The Randolph County Board of Education met in regular session on Monday, July 17, 2006, at 4:30 p.m. in Board Room B at the Central Office.

## **Budget Work Session**

Vice Chair Becky Coltrane called the work session to order to discuss county appropriations in regard to the 2006-2007 budget. Superintendent Andrews expressed appreciation to County Commissioners for their increased funding to the school system. Commissioners did not fully fund the budget request since they realized that there would be an increase in state discretionary funds. Finance Officer Todd Lowe reviewed the current expense budget and reported that the system received a 6.66% increase over last year. Expansion items to be funded include Middle School Math/Science Lead Teacher \$47,000; 2.5% Classified Supplement \$195,000; Coaching Supplement Allotments \$45,000; Exceptional Children Coordinator \$65,000; Bus Mechanic \$35,000; for a total of \$387,000. He also reviewed expansion items using state funds including signing bonuses for exceptional children, math, and science teachers \$70,000; high school testing/drop out coordinator \$120,000; high school NovaNet facilitator \$100,000; nurse \$50,000; elementary classified position \$391,000; AP course supplies/online studies \$32,000; for a total of \$763,000. Assistant Superintendent Amy Cagle reported 25-30 certified vacancies for the 2006-2007 school year. Superintendent Andrews stated that there was not an increase in teacher supplements included in the budget since teachers would be receiving an average 6.5% increase in pay through state funding. There were questions concerning how lottery funds would be distributed to school systems. Mr. Lowe reported that when those funds become available, they would be designated for specific programs. Mr. Lowe also reviewed the Archdale-Trinity and Child Nutrition budgets. Executive Director Bob Scherer reviewed the capital outlay budget with an increase in funding of 1.31%. The increase will allow for the lease of additional mobile units to provide classroom space for increased student population and the purchase of three new school buses. Superintendent Andrews stated that the budget would be presented for final approval when state and federal allotments are received.

The Board adjourned for a meal and then returned to open session.

## Call to Order

#### Federal Programs

Federal Programs Director Linda Bassetti reviewed No Child Left Behind regulations, the importance of Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP), and actions that would take place should a school fail to make AYP two consecutive years. She reviewed the subgroups which could affect AYP in schools and system-wide. One subgroup, Free and Reduced Lunch, increased 9.1% last year and 6.6% this year. A subgroup for Hispanics is concentrated in a few schools, but has an impact on the LEA. English as a Second Language (ESL) increased 8.6% this year. Ten percent of the Title I funds are spent on staff development for early reading, high school, ESL, and exceptional children. Randolph County has two schools under Watch, Randleman Elementary, which met 22 out of 25 targets, and Southmont Elementary, which met 18 of 21 targets. If these schools do not meet their targets this year, they become a School of Choice. She reviewed plans that were being made to prepare for students to have the opportunity to attend other schools if this should occur.

## 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 School Calendars

Superintendent Donald Andrews presented revised calendars for the 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 school years. These revised calendars reflect the addition of Memorial Day as a holiday in May. G. Lawson made a motion seconded by G. Cook that the calendars be approved as presented. The motion carried: 7-0.

### Approval of Construction Bids for Providence Grove High School

Architect Katherine Peele and Director of Construction and Facilities Bob Scherer presented bids on the Providence Grove High School project. Mrs. Peele reported five general contractors had bid the project and Devere Construction presented the lowest base bid at \$28,957,000 with alternates as follows: Proprietary Boilers/Burners – No Charge; Proprietary Door Hardware – No Charge; Polished Concrete Slab Finish \$20,000; Acoustical Treatment - \$61,000,; and Aluminum Feeders in lieu of copper \$170,000 (deduct) for a total bid of \$28,886,800. B. Coltrane made a motion seconded by J. Johnson that the Board approve the bid by Devere Construction in the amount of \$28,886,800 including alternates and a total budget for the project of \$34,458,389. The motion carried: 7-0.

### Appointment of Board Members to District Line Committee

Chair LaVerne Williams appointed Tommy McDonald and Janet Johnson to serve on the District Line Committee to represent the Board of Education.
