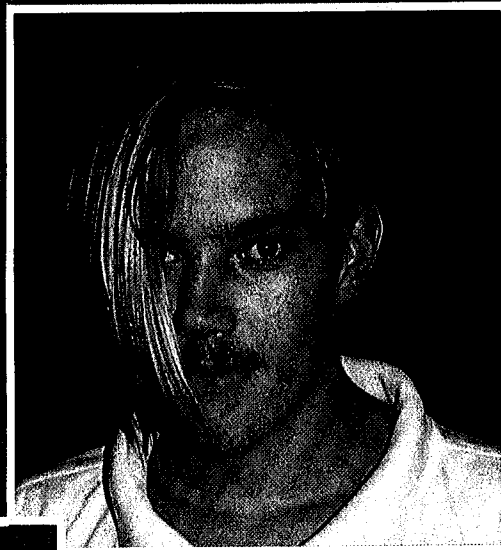


Swallow a little style

Highlanders Chew Up the Miners

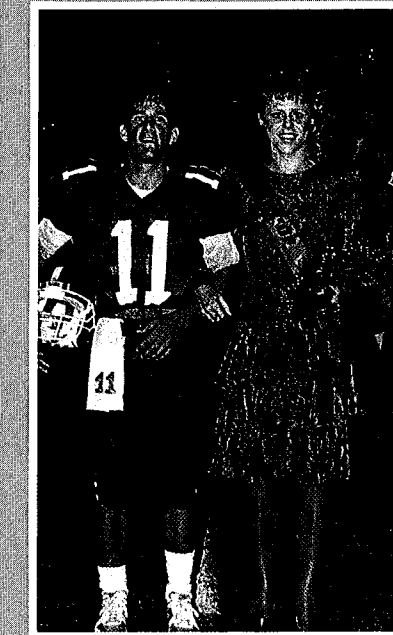
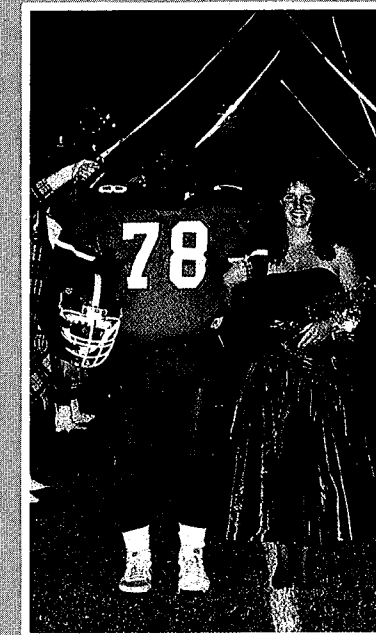
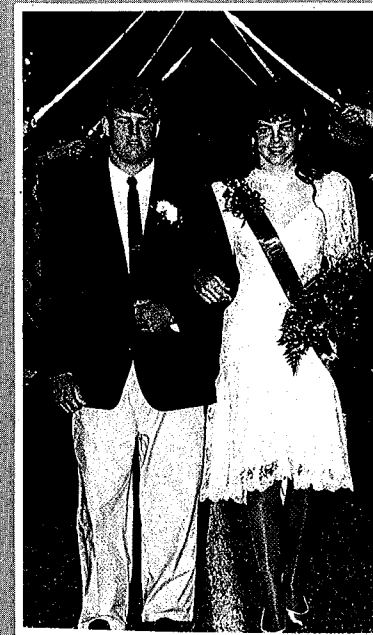
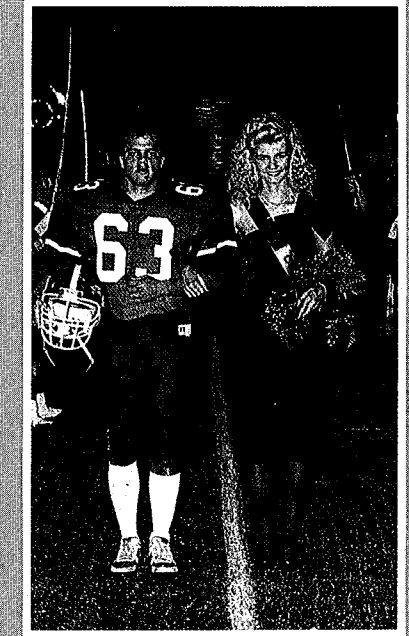
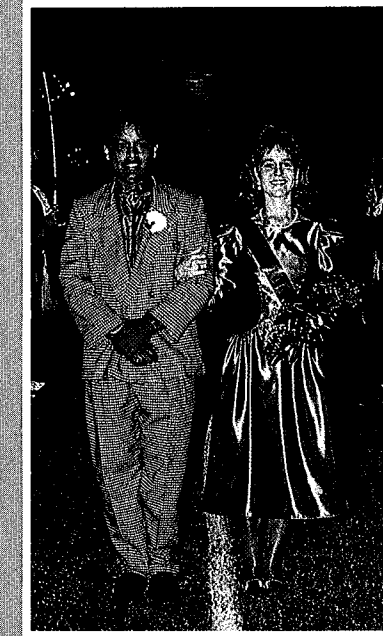

Highlanders Sport Winning Record

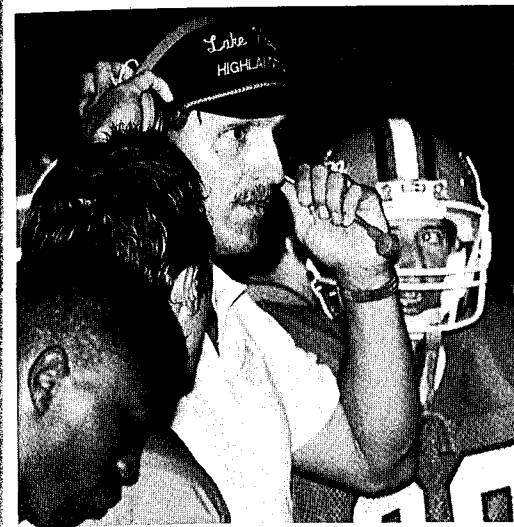
The varsity football team ended its season with a four-game winning streak to finish with a winning record of six wins, four losses. The year was highlighted by impressive victories over Auburndale, in pouring down rain; Mulberry, for only the second time in the 80's; Wildwood, for the second year in a row; Lake Gibson, who was undefeated and ranked fifth in the state; Haines City, always a tough rival; and Ft. Meade, a 43 to 8 Homecoming rout. The mid-season losing streak of three games (vs. Bartow, Avon Park, and Kissimmee) was due to a lack of execution, but next year the team drops to 3A, and starts fresh with a totally different schedule.

Squad Goes Co-Ed!

