### Kindergarten Mrs. Tinnin

We started to learn our letter sounds! For each letter students will learn how to write the letter, the ASL hand gesture for each letter, and letter chant to help us remember the sound. This week students are learning about the letters 'm', 'a', 'd', and 't'. TK is also learning their letters, but at a slower pace. They learned about the letter 'Mm'.

This week kindergarten finished comparing numbers 1-5. They learned how to compare numbers to discover if they are the same, greater than, or less than. Kindergarten also started learning about numbers 6-10. TK is working on finding objects that go together. Their lessons have gradually increased in criteria. First



they started out with finding things exactly alike, then similar, and now they are working on finding pairs that go together-like a crayon and paper. TK is also learning about numbers 1-5.

During circle time all students are learning about the months of the year, the days of the week, counting the days on the calendar, and patterns.

## Third and Fourth Grade Classroom Mrs. Mars

This week 3rd graders finished their math unit on graphing by creating a survey, polling their classmates and recording the data into five different types of graphs! Next week they will start their introduction into multiplication. Fourth graders have continued to work on their chapter about multiplying larger numbers. All fourth graders have now learned how to multiply using regrouping, the strategy that their parents were taught and know! In addition to this they have learned a few other strategies that they can choose between.

This week our class had the chance to visit the Thorbecks pool each day for swimming lessons. Thank you Evaline Boosters for sponsoring this important learning activity!



# First and Second Grade Explorers Mrs. Mittge
