

62% of the class of 2021 (21 graduates) attended a 4-year college, 10% attended a 2-year or vocational college, and 14% entered the workforce.

The remaining 5% were undecided.

CAES administers the school day SAT exam. In the fall the seniors participated in this exam with 43% meeting both the English and Math benchmarks. 81% met the benchmark in English and 43% met the benchmark in Math. Juniors and five sophomores took the PSAT in October. The Juniors also took the SAT school day in May.

Colebrook, a small town in Coos County New Hampshire with a population of approximately 2,300 citizens, is situated in the Great North Woods Region, bordered on the west by the Connecticut River.

Colebrook Academy & Elementary School is a NH accredited public high school that enrolls approximately 106 students in grade nine through twelve. The physical building of the Academy closed in June 2019 and merged with the elementary and middle school creating a PK-12 population of 353. The Academy offers a strong college preparatory track, in addition to business, consumer science, and technology. Students can attend the Academy from surrounding towns in NH (Errol, Millsfield and Stewartstown) as well as the Northeast Kingdom Choice school District in Vermont.

Class Rank & GPA: CAES follows a 4.0 GPA scale with added weighting for some courses. The un-weighted GPA is an average of grades on the 4.0 scale without any weighting added. Courses are weighted depending on their degree of difficulty.

CAES uses the following algorithm to calculate the weighted GPA:

Average of GPA points, with credit value for each course considered, divided by total number of credits attempted.



Diploma: CAES requires 26 credits for Graduation. Graduates must complete 50 hours community service to earn their diploma. Students who complete more than 100 hours of community service receive a silver cord to wear at graduation. CAES participates in the New Hampshire Scholars Program. Students could earn a state diploma based on 20 credit NH state graduation requirements.

CAES courses will be primarily non-leveled and will be pursuing mixed ability learning that supports our goal of offering competency based educational opportunities.

COLEBROOK ACADEMY & ELEMENTARY SCHOOL (CAES) OFFERS COMPREHENSIVE CURRICULA INCLUDING TRADITIONAL ACADEMIC COURSES, BUSINESS, CONSUMER SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY COURSES AND CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION PROGRAMMING.

CAES follows a modified block schedule. Transcripts list both first and second semester courses to reflect the rigor of a student's senior year. Students can earn 8 credits per year.

Honors: Courses require moderate to extensive intellectual development and outside preparation. These courses are designed to prepare students for two or four year colleges. Reading levels should be above grade level. Students are assumed to be self-motivated. These courses are weighted more when determining GPA and class rank.

Standard: Courses are student-oriented and characterized by lively classroom discussion, group projects, and meaningful homework. These classes also prepare students for two and four year colleges, technical schools and the workforce.

Dual Enrollment/Running Start Courses:

Students can take courses for high school and college credits concurrently. Running start courses are taught by our teacher who have been credentialed by the community college system of NH. The current partnership exists with White Mountains Community College in Berlin, NH. For the 21-22 year, Statistics, Chemistry, Quantitative Reasoning, Spanish III, Physics, Anatomy & Physiology, Medical Terminology, Business law, Accounting are offered. Students can take courses at area high schools as well, including College Composition, Pre-Calculus and Calculus. Students can also earn college credit through NH's estart and Early College Programs. To date, student have taken courses through NHTI, Lakes Region CC, SNHU and Nashua CC.

The Connecticut River Collaborative: CAES is entering its fifth year collaborating with neighboring high schools (Canaan Schools in Canaan, Vermont, and Pittsburg High School in Pittsburg, New Hampshire) to increase academic and social opportunities for students. Students can elect to spend a portion or all of their day at one of the other schools.

Advanced Placement: Non-instructed exams can be ordered and proctored for students. Students take advantage of this opportunity through VLACS.

Distance Learning: Students can take online courses for enrichment, credit recovery or because of scheduling needs. These courses are completed independently; however, students can have time during the academic day to complete them. Students typically enroll in courses through VLACS (Virtual Learning Academy Charter School).

Career and Technical Education (CTE):

The Academy is a member of NH Region 1. Students can attend the Region's CTE center in Canaan, VT. The center offers 4 programs: Building Trades, Fire Services & EMS, Diversified Agriculture, and Business. CTE is student-oriented and combines academic skills and technical knowledge necessary for success in today's workforce. Students earn a variety of certificates and industry recognized credentials (IRCs) in these programs.

School to Work (STW): This learning experience offers real-world experiences which allow students an opportunity to enhance the knowledge and skills they have acquired in the classroom and apply it to a position within a local business or organization.