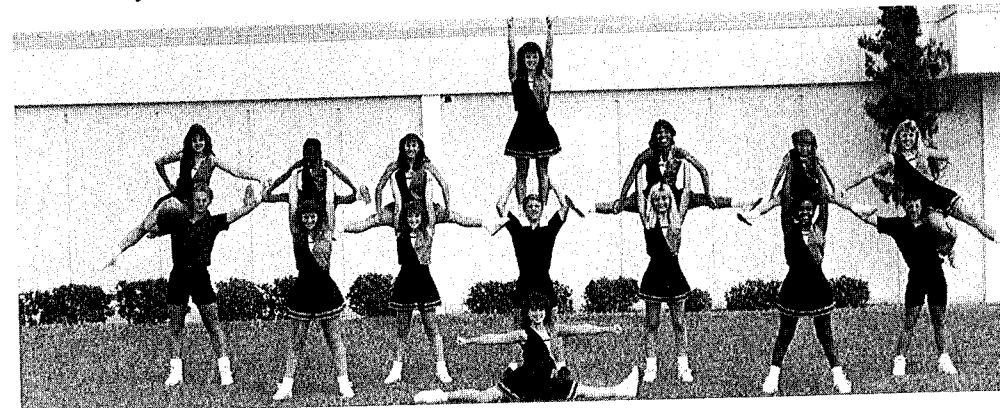

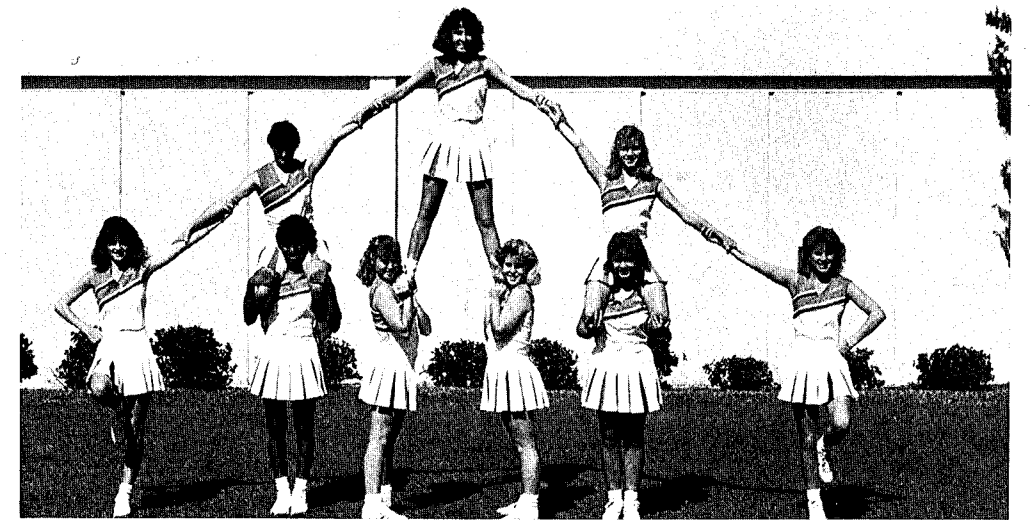
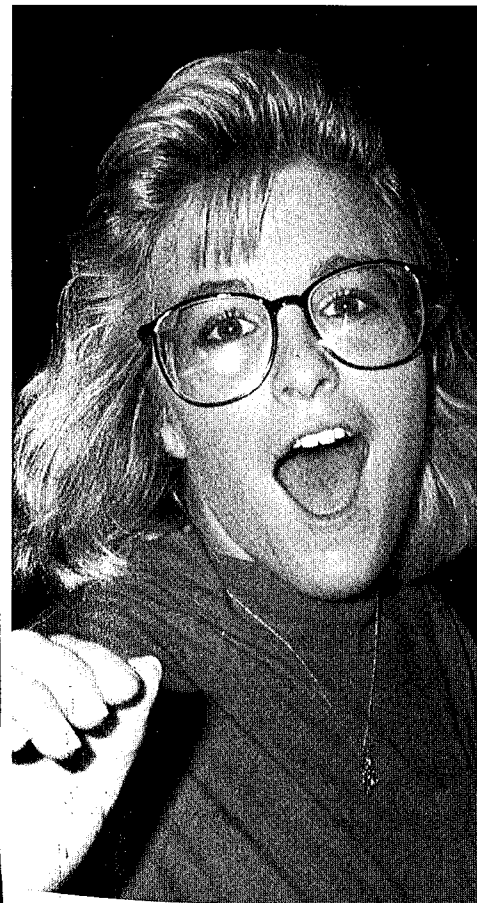
The Young and The Restless

