A Letter from the Pastor



Blessed Solemnity of Christ the King! And Blessed Thanksgiving Week and Happy Thanksgiving this Thursday! Pope Pius XI in 1925 said, "With God and Jesus Christ excluded from political life, with authority derived not from God but from man, the very basis of that authority has been taken away, because the chief reason of the distinction between ruler and subject has been eliminated. The result is that human society is tottering to its fall, because it no longer has a secure and solid foundation... Once people recognize, both in private and in public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessings of real liberty, well-ordered discipline, peace, and harmony." What a blessing this feast is—for the Church and a world in turmoil!

Our Parish has much to be thankful for as we look back on this Year of Grace 2022, especially the gift of you parishioners, new and old. On that note, it will really help our Lord Jesus to deepen our community and bonding if each of you hears this plea from me: "Please register officially with our Parish (or, update your contact information by calling the office, emailing us, going online to flocknote.com, etc.), because then we can serve you better and you will experience more of that supernatural peace that Jesus is giving us here at St. Therese Church."

We are also thankful for our Saint Therese Carmelite School. From Chapter Five of Be Transformed: The Healing Power of the Sacraments by Bob Schuchts | 5th installment

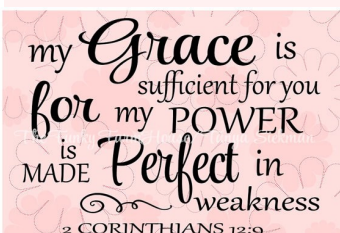
The apostle Paul remarked, "I have the strength for everything through Him who empowers me" (Phil 4:13). The same Holy Spirit who enabled Jesus to love so completely gave St. Paul and each one of us the ability to lay down our lives for our friends and to bless our enemies. The power of the Holy Spirit enabled Jesus to heal, perform miracles, and even raise the dead. That same Spirit gives us the capacity to do the same things. The power that moved Jesus with compassion for the needy and gave Him the courage to go to the Cross dwells in us and enables us to be compassionate and to follow Him. This same Spirit convicts us when we sin and gives us the capacity to become whole.

There are no limits to what we are capable of doing because of this anointing power from the Holy Spirit that we receive through the Sacraments. We are no longer powerless, as long as we yield to the power of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Without the Holy Spirit, we can do nothing. Because of the Fall, we really are powerless to follow Jesus or carry out His mission without His anointing. On our own, we are not capable of love, miracles, great courage, or any other virtue apart from His "virtue" (this word literally means "strength").

But here 's the really good news: we do not need to rely on our own strength when we feel powerless. Jesus encouraged St. Paul with these words when he was struggling with his own incapacities: "For power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Cor 12:9). That is great news, isn't it? We don't have to be strong by ourselves because God is all-powerful. Like St. Paul, we can "boast in our weaknesses."

I can personally attest to how self-reliance blocks the movement of the Holy Spirit. And I have also observed how His anointing flows most freely when we let go of control and become vulnerable. One such occurrence happened in my life during a nine-day fast, when I became very weak and found it difficult to focus. On the eighth day of the fast, I went into work at my counseling office and could barely function. But as the day progressed, one person after another had the biggest healing breakthrough of their lives. I gave very little counsel. I didn't even pray with most of the

people. Actually, I didn't do much of anything but sit there depleted of my own strength. The anointing from the Holy Spirit did all the work. God wanted to show me what spiritual poverty looked like so He could demonstrate His power in and through my weaknesses. After it was all over, the only thing I could do was praise Him and realize how deluded I had been about my own capabilities. I realized in a whole new way that, despite my many years of training and experience, apart from Him I could do nothing (John 15:4).

Why Do We Call Jesus A King? by Fr. Joe Scott, CSP



As Americans we have mixed emotions regarding the word king. The American Revolution was fought to free Americans from the tyranny of a kingly rule. Even in the world at large, hereditary monarchies are fading away. Those which remain, as in Great Britain, have come to assume largely a ceremonial function as heads of state, with little



genuine political power. Despite this, there is something about the symbol of a king which continues to captivate our imagination. Many of the stories we hear as children feature kings or queens. Disneyland has maintained a long popularity as the “Magic Kingdom.”

Jesus grew to manhood in a world which remembered the glories and terrors of Herod the Great, the King of Judea. He was known as “great” because of his accomplishments as a builder, but he used his power to destroy anyone who he felt threatened his rule—even some of his own sons. Jesus and His contemporaries knew kings and rulers as sources of war, heavy taxes, corruption, violence, and the oppression of military occupation. In all four Gospels, Pilate asks Jesus, “Are you a king?,” and Jesus declines to answer. Nevertheless, Pilate understood Jesus to be challenging the authority of the Emperor. The title “King of the Jews” was placed on the crossbeam of His crucifix as an indication of why He was being crucified.

