Penns Grove Head Start Expansion And Ribbon Cutting-Ceremony



More children in and around Penns Grove will receive a valuable "Head Start" thanks to Gateway Community Action Partnership's latest expansion project.

A September 25 ribbon-cutting ceremony celebrated the opening of the newly expanded Penns Grove Head Start Center at 11-13 N. Broad Street. The event featured a bevy of local elected officials and other dignitaries. The expansion includes two new classrooms, each equipped with private restrooms and sinks. Other improvements to the center include an office/lobby area, as well as paved parking spaces. The newly expanded center will allow Gateway to maintain increased enrollment and provide enriched services to children and families in the Penns Grove community.

Gateway has operated the Penns Grove Head Start Center since 2009. The new addition represents Gateway's continued investment in high-quality early education and family support. The project was made possible through collaborative efforts among community partners and reflects Gateway's mission to strengthen opportunities for children to learn,

grow, and succeed.

Following the ceremony, guests joined a guided tour of the center to see firsthand how the new spaces will enhance learning experiences and strengthen the program's ability to serve the community's growing needs.

Featured remarks from Gateway President and CEO Albert B. Kelly, CCAP, and Executive Vice President and COO Edward Bethea, CCAP, spoke of the vital role early childhood education plays in building stronger futures for children and families. They emphasized Gateway's dedication to expanding access and creating lasting community impact. Penns Grove Mayor La'Daena Londo attended the event and said she was a proud product of Head Start. She thanked Gateway for what they do for the community, and also pledged her support for the Penns Grove Head Start Center.

"We had a dream to do something better here for the community of Penns Grove," said Bonnie Eggenburg, CCAP, Gateway's Vice President of Head Start and Early Head Start. "Thanks to funding from the Office of Head Start and the Penns Grove-Carney's Point School District, we were able to realize the dream. The children of Penns Grove deserve the best, and we believe we have done that for them with this new center," Eggenburg said.




community that tackle important issues like food insecurity. We especially thank Dr. Backus and Mrs. Mary Porter for their leadership and dedication to Paulsboro students' families.

- The first oranges were not orange: Oranges have an interesting origin story; they were quite different from the ones we know today. Historical records indicate that the first oranges originated in Southeast Asia and were actually green. As cultivation spread to different parts of the world—ranging from East Asia to the Middle East and eventually Europe—the fruit changed both taste and appearance. These changes were a result of natural crossbreeding and selective cultivation by ancient farmers. In fact, oranges in tropical regions like Vietnam and Thailand remain green even when fully mature.