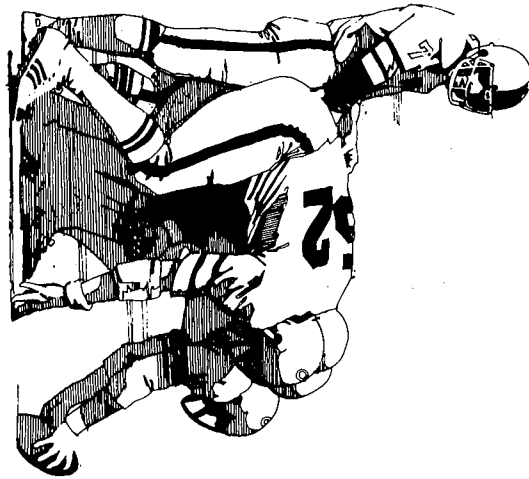

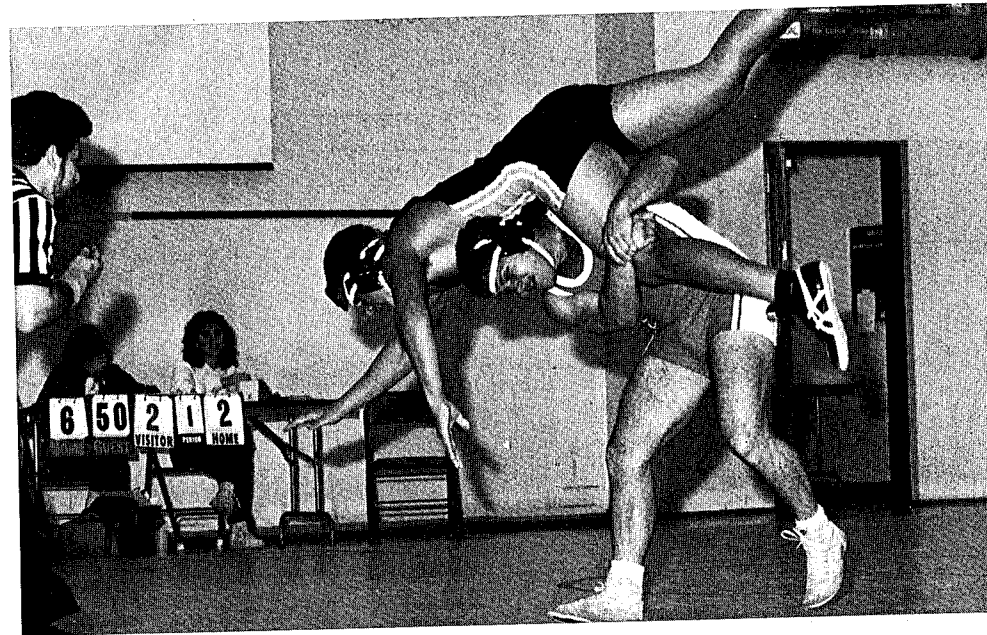

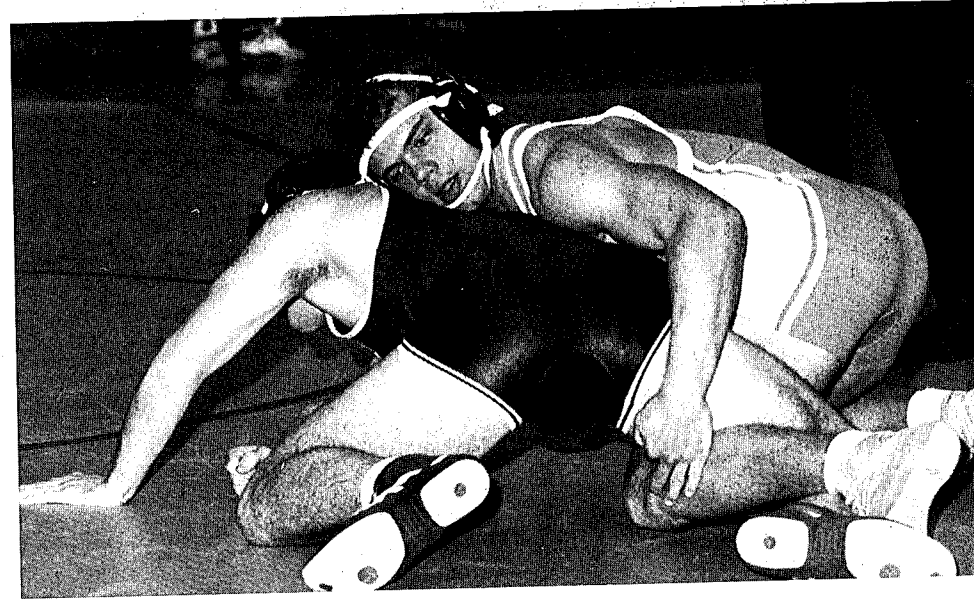

Lake Wales Places Wrestlers in District Finals

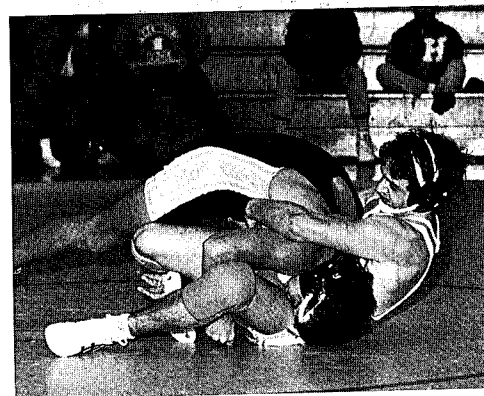

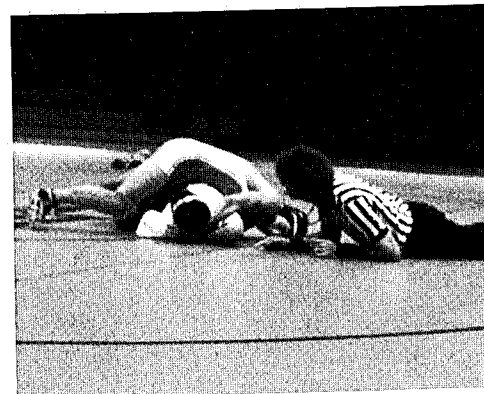

Boys Tennis Team Defeats Bartow

