The current pandemic has changed the way we go about our daily lives but our goals to educate the children in our school district continue to be a top priority. We are anticipating a much more normal year in 2021-2022.

The 2020-2021 school year is quickly coming to an end and the last day of the school year is May 21st. Classes will be dismissed at 1:00 pm on the last day and I am sure that parents, students and staff are excited about the summer break.
