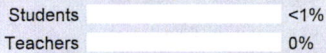

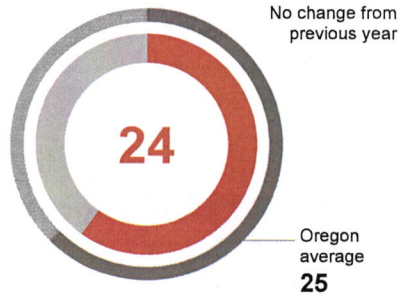

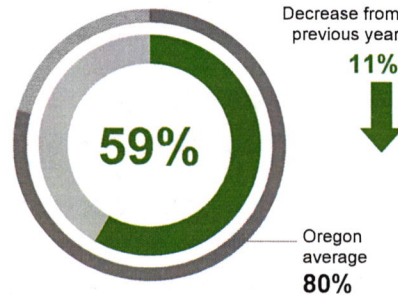
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

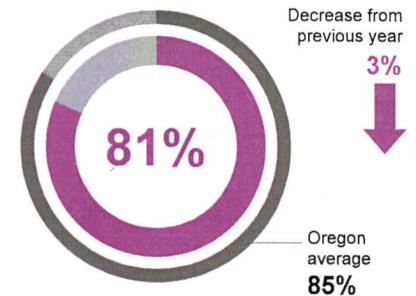
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

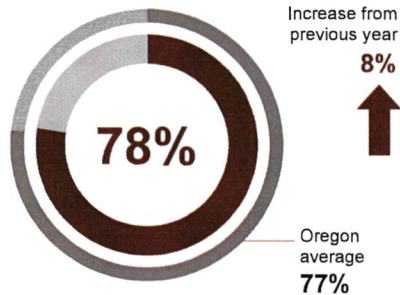
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

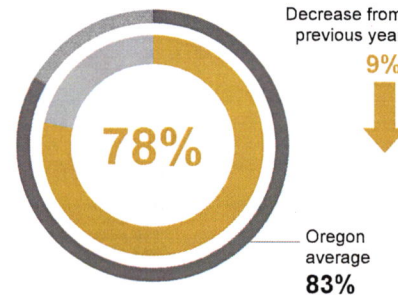
ON-TIME GRADUATION

School Goals

CMHS strives to promote student success by focusing on positive student relationships, regular attendance at school, serving all students based on needs, increased academic rigor across all subject areas, and development of family and community partnerships. Through this work, CMHS has experienced an 8% increase with "On-Time Graduation" and is currently exceeding the state of Oregon graduation average.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is working in partnership with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

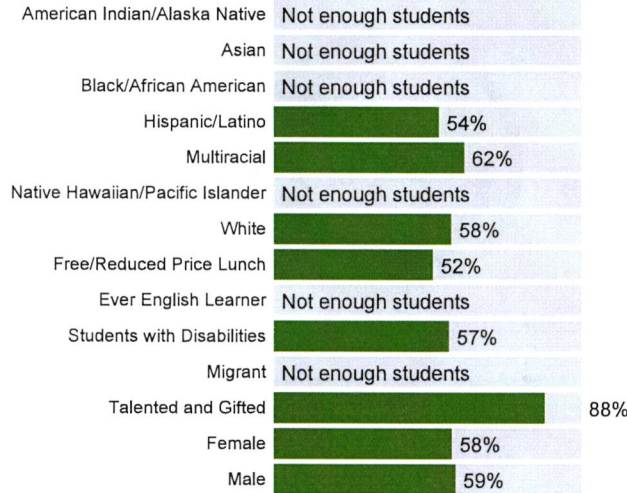

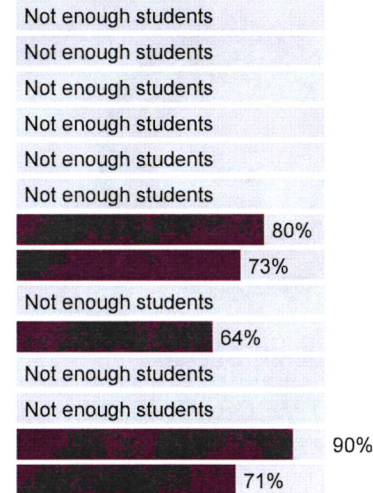

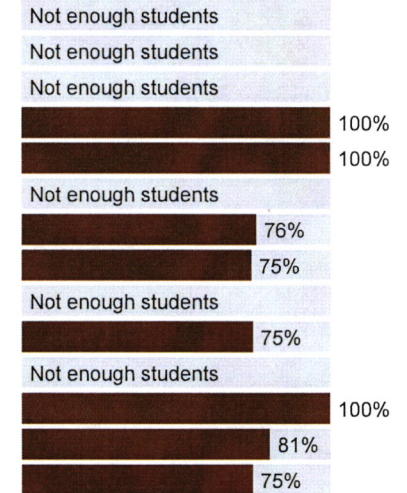