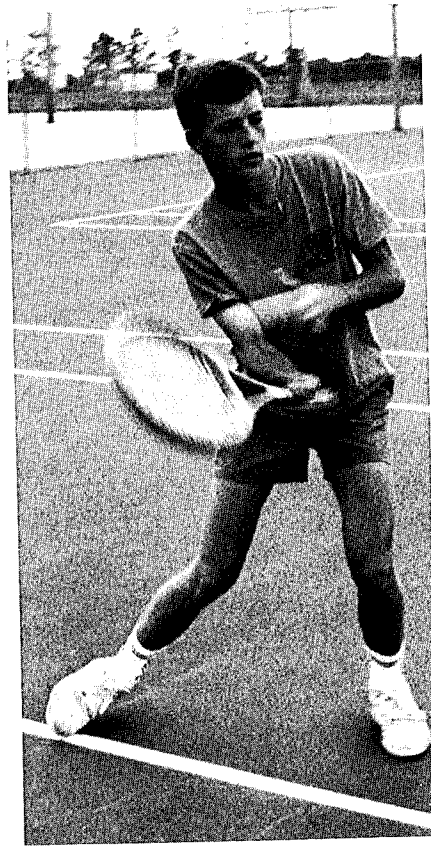

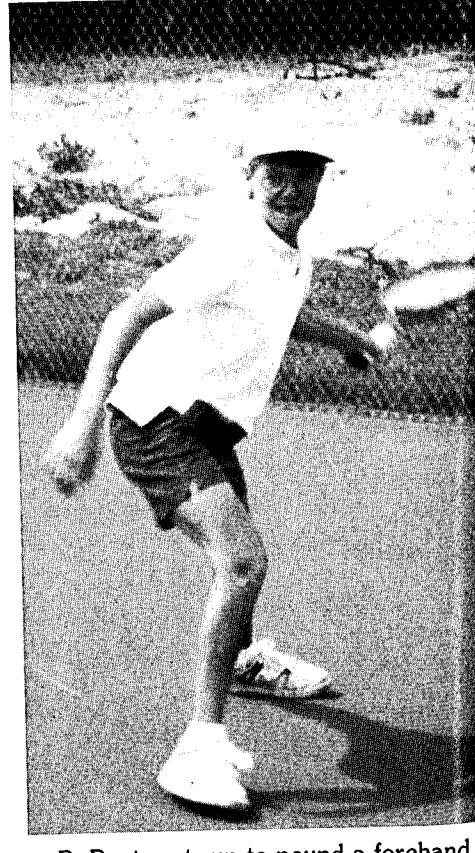

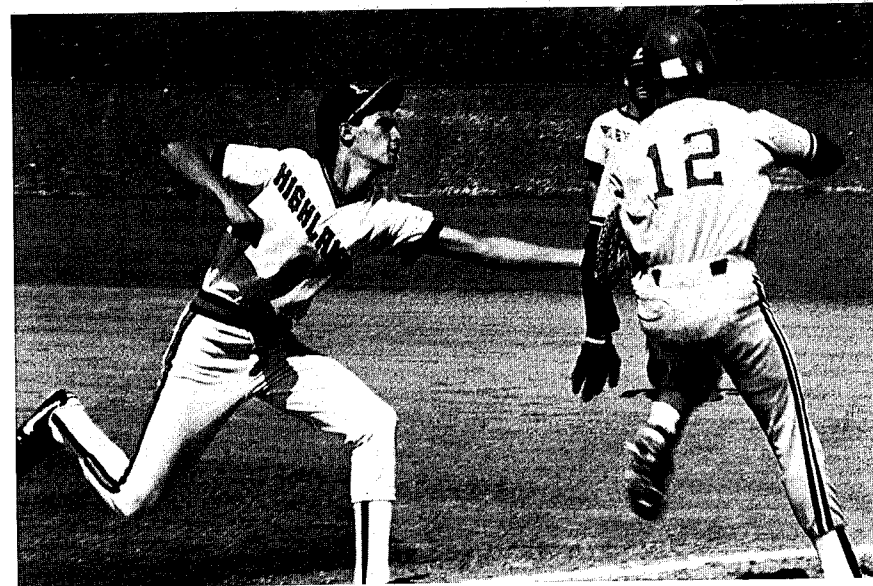

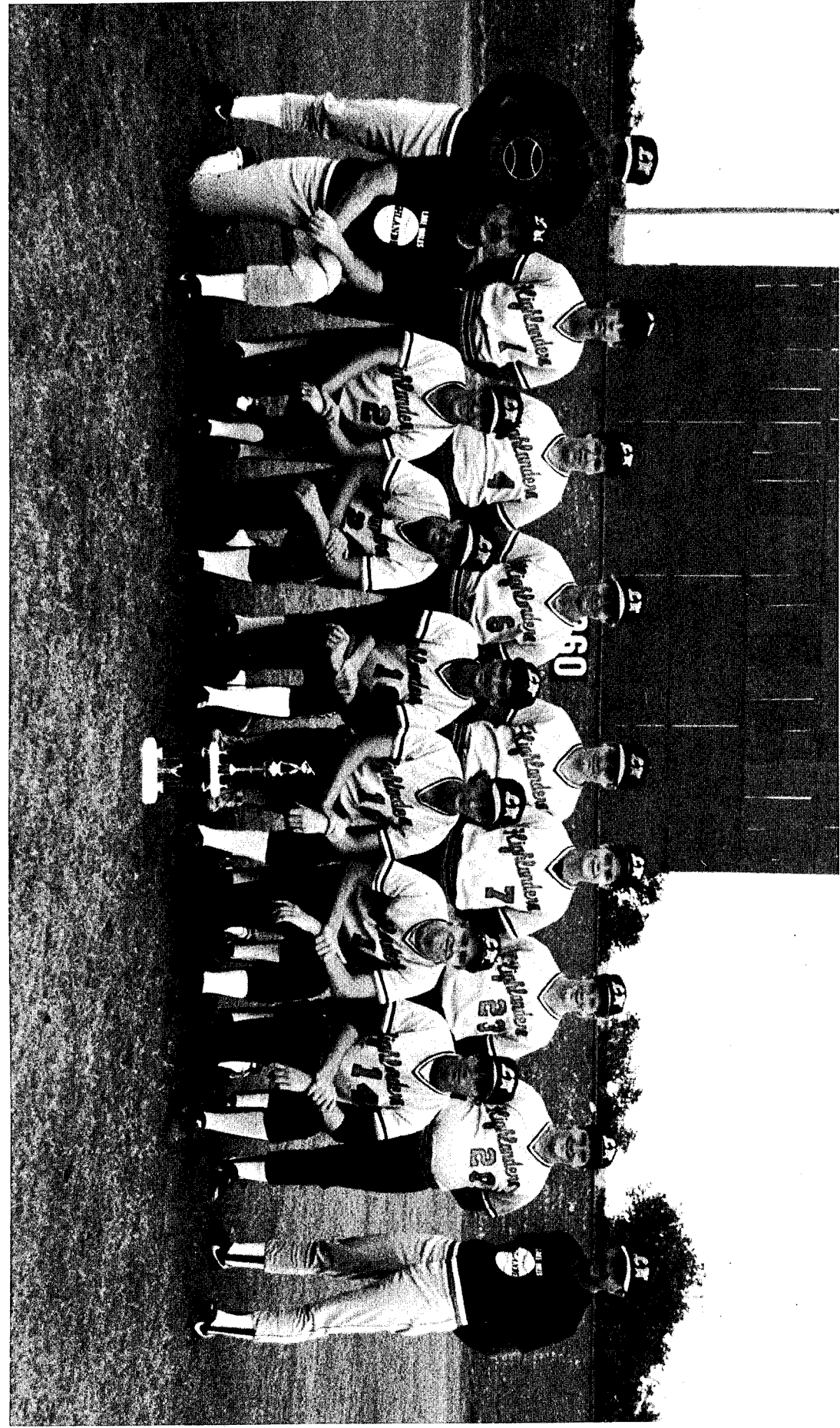

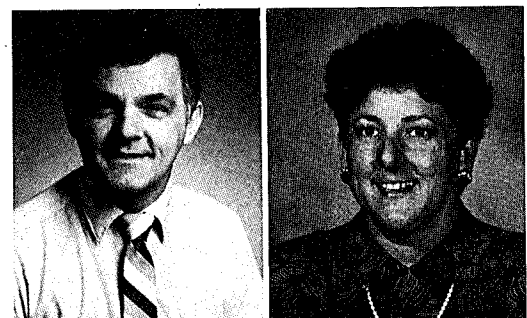
Counselors Help Students For Today and Tomorrow

area.