In Revelation 19:16, Jesus is given the title, “King of kings and Lord of lords (Revelation 17:14 switches it around as, “Lord of lords and King of kings”). The title indicates someone who has the power to exercise absolute dominion over all His realm. In the case of the Lord Jesus, the realm is all of creation. In John’s vision, Jesus is returning to judge the world and establish His earthly Kingdom, as He predicted in Mark 13:26.

Jesus never claimed an earthly kingship. Yet, He spoke of Himself frequently as one who was announcing a new kind of reign, the Kingdom of God. Jesus sometimes spoke of this Kingdom as something that was coming in the future and sometimes He spoke as if it was already present. In His parables and pronouncements, Jesus was stating that God, not Caesar, was King of Israel. Unlike the oppressive, death-dealing earthly kings, God’s Kingdom was one of freedom and hope. Much of Jesus teaching was a description of what the Kingdom of God is like. Signs of the arrival of God’s Kingdom included the release of prisoners, the restoration of sight to the blind, and freedom for all who were oppressed (Luke 4:18). Jesus knew that God alone was truly King. This made Him a most subversive figure, even if He did not claim political leadership for Himself.

Over time Christians began granting Jesus the title of King because His own life of servant love so completely modeled the Kingdom He preached. In 1925 Pope Pius XI instituted the feast of Christ the King as a way of reminding a world once again dominated by death-dealing dictators of the rule of love that was so present in Jesus’ words and actions. (In 1969, the feast’s name was expanded to, “Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe”.)

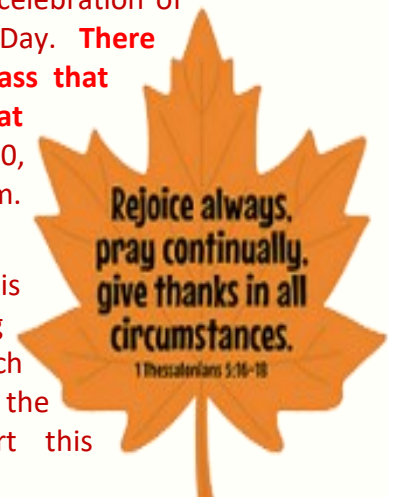

The Real St. Therese

An installment from *The Passion of Thérèse of Lisieux* by Guy Faucher



On March 25, 1897, Therese saw her last novice, her cousin Marie, make her profession. Her work of formation was completed. She gave the newly professed sister some verses on the theme of spiritual combat that

ended with these lines: “With a smile I will brave the cannonade, And in your arms, O my Divine Spouse, With a song I will die on the battlefield, Weapons in hand!” During these days Therese fought valiantly to remain on her feet in suffering, to sing in choir after dragging herself from her cell to the chapel. But at the end of Lent (the beginning of April), Therese fell seriously ill.

During her last 30 months of life, Therese’s “Little Way” was confirmed by God. Therese offered herself to the Merciful Love which had created her and freed her from her limitations and weaknesses. This Offering included the desire to die of love according to St. John of the Cross’ description, for Love can only be repaid by a wholehearted loving response, by love alone. She intended to offer her suffering so that she might follow Jesus to death.

The Wound of Self-Pity

Today, I choose to fast from the wound of self-pity. Sometimes, through no fault of our own, we are the victims of the harshness of life. Many other times, we have some measure of responsibility for our circumstances. In either case, when we begin to demand sympathy from everybody around us, self-pity is probably at work in us. As a result, we excuse ourselves from the daily struggle that is the Christian life. One of self-pity’s ugliest qualities is that it ignores the obvious needs of others. We read in the Scriptures that the prophet Jonah fell into deep self-pity when the gourd plant that provided him shade died. He was so consumed with himself that he forgot the 120,000 people in the city of Nineveh (Jonah 4:10-11). Let’s remove this wound from our lives.

Ask yourself... What in my life do I demand that people have sympathy for? When do I get lost in my own difficulty to the point that I lose sight of the pain of those around me?

Heavenly Father, In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, I renounce self-pity and repent all the ways in which I have sinned because of it. I renounce any lies that I have come to believe, including lies such as “This is just too much” or “My life is harder than everybody else’s.” Send your Holy Spirit to heal, restore, and transform me. I belong to you. I am loved by you. I am chosen by you. I am known to you. Amen.

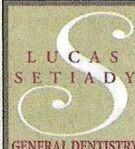
