Middle School Goals

- Goal #1: By the end of the FY26 school year, LCMS will increase the overall GMAS proficiency scores by 5% as compared to the FY25 GMAS proficiency scores.
- Goal #2: By the end of the FY26 school year, LCMS will increase the overall student attendance rate by decreasing the number of students missing 10 or more days of school by 5% as compared to the FY25 school year.

District Goals

- Goal #1: The District shall increase the percentage of students scoring proficient and distinguished on the Georgia Milestones Assessment by 5% as compared to the 2023-2024 scores.
- Goal #2: The District will decrease the percentage of students who are absent more than 10 days by 5% as compared to the 2024-2025 student attendance rate.
