#### Family Newsletter Envelopes

We have been busy these past two weeks in kindergarten. Students are learning routines and getting use to their new schedule. As we start our reading and math lessons,

students will start to bring home homework in their planner. Please return finished homework in the planner daily. Homework is a review of what we are learning in class and should not take more than ten minutes.



Kindergarteners have library every Thursday. Please send any library books back to school on Thursdays so your child can check out new ones. I will start

sending home Thursday Folders this Thursday. Please take out the papers, sign the folder, and send it back on Friday. Your child will receive a sticker for returning an empty signed folder every Friday.
