Graduation Requirements

Graduation takes place every year for all students that are able to satisfy all RHBOE requirements over the duration of their high school career. In order to meet graduation requirements, students will need **25 course credits and 50 hours of community service** by the end of their senior year. A complete breakdown can be reviewed on the RHHS website and/or the RHHS Student Handbook.



Terrier Pride

The RHHS student handbook is written for our students and their parents. The material covered within this student handbook is intended as a method of communicating to students and parents regarding general district information, rules and procedures. The student handbook is designed to be in alignment with the Rocky Hill Board of Education policies. Please be aware that the handbook is updated yearly, while policy adoption and revision may occur throughout the year. Changes in policy that affect portions of the student handbook will be communicated by school administration.

Below are details to know for the upcoming school year:

ACCEPTANCE: Regardless of race, creed, background, or beliefs the Rocky Hill High School community is committed to being a place where everyone, whether a student or staff member, is to be accepted as part of a vibrant, positive and welcoming environment. Being kind and nice represents our school climate.



ATTENDANCE: *Research indicates student success in schools is strongly correlated to consistent attendance.* Unless your child is under the weather, we encourage students to attend school consistently. The attendance policy is located in the RHHS Student Handbook. When your child will be absent for the day, the preferred method of reporting the absence is to access PowerSchool and indicate the reason for your child's absence. This should be done prior to 7:30 a.m. The advantage of reporting via PowerSchool is that the parent does not need to send in any additional correspondence for absences one (1) thru nine (9). However, absences ten (10+) and more require the appropriate medical documentation to be excused. The RHHS Student Handbook has more detailed information regarding excused and unexcused absences.

CREDIT LOSS: Seat time equals learning time. In order for students to pass a course and earn credit towards graduation they must be present. Students will lose credit for excessive absences. In a full year (1.0) course, a student will lose credit on the 17th absence; in a semester course (.50), a student will lose course credit on the 9th absence. Loss of credit letters are shared with the student and parent. If you believe your child has had to miss school due to extenuating circumstances then a Loss of Credit Appeals form (purple form) must be sent to the schools attendance committee for review. In the event an appeal has been approved, you and your child will be notified. However, if this request is not approved, credit recovery sessions (which are limited) may be scheduled in order for your child to earn back dates lost. Credit recovery sessions are scheduled on Saturdays only when the Attendance Committee has offered credit recovery sessions as an option.

TIMELINESS: *Early is on time, on time is late!*

At 7:15 a.m., the doors to RHHS will open for students to enter the building. Upon entering the school all students must scan into the school using their RHHS student ID. The first period class begins at 7:35 a.m. The school doors are locked at 7:30 a.m. Students tardy to period 1 will receive warnings (5 warnings per quarter) and then school disciplinary consequences (90 minute detentions) will be issued on the sixth (6th) and subsequent tardies to school. Please emphasize to your child the importance of being on time and punctual.

MORNING DROP OFF: The traffic around the high school builds up due to the combination of buses, student drivers, staff members arriving to work, and families choosing to drop off their student. School administration encourages students and families to take advantage of the bus transportation provided by the district. Bus students arrive to RHHS and are dropped off at 7:15 a.m. in the bus loop in the back of the building. (NO CARS ARE PERMITTED!) To ensure students arriving to their first period class on time, I ask all parents dropping their child off to access Chapin Avenue and use the drop off lane. RHHS senior drivers will have assigned parking spots and should access the student parking lot only. Teachers will park in the teacher designated lot.

CELL PHONES: Though we live in a digital age, it is important to emphasize the importance of time and place regarding cell phone use. Students are allowed to have a cell phone and use it during passing times or in common areas. Cell phones are to be placed in classroom cell phone pockets upon arriving to class. Refusal to follow school policy may result in confiscation of the device and a parent pickup of the device. Complete disregard for the policy may result in additional disciplinary action by school administration. Students are not allowed to make face time or traditional calls. The majority of our teachers plan lessons and activities requiring students to use their Chromebooks, which reduces/eliminates the need to access cell phones during instructional time. I respectfully ask all parents/guardians to partner with the school in reinforcing this message with their children so that our students' attention can be focused on classroom lessons and activities. Lastly, taking photos or the video recording of other students and/or staff is prohibited and violates school policy. Furthermore, sending images, photos, or videos where it mocks any other student or school personnel or is posted that is hurtful in nature violates the student code of conduct and may lead to school disciplinary action including possible expulsion and arrest.