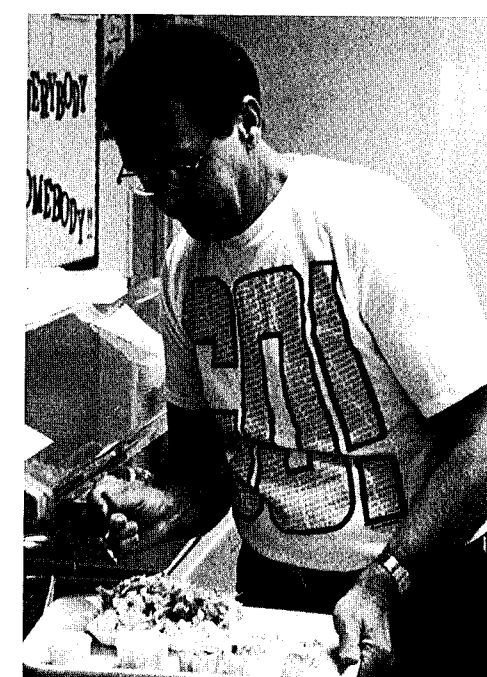

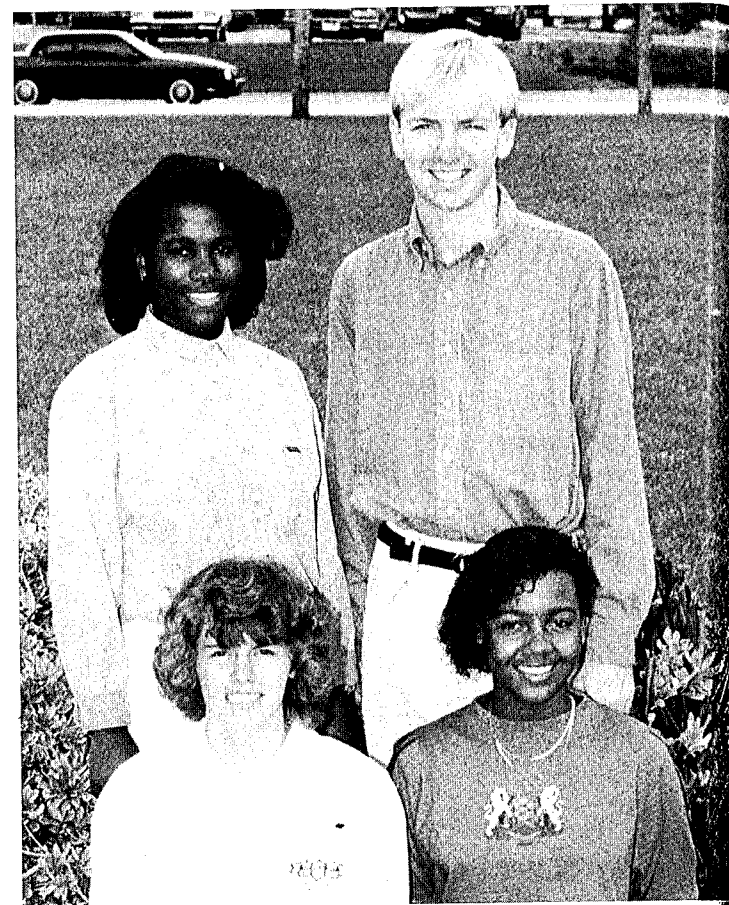
The primary objective of J.R.O.T.C. is to promote patriotism, a sense of responsibility, to respect authority, and to be a better citizen. We comply with a fixed program of instruction in a four year program, as dictated by the Dept. of Army. First year students are introduced to various military subjects followed by intermediate instructions in the same subjects the next year. The third year teaches applied instructions, and fourth year students are in advanced leadership serving as asst. instructors for the first year students. 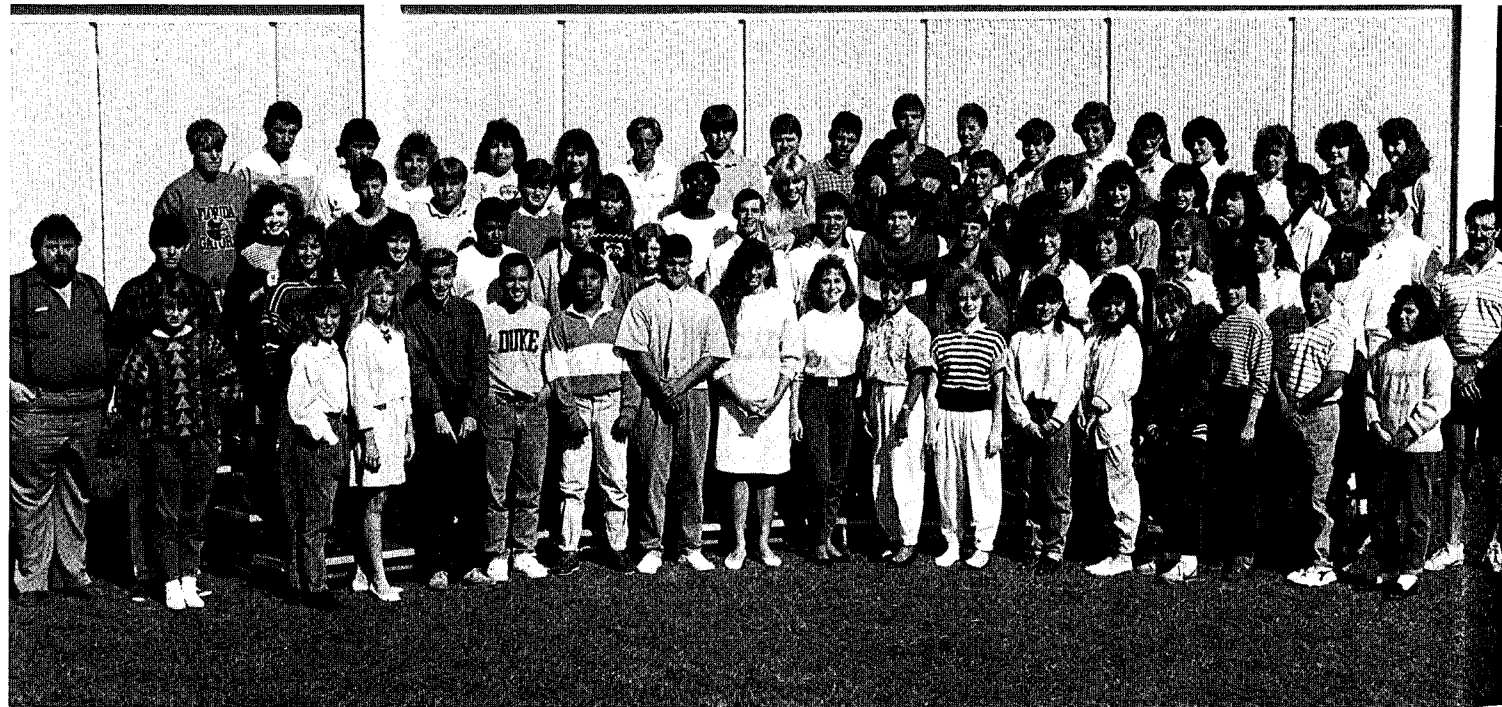

