

READINESS At Clatskanie Elementary School we have been working to improve students' academic school readiness by building and fostering relationships with local preschool and childcare providers to support pre-kindergarten learning programs and to ensure successful transitions to CES. Once again this year CES was able to

offer all incoming kindergarten students a week long Kinder Kamp to prepare them for a successful transition to school. We are continuing to develop systems to support the transition of students and families from pre-k programs to CES.
