Water Testing

Students in grades 3rd and 4th in addition to hi-cap students from the 5th and 6th grade class conducted their winter water testing at Winolequa park on 2/16. They conducted five different tests looking at a variety of things including dissolved oxygen and turbidity levels looking to see if the water would be healthy for salmon. The test results showed very healthy water!

Students will be taking this new knowledge with them as they head to the Student Green Conference in March where they will have the opportunity to share their results with scientists and students from around Western Washington.



Students had fun this last week going to Winolequa Park to do our second round of water testing!

In class both grades are working hard to deepen their understanding of fractions. 3rd graders have finished their first fraction chapter and will be moving into learning how to compare fractions with like and unlike denominators. Fourth graders have learned how to add and subtract fractions and mixed numbers as well as turn an improper fraction into a mixed number.

We honored Presidents Day by researching and writing informational papers about past presidents. This was a great warm up to our trip to the State Capital that we participated in on Wednesday.

6th graders are continuing to work through algebraic expressions including how to write them from real life scenarios and how to solve expressions and equations. This week they learned how to combine like terms to simplify expressions.

And in science, we are continuing our study of water systems and how they interact.