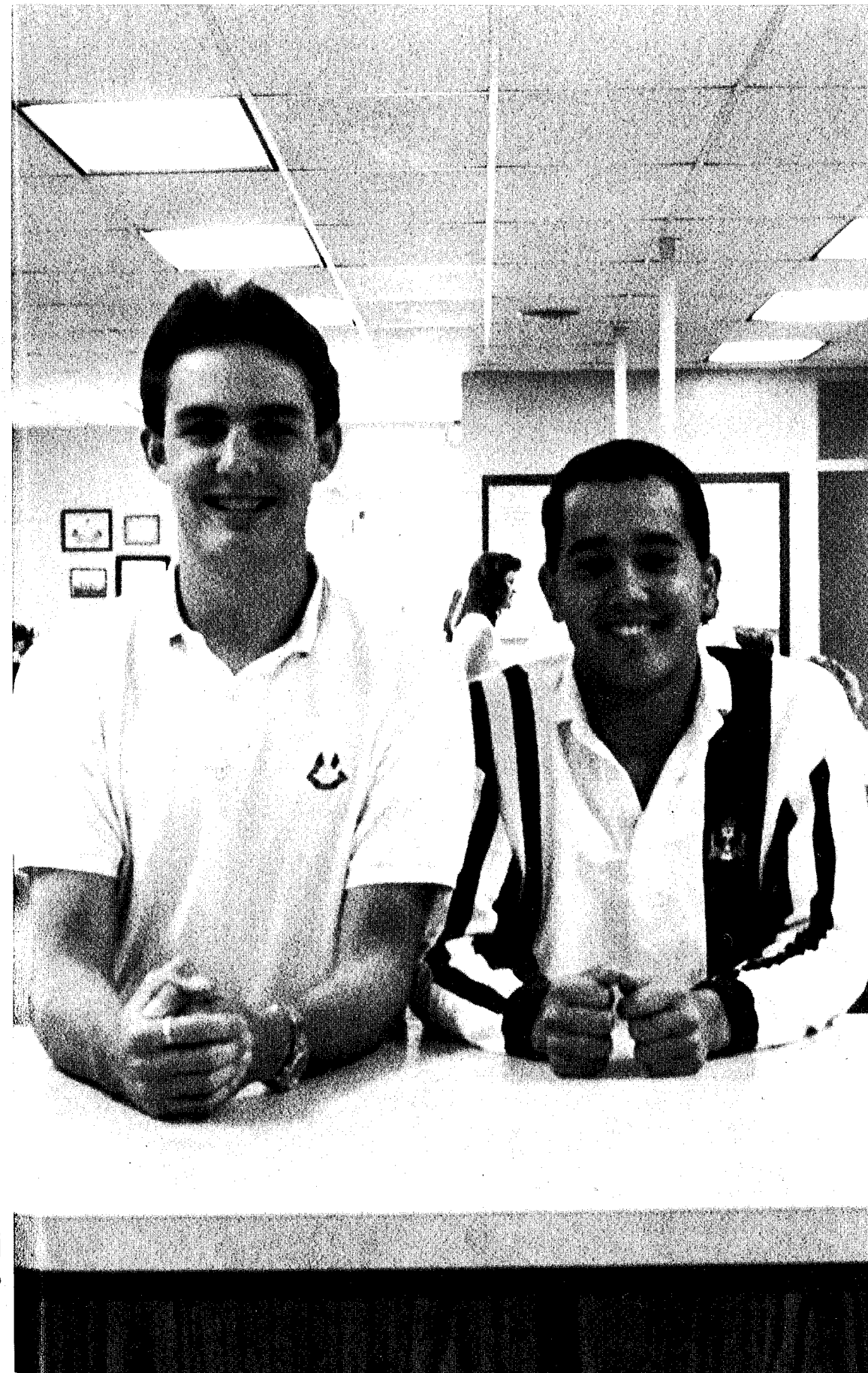

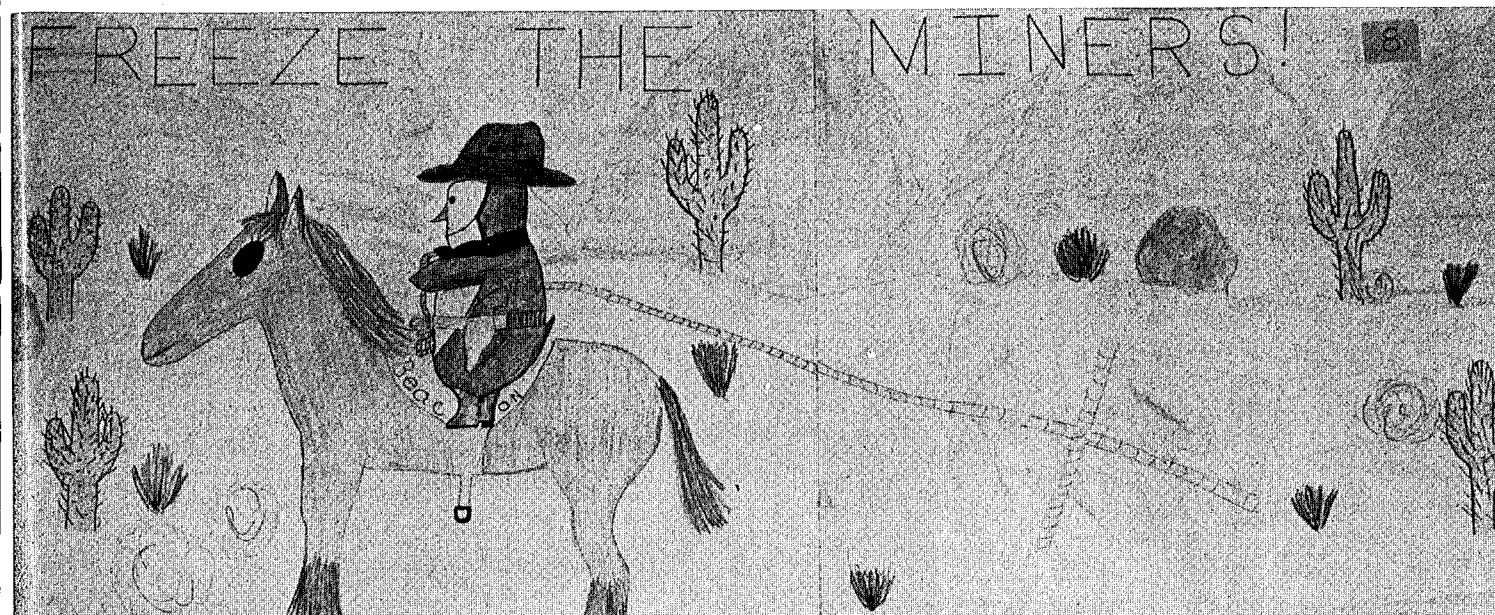

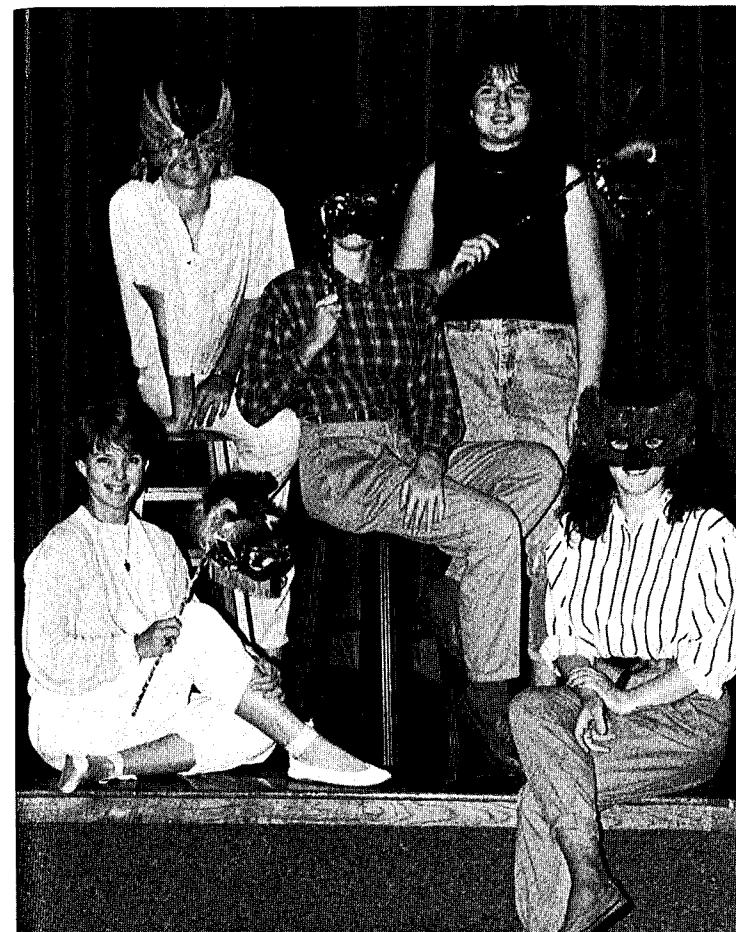

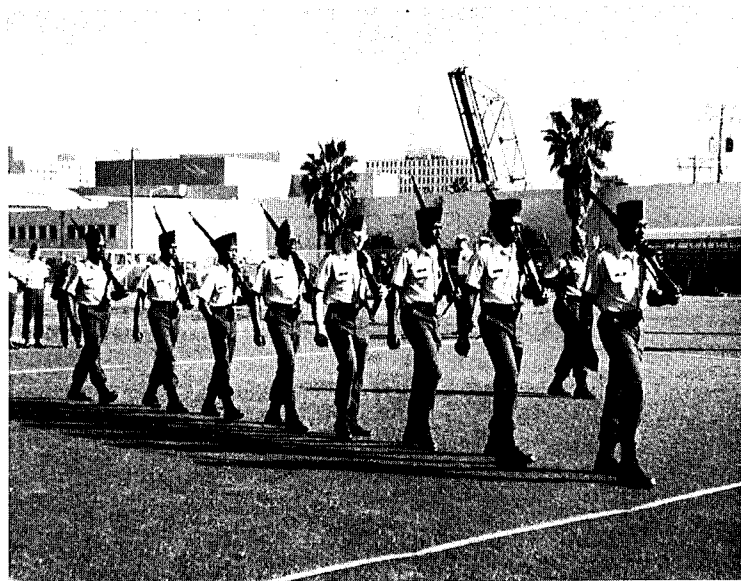

