Traveling Gallery Exhibit in NYM through October 2. The New York Mills  $\frac{2}{100}$ Regional Cultural Center announces its new traveling gallery exhibit: "Why Treaties Matter." This exhibit includes 20 freestanding panels and a 14-minute video titled "A Day in the Life of Minnesota Tribal Nations," all on display in the W Cultural Center Gallery now through October 2, 2021. The traveling exhibition  $\frac{\circ}{M}$ "Why Treaties Matter: Self-Government in the Dakota and Ojibwe Nations" offers an unprecedented opportunity to learn more about the Native nations in Minnesota and the history of treaty-making with the United States. The exhibit W relays Minnesota's Native history in a way that has never before been done – in  $\frac{2}{M}$ the voices of Dakota and Ojibwe people in this place once called "Mnisota."

"Why Treaties Matter" – traveling throughout the state since August 2011 has been displayed at Indian reservations, tribal colleges, universities, museums, W historical societies, cultural centers, libraries and community centers. A copy of  $\hat{\mathbb{A}}$ the exhibit is permanently on view at the Minnesota State Capitol. The exhibit is the result of a historic partnership forged by three organizations: the Minnesota  $\frac{1}{2}$  Indian Affairs Council, the official liaison between the state and Minnesota's  $\frac{1}{2}$ Native nations, the Minnesota Humanities Center, and the Smithsonian  $\hat{\mathbb{M}}$ Institution's National Museum of the American Indian in Washington, D.C.

Additional activities are being planned at the Cultural Center, including a speaker and closing reception, with dates and times to be determined. Please visit kulcher.org for all the latest details.
