## **Public Comment:**

Hal Callaway presented concerns about a child hitting a teacher at one of the elementary schools. He wanted to know if the board was aware of the incident and what was the board's policy for addressing this. Mr. Callaway also asked the board who makes the testing for fourth and fifth graders mandatory.

Moved, seconded, and carried to award the bank bid to Community & Southern Bank for a one year period starting July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011 at a fixed interest rate of 1.40%.

Moved, seconded, and carried to award the propane fuel bid to Budget Propane for a one year period starting May 13, 2010 through May 12, 2011 at a price per gallon rate of \$1.45.

Mark Henson, Superintendent, stated the next agenda item was a Reduction in Force (RIF) Plan. Mr. Henson stated he was pleased that the implementation of a RIF Plan would not be necessary at this time.

Moved, seconded, and carried to approve a resolution for a Title 50 waiver. The resolution is requesting waivers for the following:

- Minimum direct instruction (65%) rule (160-5-1-.29) Allow the system to spend less than 65% for direct instruction for the 2009 2010 and 2010 2011 school years.
- Class size for Gifted, EIP, and Career tech (160-5-1-.08) Expand the maximum class size allowable number to no more than 2 additional students in these three areas K-12.
- English Language Learners (160-4-5-.02) Expand the maximum class size allowable number to no more than 2 additional students in any ELL class in grades K-12.

Cynthia Panter, Associate Superintendent, stated she had received responses from all Fannin County School System Board Standards Review Committee members stating they are in agreement and the four recommendations have been satisfied. Ms. Panter stated she would send a letter to Georgia School Board Association (GSBA) stating the Fannin County School System Board had satisfied all areas and would like to be considered for the GSBA School Board Standards accreditation.

Moved, seconded, and carried to approve the purchase of additional cameras and Digital Video Recording equipment for the Fannin County Middle School campus from Atlanta Closed Circuit Television for \$12,700.00.

Moved, seconded, and carried to approve the purchase of additional cameras and Digital Video Recording equipment for the Fannin County High School campus from Atlanta Closed Circuit Television for \$39,925.00.

Moved, seconded, and carried to go into executive session to discuss or deliberate upon the appointment, employment, compensation, hiring, disciplinary action or dismissal, or periodic evaluation or rating of a public officer or employee; (O.C.G.A. 50-14-3(6)).