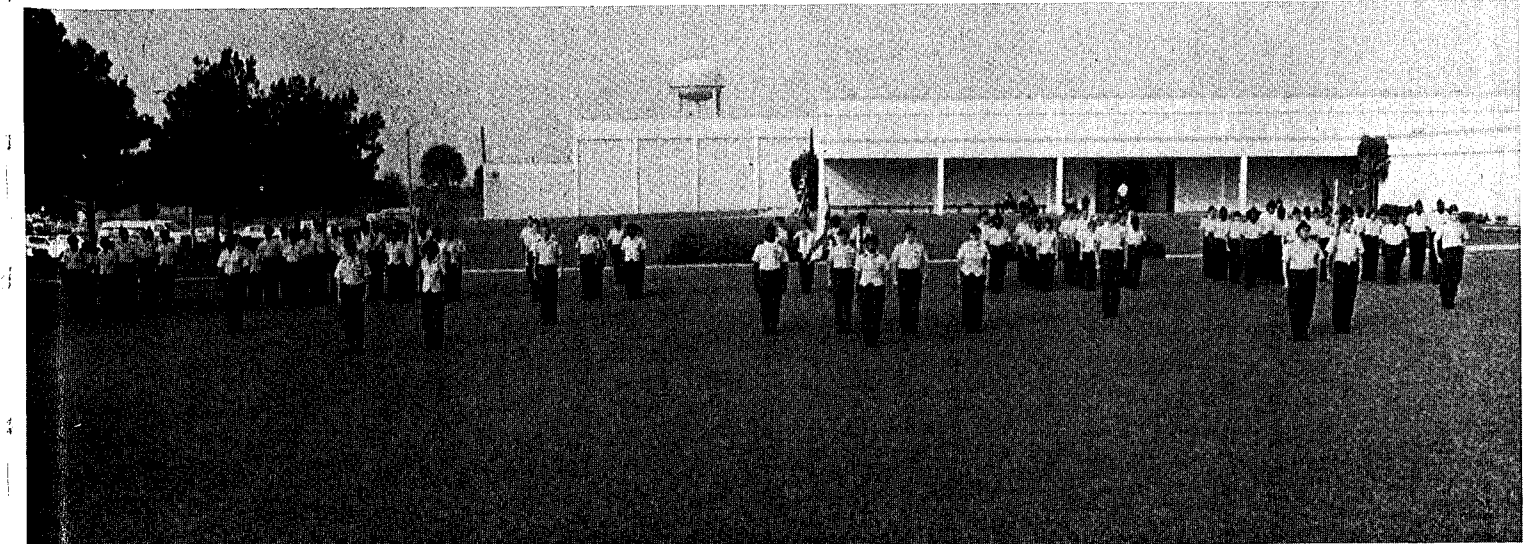

Juniors Struggle to Support Prom

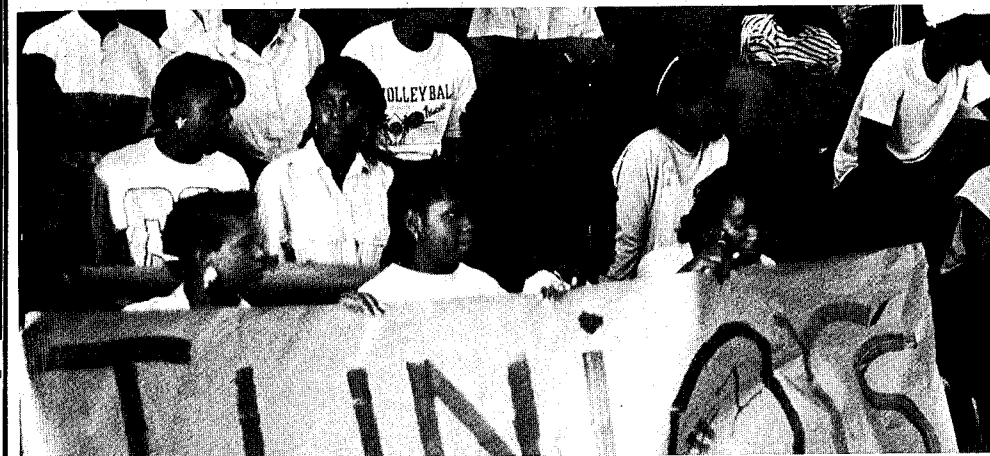

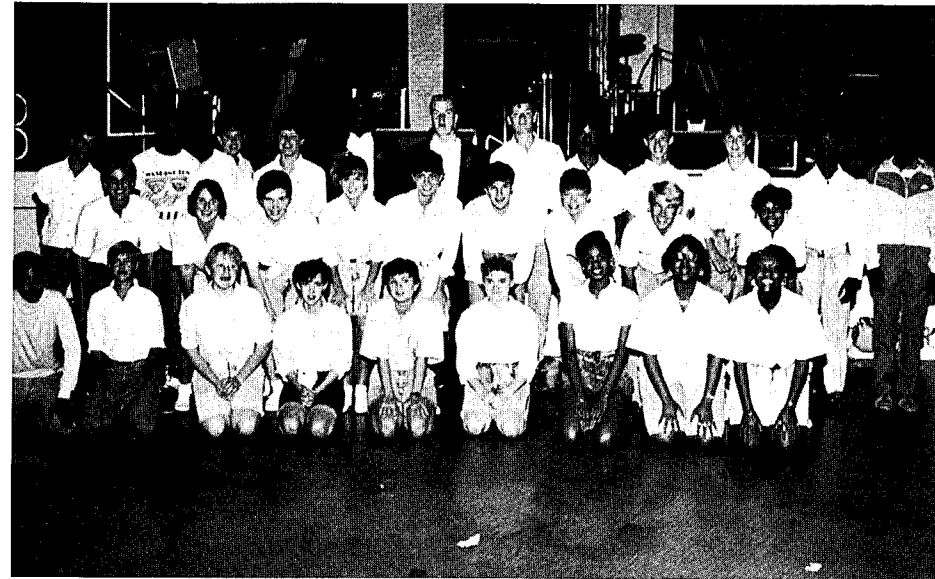

