2021-2022 TITLE I PROGRAM

- We are under a school-wide plan (not a targeted plan)
- According to the U.S. Dept. of Ed., the purpose of Title I funding is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education and reach at minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.

WHAT IS TITLE I?

- The basic principles of Title I state that schools with large concentrations of low-income students will receive supplemental funds to assist in meeting student's educational goals. Low-income students are determined by enrollment in the free and reduced lunch program. For an entire school to qualify for Title I funds, at least 40% of the school must receive free or reduced lunch. 100% of LES students participate in the free and reduced lunch program.

TITLE I

- During the Spring of last school year, the Title I committee (teachers, administrators, parents, community members, and students) reviewed the needs of the school and made recommendations for serving our students.

HOW TITLE I FUNDS ARE USED

- Salary for two full-time Interventionists/one part-time Interventionist
- Salary for one classroom teacher
- Technology (Chromebooks)
- Online remediation programs
- AIM phone system
- School Status Communication Program

PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT POLICY/PARENTS RIGHT TO KNOW

- Parents have the right to be involved in the planning, development, and operation of the Title I Program
- Parents have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teacher
- Meetings with parents will be held during flexible hours

3RD GRADE REQUIREMENTS

*Beginning 2018-2019, students will be required to score at or above Level 3 on the online reading portion of the 3rd Grade MAAP-ELA.

For 2018-2019, students may meet promotion requirements of the *LBPA by:

- earning a passing score (level 3 or above) on the multiple-choice portion of the 3rd Grade MAAP-ELA Assessment.
- achieving a passing score (level 3 or above) on either of the two retest opportunities on the 3rd Grade Reading Alternative Assessment. *
- achieving a composite score of Level 3 or higher on the 3rd Grade MAAP-ELA Assessment after the writing is scored. *

IMPORTANCE OF SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

- Here at Louisville Elementary, we believe that if students are not in school, they are not learning. Any missed day of school is a day of missed opportunity. Therefore, we will work with you to ensure students come to school ready to learn.
- Research shows that students who miss 15 or more days in any given school year, are much more likely to have lower achievement, be disengaged in school, and at an extreme risk for course failure or dropping out

COMPREHENSIVE OR TARGETED SUPPORT

- **Louisville Elementary has been targeted as a TSI school.**
- **TSI – Targeted Support and Improvement**
- **Subgroup – Students with Disabilities**
- **Meaning that over the course of the last 3 years this subgroup is in lowest 50% of overall accountability index.**

Questions to ask your child

Sample questions to ask:

Did you talk about anything you read in class today?

Tell me something you learned in your reading.

Did you learn any new words in class today?
What do they mean?
How do you spell them?

What math problems did you do today? How did you get your answers?

How did you use math today? Can you show me an example?
