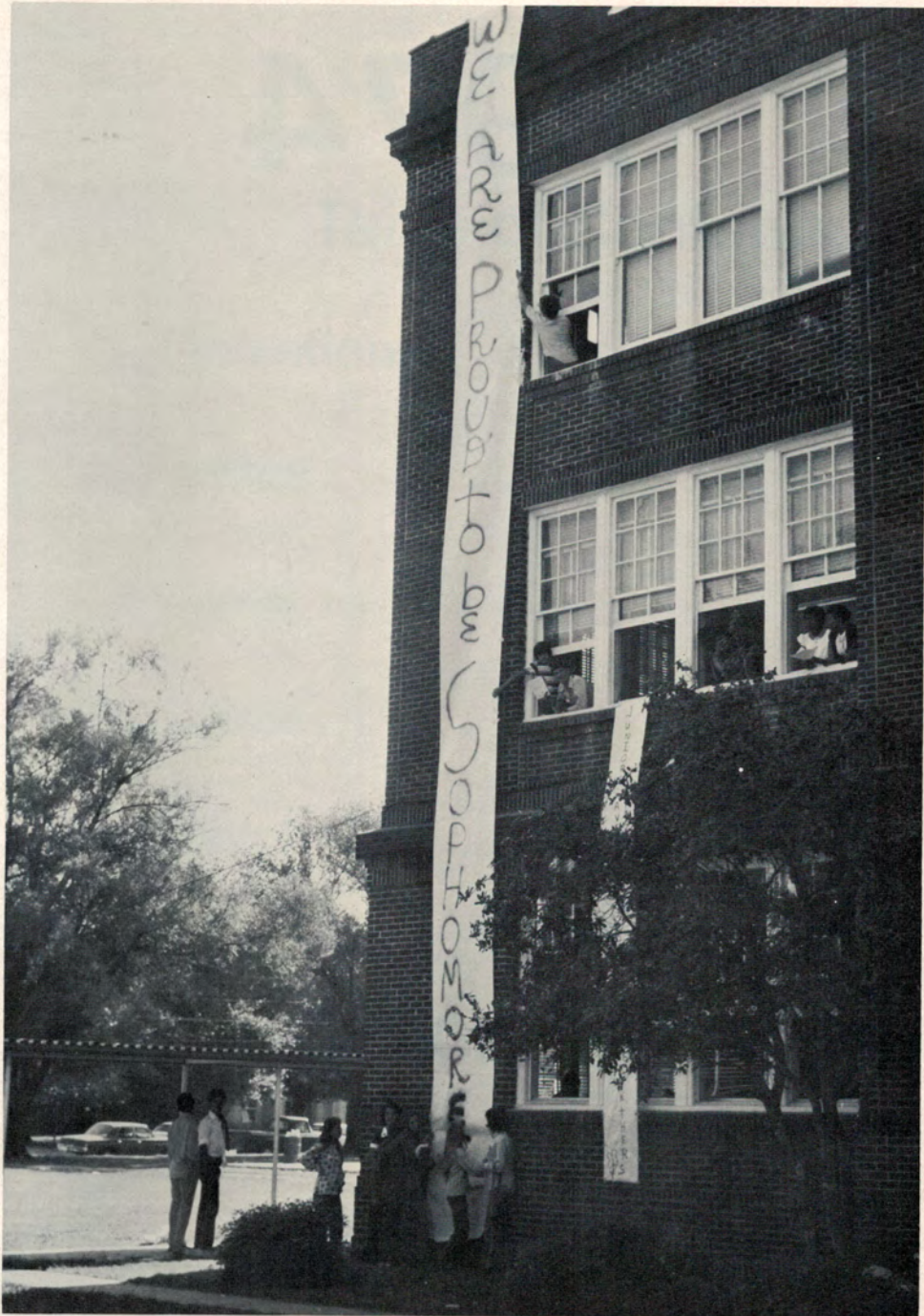

Our Golden Anniversary

1924 - 1974

The time, 1882. The place, Bunkie. The event, the first train coming over the newly completed railroad. People came from all surrounding communities and plantations to witness the event. A large plantation known as Irion was intersected by a new railroad known as the Texas & Pacific, and the name given to the new station by the little daughter of Capt. Sam Haas was Bunkie.

