From the Principal

Hello Everyone,

We are excited to see all of our Aggie Achievers tomorrow 1/29/24! We are ready for another exciting week of instruction!

Parents - please speak with your children about the dress code. We are specifically having problems with the following portions of the dress code at the middle and high school levels:

- 7. Leggings, jeggings, tights, yoga pants, stretch pants, and spandex pants are not permissible to be worn as stand-alone apparel.
- 8. Leggings, jeggings, or tights can only be worn under clothing that already meets dress code requirements in length and appropriateness (i.e. leggings, jeggings, and tights should not be worn under shorts or dresses that do not already meet length requirements).
- 17. Hats, caps, bandanas, headbands, and sweat bands, and hoods attached to hoodies, and all other head coverings are not allowed to be worn in the classroom or in any other part of the building.

The following clothing apparel and accessories are prohibited: Pants: Torn jeans or jeans with holes which expose skin more than 4 inches above the knee, cut-offs, pajama pants, sagging pants, leggings, jeggings, tights, yoga pants, stretch pants, and spandex pants worn as stand-alone apparel, sweat pants, and pants with writing across the seat of the pants.

We are working together to address these violations, but we need your help. Lately, when addressing the dress code violations - particularly hats - students have been showing a level of disrespect toward the staff members addressing the violation. We want our focus to be on education and academics when students are in school. We need your help in making sure that students are dressed appropriately each day, so we can all keep our focus where it needs to be. Thank you for your help with this matter!

Parents - please stay on top of your child's academic grades by checking the Infinite Campus Parent Portal to see their grades. If you do not have a login, please email Dr. Heather Page (hpage@sowegastemcharter.org) to get your login information for your child.

Please speak with your child about behavior as we begin the third quarter of school. We would like to have a lesser amount of referrals as we work toward the end of the year. Some of the most prominent behaviors that we saw during the first nine weeks included - vapes, disrespect toward others, and disruption of the classroom and learning. There are some non-negotiable behaviors that will not be tolerated on the first offense to include drugs and creditable threats to others. It is imperative that we speak about these behaviors, so students will understand that consequences will be applied.

Parents of students that ride buses - PLEASE adhere to the requirements at each location because we cannot afford to lose the places that we are allowed to drop off and pick up at! If you cannot follow the rules, your child will not be able to ride the bus:

- Do not park on the grass or drive on the grass (already received a warning from Miller Supply Co in Cuthbert)
- Do not park near the gas pumps or block entrance of customers (already received 2 warnings from LocStop in Dawson)
- Do not speed through the location
- Be mindful of students exiting the buses
- Do not use profanity or disrespectful language to the drivers, monitors, or other parents and students
- Do not liter

We are having so many Achievers that are being checked out early throughout the week - especially on Fridays. Please remember - EARLY CHECKOUTS ARE DISCOURAGED AFTER 2:30 PM. Early checkouts after 2:30 PM are discouraged due to ongoing instructional practices that include remedial and acceleration opportunities for Achievers. In addition, students are also transitioning to various areas to prepare for dismissal. Please remember that unexcused 5 unexcused tardies and early checkouts will be counted as an absence as well. Although early checkouts are discouraged, we do realize that extenuating circumstances such as doctor's appointments and family emergencies will occur. We will make every effort to accommodate, but **please do not come to check your child out to simply avoid waiting in the car rider line.**

If you need a change in transportation, you must provide this IN WRITING. This can be through a note sent to school with your child or you can email transportation@sowegastemcharter.org to request the change. These requests should be in place no later than 1:30 pm on the day of the request.

Attendance - We are beginning our new attendance policy this year. The basics from this policy are as follows:

- 5 unexcused absences you will receive a letter and attend a conference about attendance
- 7 unexcused absences you will receive a letter with a reminder that your child can only miss 3 more days before he/she may be withdrawn from the school
- 10 unexcused absences your child may be withdrawn from Southwest Georgia STEM Charter School

Reminders:

- If your child is absent, he/she will have 3 days to bring in their excuse after returning to school
- You may write up to 3 parent notes during the school year
- Your child will have 3 days to make up any missing assignments while he/she was absent






From our MTSS Coordinator....

News from the Graduation Coach...

I will continue to share important reminders below. The focus for all high school achievers should be to show up daily, be prepared, and work hard in the classroom. This will keep them on track to reaching their goals.

Here are some friendly reminders for our seniors:

- I had three students return forms for our FAFSA assistance appointments. If you meant to turn that in and did not, please contact me on Monday by the end of the day.
- If you are meeting with Katie Minich, please see below what you must bring. I will confirm your appointment time with you this week.

Both the student and the parent will need to establish their FSA ID at least three days before the meeting if they do not already have one established. Here is the link from Federal Student Aid to establish their FSA ID. https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch

Hey Aggie Parents!

I have heard many teachers share that parents are curious and interested in helping their child increase his or her MAP scores by the end of the year. Well, I have just the thing that is proven over and over throughout the years to do just that!

Research shows that people (not just students) who read 20 minutes a day have a stronger vocabulary, a deeper ability for comprehension, and are more skilled in writing. A book is the best example a child can have when it comes to how words are correctly spelled, how sentences are formed, how stories are structured (beginning, middle, end, plot, conflict, resolution, etc), and how stronger vocabulary is used appropriately. Reading books is also proven to help a child think independently and make predictions by using the stories clues along the way.

In addition, a child who shares what they just read to another person, strengthens the child's ability to sequence details in order, and restate the main ideas of what the author is trying to say. All of the skills mentioned above are skills that our MAP test assesses our students on throughout the year. I promise that if you set aside 20 minutes Monday - Friday for your child to read, you will see growth in their end of the year MAP and Milestones assessments.

To help support our student population's growth of reading, students in grades K-12 participate in Accelerated Reader. Each time a student reads a book, he or she can take an AR test and are awarded points or words towards their classroom goals. Students who meet their goals at the end of each semester are awarded with a cost free field trip!! Our teachers have updated the AR goals for this semester, which are listed below. Please share these goals with your child and as a family, work at encouraging your child to meet his or her goal.

Kindergarten	5000 words	
First Grade	18,000 words	
Second Grade	38,000 words	
Third Grade	60,000 words	
Fourth Grade	80,000 words	
Fifth Grade	250,000 words
