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AYP Accelerator

This report is designed to address the two following questions:

- If our students who tested last year perform the same way this year, will we make this year's AYP Target?
- Are students on track to meet this year's AYP target based upon the current year's benchmark scores?

This report helps principals and administrators evaluate the AYP status of their schools. The report breaks down, by NCLB subgroup, the following:

- Number of students needed to meet AYP goals in the current year
- Number of students needed to meet *Safe Harbor* ("*Safe harbor*" is a safety net for schools to use when a student group or groups fail to meet AYP target goals. If a student group meets the 95 percent participation rate, but does not meet a target goal for a subject area, the group can meet it with "safe harbor" if: 1) The group has reduced the percent of students not proficient by 10 percent from the preceding year for the subject area; and 2) The group shows progress on the other academic indicator. The other academic indicator is determined by state and can be graduation rate, attendance rate or some other measurement.) in the current year
- Number of students on track to be proficient this year, based on last year's HST scores
- Difference between the number needed for AYP and Safe Harbor and the number of student on track

 - ◆ Proficiency: The number of the currently enrolled students who must pass (be proficient or advanced) on this year's test to meet the AYP.
 - ◆ *Safe Harbor*: An alternative way to meet the AYP. *Safe Harbor* is reached when the school can reduce the number of students who were not proficient last year by 10%. This column shows the number of *additional* students in each subgroup who must be proficient to meet the safe harbor level.

- Lagging Predictor
 - ◆ Number Proficient: The number of current enrolled students who were scored proficient or advanced on the test last year.
 - ◆ Total: The Number Tested or number of currently enrolled students who took the test in the previous year.
 - ◆ Percent: The number of proficient divided by the total number of students that took the state test last year.
