Parents Right to Know Title I School-Wide Programs Parents'

Dear Parents or Guardians:

We are pleased to notify you that in accordance with the Elementary and Secondary Act (ESEA), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's teacher.

Specifically, you may request the following:

- Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or substitute status.
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

If you would like to receive this information or have any questions, please contact your child's school principal.

COVID-19 is still very much alive in our community. PLEASE monitor your child with At-Home Daily Health Screenings BEFORE sending him/her to school. Please follow the following protocol established by CDC Guidelines:

Students MUST NOT come to school if they exhibit ANY of the following symptoms:

- ·Fever of 100.4 degrees or higher, or chills
- ·Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- ·Cough
- ·Fatigue
- ·Headache
- ·Muscle or body aches
- ·Sore throat
- ·Congestion/runny nose
- ·Nausea/vomiting
- ·Diarrhea
- ·New loss of taste or smell
- *This list may not include all possible symptoms. A student with a daily runny nose or congestion due to allergies should not be kept at home.
