Winter Weather & Safety



Mrs. Hanna's TK - 3rd Grade Class



Happy New Year to us! What fun it was to come back and begin January 2026! It was so encouraging to hear all of the adventures and excitement that the students had over their vacation time! We talked about presents that we got, places that we went, and our favorite things about time spent with family.

We all had to re-orient ourselves with “being in school”. It was amazing how fast we got back into the routine. This class enjoys learning – they are eager to learn new things and even want to jump ahead! So, this is what we are diving into in January.

In Language Arts Kindergarten is learning about sentences. First grade they are learning about apostrophes and how to use them. Second grade is learning about quotation marks in writing dialogue and how to use them.

In Math, first grade is practicing single digit subtraction. Second grade is leaning about two-digit subtraction and Third grade is multiplying by tens and hundreds – they are all making great progress.

In Social Studies this week it seems appropriate that we are looking at things from the past and checking out what is going on in the present. Is it the same? Is it different? How different is it? How has life changed? How did we light up our homes in the past when it got dark and how do we do it today? What about cooking – do we still cook the same as we did 100 years ago? Is there anything that we cook the same? What about keeping warm? Do we still keep warm the same way? What about communication – do we communicate the same way? It's even fun to discover that five years ago we were communicating differently than we do now! And, it's interesting to imagine what will communication look like in the future!

In Science, we are learning about recycling and what you are supposed to recycle. Is it important? Things we use like glass bottles, aluminum cans, and plastic bags are made from sand, metal and oil. We are learning that earth's natural resources are limited and they cannot be replaced – so what are we going to do about that? What is our responsibility? That is where recycling comes in!

Learning is an adventure every day and we love doing it. It is a great time to work with these students every day.

Mr. Kempkey's 4th-8th Grade



We are now in our second week back from winter break, and I'm happy to share that our classroom is truly back in the swing of things. Students have settled back into routines, are staying on task, and are being productive throughout the day. Our updated classroom schedule has been a big help, as it now includes clearer daily expectations along with built-in short break times to support focus and independence. This structure has made a noticeable difference in how smoothly our days are running.

Each morning, students are strengthening their writing and listening skills through journaling. On Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, students respond to a journal prompt chosen by me. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, our wonderful TA, Jill, reads *Where the Red Fern Grows* aloud to the class. After each chapter, students write about what happened in their journals, practicing comprehension, reflection, and written expression every day.

In math, students are making great progress as they work through new concepts and reinforce previously learned skills. Much of this learning happens in small groups, where students collaborate, problem-solve, and—most importantly—have fun while learning. After math, students head to lunch and then enjoy daily PE, except on Fridays. On Wednesdays, students attend music after PE, and on Fridays they go straight to music after lunch, which brings us to the end of our early-release day.

On Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays, we focus on History and Science. In History, we are continuing our study of the birth of the United States and how it developed into the nation it is today. In Science, we are exploring life science, focusing on living things, life cycles, and the systems of plants and animals. During this time, we also begin working on hands-on projects and club-style activities, which will continue to grow as the weather improves and we complete several major projects planned for the year.

We are also excited to welcome a new student, bringing our class total to ten students. This small class size allows for meaningful connections and individualized support, and I feel incredibly fortunate to work alongside an amazing TA and an additional helper who provides one-on-one support for several students. Thanks to this teamwork, students are making strong academic and personal progress.

Overall, this school year is shaping up to be an amazing one. The growth, effort, and positivity I see every day make me proud of our classroom community, and I'm looking forward to all that the rest of the year has to offer.



Composing Songs

Happy New Year! We are starting to become immersed in Composing our own Songs.

We teach composing songs to elementary students because it supports **how children learn, think, and express themselves, not just because we want them to become musicians.**