RESPECT FOR PROPERTY: Our school is maintained and cleaned with the intent of providing the best possible environment for our students to learn. We ask that all facility structures, physical property, and the property of others be respected by all members of the school community. We further ask our students to secure their belongings in hallway, PE, and/or team lockers by using a lock.

DRESS CODE: RHHS expects that all students will dress in a way that is appropriate for the school day or for any school sponsored event. The primary responsibility for a student's attire resides with the student and their parent(s) or guardian(s). The school's responsibility for seeing that student attire does not interfere with the health and/or safety of any student. Any restriction to the way a student dresses must be necessary to support the overall educational goals of the school. To ensure effective and equitable enforcement of this dress code, school staff shall enforce the dress code consistently using the requirements per the policy adopted by the RHBOE. In situations where the dress code is in violation the student will always have an opportunity to improve his/her outfit before being dismissed for the school day.

NO HEADPHONES OR EAR BUDS: Students are NOT PERMITTED to bring earbuds or headphones to school or use them during the school day. These items will be confiscated by school administration and only be given back to a parent/guardian who picks them up.

STUDENT ID: Students must make their ID visible for staff at all times, everyday and everywhere. They are required for entry into the building. In the event a student does not have his/her ID the student must obtain a replacement ID in order for the student to enter the building. The student ID will be made by the main office staff and a \$5.00 accountability fee will be imposed each and every time a student cannot present his/her ID. Keep in mind the student ID is used for a variety of purposes throughout the school day.

MAKE UP WORK: Students are allowed to makeup work missed due to a class or school absence unless the absence is unexcused (class cut). Students are allowed one day for every day missed unless there are special circumstances and/or agreement has been made by teacher and student.

School Counselors/Guidance

We recommend you getting to know your school counselor as they are important to your academic journey at RHHS. School Counselors have planned time scheduled with each grade level including one-on-one meetings. School counselors support the use of Naviance in all areas of planning for post secondary opportunities and they invite you to review the [Naviance website](#) with your child. Nurse's Office

Mrs. Renee Garrahy, RHHS school nurse supervisor, is responsible for maximizing the health and well-being of our school-aged children and adolescents. Nurses provide routine and emergency health care for students and maintain student health records while ensuring compliance with regulations regarding immunizations, physical assessments, screenings, record keeping, and privacy mandates. School nurses also oversee the administration and documentation of prescribed medications. Nurses discuss health concerns with students and parents and consult with physicians of students who have health concerns. All student health information is kept confidential. If you have a need to speak to the school nurse regarding your child's health we recommend you do so as early as possible.

Fall Registration Information

Registration information is below:

1. You must be registered via the Rocky Hill High School Registration Portal. Please go directly to the high school athletic website and click the red button that says "Athletic Registration". Here is link to the Athletics page: <https://rhhs.rockyhillps.com/athletics>
2. You must have a valid Health Assessment Record/Physical Exam Record on file with the school nurse's office (13 month expiration for Athletics Participation). Any individual registered for a sport that has an expired record on file will receive a notification by Thursday Afternoon. Updated records can be emailed to the school nurse (garrahyr@rockyhillps.com)
3. Rocky Hill High School **Athletics Annual Parent Night** will be on **Tuesday August 25th from 6-7:00 PM** in the High School Auditorium. At least one parent/guardian of any 2026-2027 student-athlete should attend this meeting, even if their child does not participate in a fall sport. More information will be sent out at a later date. (Topics: Parent and Student-Athlete Expectations, Annual Requirements, High School Athletics Philosophy, Conflict Resolution, NCAA Information, etc.)

