SUMMER LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES AT THE VIEW



RGSD scholars needing intervention in Reading & Math must attend the Spring Forward Reading & Math program. Parents were notified directly from their scholar's home school if the scholar was required to enroll in Spring Forward.

Spring Forward will be held from June 3 – June 28, 2024. The program will operate daily, Monday through Friday from 8:15 am to 1:30 pm, Grades K-5 will held at Meadows Elementary School and Gibson Elementary School. Grades 6– 8 will be held at Central Middle School and Westview Middle School.

RGSD will also host the Launch Virtual Reading & Math programs for elementary and middle school scholars. Launch offers extensive recovery opportunities for scholars.