Not until 1888 did it become necessary to organize a school. The first one was opened on Bridenthal's plantation with Charles Weir as the teacher.

As the years passed and more people began to settle in the quaint town, the need for a new and larger school became a vital necessity. In the year 1924 a tax was voted to build a new high school building, which to this day presently houses over 600 students and teachers. Mr. C. G. Snoddy was its principal.

In 1935 Mr. P. W. Bordelon arrived as a science teacher, replacing Mr. Mac Trimble. He also became athletic director and produced a team of outstanding athletes. Mr. B. G. St. Romain, a chemistry and agriculture teacher replaced Al Moreau who later became Head Track Coach at LSU and an Olympic star.

Another old and familiar sight is the present gymnasium built in 1939 by the WPA. In time, two tennis courts were built on the surrounding land donated by the Haas family.

The early Forties presented a struggle for teachers more than students. Married women were not allowed to teach until the men were called into the Service in World War II.

In 1952, the elementary was separated from the high school, and was placed in a new building with Mr. Snoddy as principal. A few years later during the 1955-56 session, THE TRUMPET, our school paper was printed in Opelousas for the first time.

The Sixties called for Freedom of Choice, and in 1967-68, one black student attended. In 1970-71 the names Carver and Bunkie High disappeared and fused into Bunkie Senior High. Through this event, many changes have taken place. These years produced two Top Twenty basketball teams, a football team that made the play-offs, first place in Music, Division II, State Rally, but perhaps the greatest show of spirit was exhibited by the Mean Eighteen and Coach Floyd LeBleu, the tremendous individual who inspired them.

The 1973-74 session brought the 9th Grade back to us. Thus, the cycle is completed, and once more we are Bunkie High School, the home of the Fighting Bunkie Panthers.

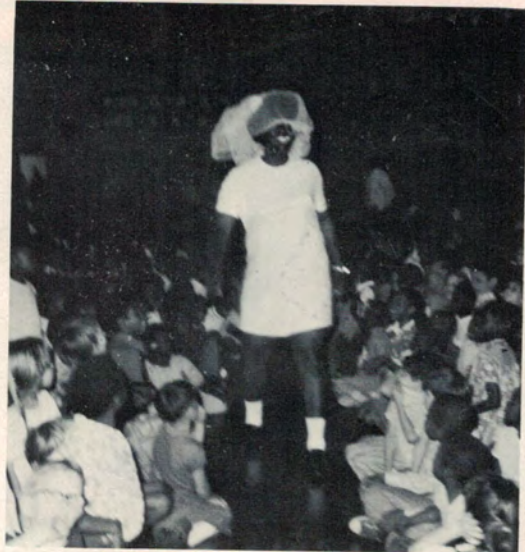

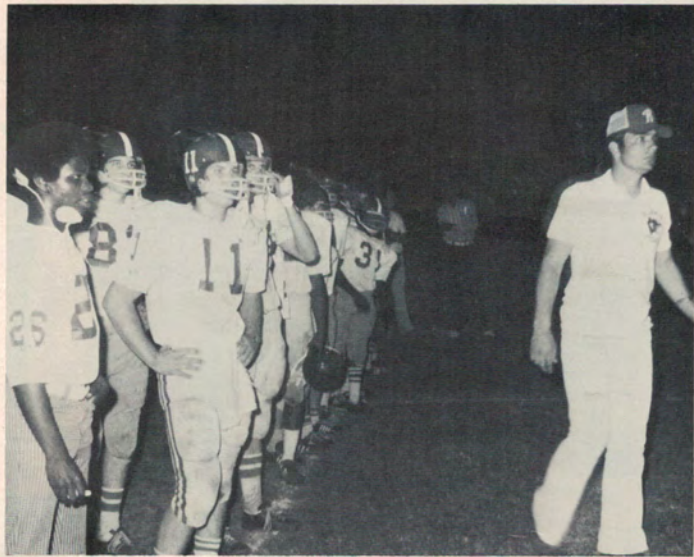