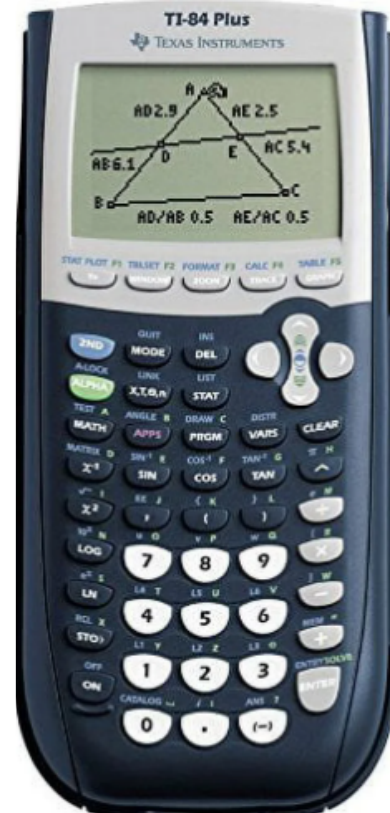

Math

All students enrolled in a math class are advised to purchase a Texas Instruments graphing calculator for use in class and at home. The math department recommends the TI-84 Plus model

which has superior functionality. Most large department stores sell these calculators, as well as online sites. A benefit to your child owning his/her own graphing calculator is that he/she can use it on the entire math section of the SAT.

Bus Information

Rocky Hill Public Schools provides transportation in accordance with transportation policies and guidelines. Students are expected to conform to regular standards of behavior while being transported



to and from school as outlined in the bus rules and regulations. All students should be at their bus stops at least 10 minutes prior to the bus stop posted time. Morning and afternoon bus drop off/pick up occurs in the back of the building in the bus loop. Morning and afternoon parent pickup occurs in the front of the school in the drop off lane. Late bus transportation is scheduled daily (Monday through Thursday) at 4:15 p.m. for RHHS students that stay after for extra help, clubs & activities and athletic practices, competition.

Students behavior on the bus, in the interest of safety, must observe rules of good behavior, and be considerate of others. They must be seated immediately and remain seated while the vehicle is in motion. Students misbehaving and failing to abide by regulations may be denied the privilege of riding on school buses either temporarily or permanently. Please see the Board of Education "Policies" section Series 5000 STUDENTS, policy 5780 - Transportation, for more information. The deadline for changing or adding bus stops is determined by the Board of Education. The office of the Director of Special Education and Pupil Services will notify parents of the arrangements for students in special education programs.

My Payments Plus

Students will be expected to pay for meals at the time of service. To activate the account for your child, you must deposit money into the account. We encourage students to use their accounts as it allows for less chance of lost lunch money and quicker service at lunch time. Any money left at the end of the school year will carry forward to next school year. Parents can make deposits to the account by making payments online. Healthy Connections

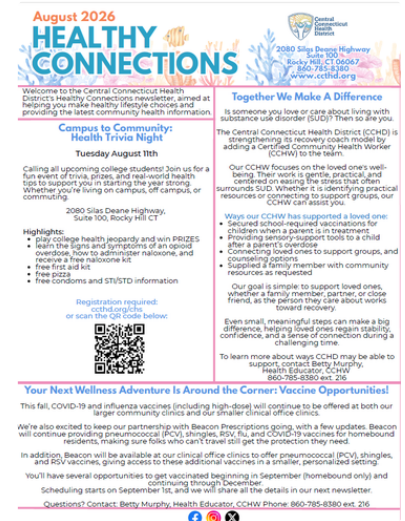

The Central Connecticut Health District (CCHD) is strengthening its recovery coach model by adding a Certified Community Health Worker (CCHW) to the team. Our CCHW focuses on the love one's wellbeing. Their work is gentle, practical, and centered on easing

the stress that often surrounds SUD. Whether it is identifying practical resources or connecting to support groups, our CCHW can assist you. Ways our CCHW has supported a loved one:

- Secured school-required vaccinations for children when a parent is in treatment
- Providing sensory-support tools to a child after a parent's overdose
- Connecting loved ones to support groups, and counseling options
- Supplied a family member with community resources as requested

Our goal is simple: to support loved ones, whether a family member, partner, or close friend, as the person they care about works toward recovery. Even small, meaningful steps can make a big
