Wendell Elementary School will continue to be vigilant about students attending school all-day, every day as research shows consistency in school helps students retain and be more confident in their learning. This year we have also added Istation's Reading Intervention module for grades k-4. Our intense walk-to reading interventions for all grades is driven by data and groups organized by skill-need. Wendell Elementary's PD for teachers is through the MV Literacy Coop membership and this year we are observing Instructional Rounds at other schools as our Coop focus this year is improving reading groups to move more students from Tier 2 to Tier 1. For the 21-22 SY in grades K-4 we increased movement to Tier 1 by 13%. Then decreased movement in Tier 3 by 11% using the ISIPs Overall Reading Score fall to spring.
