance use. These students—who are in alternative education settings—often require additional resources, including mental health and substance use support, to engage in their education fully. The lack of sufficient resources, both within and outside the classroom, only amplifies the challenges in guiding these youth toward healthier and more productive lives.

Additionally, recent changes in state policy, which restrict the use of informal probation for minors, and the local decision to close Crystal Creek Boys Camp in 2009, have further compounded the challenges in supporting at-risk youth. For many of these students, schools represent their primary, and sometimes only, consistent connection to a positive support system. Schools, when appropriately resourced, can serve as a critical line of defense against substance use disorders by providing education, intervention, and engagement programs that support long-term health and success.

Yet, as a community, we have an urgent need to reverse the cycle for students who face expulsion or disciplinary issues, where too often a single misstep can lead to a lifelong pattern of disengagement, substance use, and limited opportunities. We have an opportunity—and a responsibility—to stop the pattern that leaves once-expelled students facing a dead-end future and, for many, passing this cycle of substance use on to future generations. By using these funds to create strong, supportive interventions, we can offer real alternatives and foster a path toward success that reaches beyond punitive measures. This approach will help ensure that our schools become a place not only for academic growth but also for meaningful second chances, where every student has the support to envision—and achieve—a better future.

We recognize that today's meeting was scheduled to hear proposals from community organizations and entities regarding the opioid settlement funds, with only two weeks to prepare these presentations. While we commend the county's openness to community involvement, we believe that a truly effective use of these dollars will require significant planning and collaboration. To that end, we do not come today with a specific proposal or a budget; rather, we come with a simple ask: that 10% of the opioid settlement funds be set aside for a school-based prevention and intervention project. This approach would allow the time necessary to develop a comprehensive, cross-district plan that maximizes the impact of this significant investment.

Setting aside 10% of the settlement funds for school initiatives would allow us to expand existing promising practices such as DEA agent, Rocky Herron's annual program and expand collaboration with local law enforcement partners—including Probation, the Shasta County Sheriff's Office, and local police departments—in designing an evidence-informed, countywide strategy. Such collaboration would ensure that all students across Shasta County have increased access to the resources and support they need, maximizing the return on this investment. This approach would also allow for collective buy-in across districts, aligning our efforts with law enforcement's critical insights and resources.


If we delay addressing substance use prevention and intervention among youth today, we risk increasing costs and challenges down the line as these young people enter adulthood. Conversely, by acting now, we capitalize on a unique opportunity to significantly impact the trajectory of our community's health and resilience. We respectfully ask that the Board refrain from fully allocating the settlement funds at this time and, instead, set aside 10% to allow for a thoughtful, organized approach that prioritizes the well-being of Shasta County's youth.

Thank you for considering this request to invest in the long-term health and safety of our students and our community. Together, we can make a lasting difference in the fight against substance use and the impacts of the opioid epidemic in Shasta County.

ANNUAL ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING OF THE BOARD

Education Code 35143 requires that an annual organization meeting of the Board be held within 15 days after the 2nd Friday in December (December 14-28, 2024). The date, time, and location of this meeting shall be set at the Board Meeting immediately preceding the organizational meeting. The Clerk of the Board shall notify members at least 15 days prior to the organizational meeting date. The Clerk shall also notify the County Superintendent of Schools of the date and time of the organizational meeting.

Education Code Section 35022 requires every school district Board consisting of five or more members to elect a President from its membership at each organizational meeting. In addition, each district (except a community college district) will elect a Clerk.

Further business of the annual organizational meeting shall include setting of the date, time, and location for regular meetings and the authorization of persons to sign warrants.

School districts that are not in an election year, the law now allows the organizational meetings to be held between December 1 and December 20:

The governing board of each school district shall hold an annual organizational meeting. In a year in which a regular election for governing board members is conducted, the meeting shall be held on a day within a 15-day period that commences with the second Friday in December following the regular election.

Organizational meetings in years in which no such regular election for governing board members is conducted shall be held on any date in December, but no later than December 20.

(Education Code, section 35143(a) [emphasis added].) So long as this is not an election year for the district in question, their organizational meeting can be held anytime between December 1^{et} and December 20^e.

The Appointment In Lieu of Election must be an action item on your Board Agenda and take place prior to November 5,2024. Following are the procedures to follow:

Appointment In Lieu of Election

An Appointment In Lieu of Election is required when the number of candidates who have filed to be a Governing Board Member does not exceed the number of offices to be filled.

Attached is a *Certificate of Election and Oath of Office* from the Elections Department for each of those candidates that are to be Appointed In Lieu of Election for your district. The length of term and ending date is stated on each certificate. Also provided is a sample *Appointment In Lieu of Election Resolution* for you to revise and include in your Board packet for approval.

Upon appointment, please complete the *Certificate of Election and Oath of Office* and obtain the necessary signatures. The original certificate is for the candidate, the copy marked "CLERK COPY" is to be returned to the Elections Department, and the copy marked "COPY" is for your district records.

In addition, please forward a copy of the signed Certificate of Election and Oath of Office and Appointment In Lieu of Election Resolution to my office.

Again, Governing Board Members that are Appointed In Lieu of Election are to be appointed by your Board prior to November 5, 2024. They will take office on the second Friday in December and serve the term As If elected.

Please note that as my office is responsible for tracking Governing Board Members and reporting changes to the Elections Department, it is essential that we receive copies of the Certificate of Election and Oath of Office, and Appointment in Lieu of Election Resolution.

As a reminder, on occasion, there may be a reason for a Board Member to resign. Per Ed. Code 5090 a Governing Board Member vacancy resulting from a resignation occurs when the resignation is filed with the County Superintendent of Schools. Please be sure that all resignations are sent to my office so that they can be officially recognized. When making a provisional appointment to fill the vacancy, please complete the *Certificate of Appointment of Governing Board Members* and forward a copy to my office so that we can keep our records and the Elections Department updated on current Board Members.