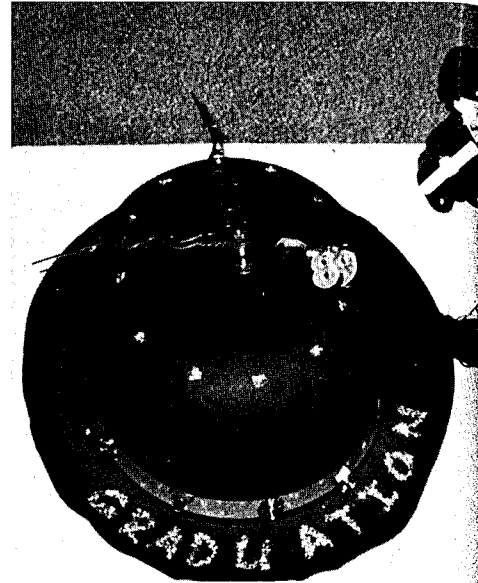

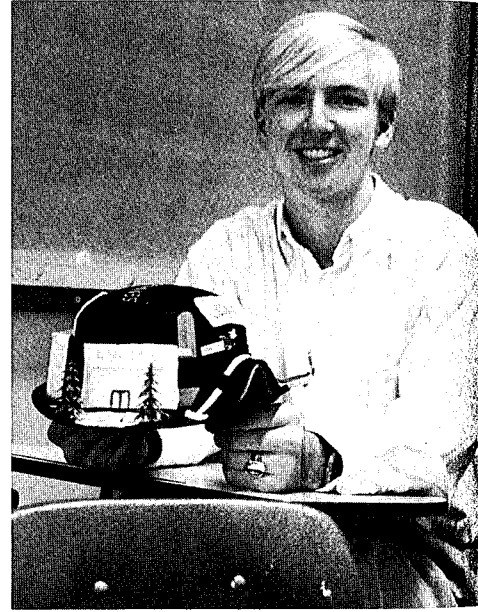

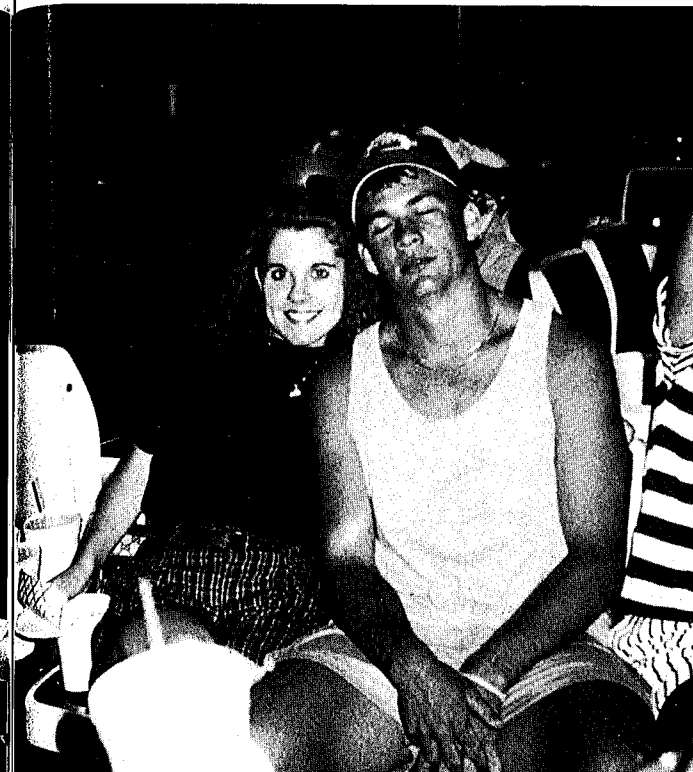
Night Shift and Senior Fling
