

For **Early Childhood** through **High School** Students, Parents/Guardians, Caregivers, and Teachers



Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS)

Pre-employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) are FREE services for students with disabilities (ages 14-22), provided through the Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency (GVRA) and approved vendors. These services help you explore your options and prepare for life after high school. These services take place during your school day.

5 Key Areas of Pre-ETS

Job Exploration Counseling

Discover careers that match your interests. Examples: Career fairs, ONET (onetonline.org), local job discussions.*

Work-Based Learning Experiences

Gain hands-on experience in real workplaces. Examples: Internships, job shadowing, workplace tours, volunteering.

Post-Secondary Education Counseling

Explore college and training programs that support your career goals. Examples: Campus tours, researching schools, planning applications.

Workplace Readiness Training


Build essential skills for success at work and at home. Examples: Financial literacy, hygiene, safety, time management.


Self-Advocacy Training

Learn how to express your needs and strengths with confidence. Examples: Requesting time off, asking for support, sharing your goal








CREATING REAL WORK OPPORTUNITIES
