Office: We ask that each family provide the following supplies for the office	> 3 reams of copy paper > 2 rolls of paper towels used for chores > 1 pkg black dry erase markers	> 3 boxes of kleenex > 2 pkg. sanitizing wipes used for chores
All 6th, 7th, and 8th Grade Students: > art supplies of your student's choosing for projects (colored pencils, markers, or crayons) > sticky notes - any size > highlighters - 2 colors	> 2 dry-erase markers and eraser > 1 scientific calculator > 1 protractor and 1 compass > NIV Bible ** a weekly homework planner will be provided for you from the school	> 6 spiraled wide-ruled notebooks (different color for each class) > 6 two-pocket folders (different color for each class)
All 7th and 8th Grade Students Foods Class: > Closed-toe shoes required to be worn each Tuesday during cooking class.	> Baseball cap required to be worn each Tuesday during cooking class (this should be kept in the student's locker so that it is available to them each week.)	**If a student does not have both items available to be worn each Tuesday, he or she will not be permitted to participate in cooking class that day due to health department code and will receive a 0 grade for that day of class.**
Sewing Class: **PLEASE DO NOT BUY SEWING "KITS" - They are cheaply made.** > sewing box - 20 Qt. size container with LID (approx. to hold fabric) (put name on top) > straight pins (with colored tops) > magnet for keeping pins together	> fabric scissors (Fiskars brand) > small scissors to cut threads on projects while at sewing machine > 1 pkg. sewing needles > 1 spool all-purpose thread (Coats & Clark or Guitermann) > 1 yard 100% cotton calico fabric - for practice	7th graders will need approximately \$50 for sewing projects (2 trips to JoAnn Fabric \$25 each trip). 8th graders will need approximately \$80 for fabric for quilts and projects (one trip will be taken for all fabric).
All High School Students:	Teachers will tell you if you need something specifically for each class. Bring pencils, pens, and notebooks for the first day of school. See below for specific class needs ** a weekly planner will not be provided so purchase one if your student prefers to use one

Chemistry: > 1 composition notebook	> 1 scientific calculator (link is an example of an approved calculator but does not have to be this specific one - please just make sure the calculator can do scientific notation)	
Anatomy:	> 1 set of colored pencils	
Spanish I, II, III:	> 2 fine tip dry-erase markers	> 1 spiral notebook and a 2-pocket folder
