### Interlocal Agreement

- Prepared in 2019; necessitated by our reorganization
- Submitted to OPI upon receipt of all districts' administrative representatives following local trustee approval
- The revised agreement has been signed by all current district representatives
  - The current agreement expires June 30, 2027
  - Notice of renewal was sent to all member districts in June of 2023
    - Districts not wishing to continue membership were required to give notice by September 1, 2023.
    - No districts indicated a desire to withdraw from the coop at this time.
    - Participation terms are for three years (July 2024 June 2027)

## **Current Funding**

- The Cooperative is funded primarily through IDEA Part B funds and IDEA Preschool funds. Our funds are received after the consolidated e-grant for the Cooperative is approved.
  - > Other funding sources include state funds, district match funds, and Medicaid
- Federal funding approval is based upon all schools submitting their applications and each being approved at the cooperative level. After this step the cooperative as a whole is reviewed.
- Currently districts in our cooperative are not assessed a membership fee which is unusual in cooperatives.
- We receive Medicaid funding based upon service delivery in several areas with speech services being our largest area for generating funds.

# Child Count coming soon!

Child Count may be submitted anytime between PRESCRIBED DATES IN EARLY OCTOBER AND MID-NOVEMBER. The six-week period between Child Count day and the deadline provides time for districts to review the Child Count list for accuracy. The Child Count list is generated from data extracted from AIM; therefore, changes to the list must originate in AIM. For instance, a student may be missing from the list because his/her IEP in AIM is unlocked. Once the IEP is locked and the information is re-imported into the Child Count application, the student will appear on the list.

The following information must be in AIM for students to appear on Child Count:

- a completed, locked IEP;
- a completed, locked Evaluation Report with an age-appropriate disability;
- an age-appropriate Setting of Service; and
- an enrollment on or prior to the Child Count day (October 7, 2024).

### **Child Count and Private School Counts**

- In accordance with IDEA 2004, every public school district must conduct a child count of <u>all</u> IDEA-eligible students who are parentally enrolled in private elementary and secondary schools within the public school district's boundaries. Homeschool students are considered private school students. The child count for these students must be conducted annually on the first Monday of October (to coincide with the Child Count reporting date). A copy of this count must be maintained by the public school, or the special education cooperative on behalf of its member school districts.
- The Private School Child Count Form is the basis for calculating the proportionate share of Part B funds for the annual application for Part B/Preschool Allocations.
- The Special Education Division is requiring that all districts return the completed and signed Child Count of Parentally Enrolled IDEA -Eligible Students to the division by MID November.
- In order to be counted on the Child Count of Parentally Enrolled IDEA-Eligible Students, a student must:
  - Attend a Private School (or homeschool) within your district boundaries
  - Have been identified as having a qualifying disability under IDEA
- This count must include all IDEA-eligible students, whether or not they are receiving special education services through a Services Plan.

### Who Did We Serve?

- The cooperative supports all students enrolled in member schools. ANB counts for Fall of 2023 indicated 3,502 total students
- Fall 2023 child count indicates 499 PK-12 students in current co-op schools were identified with disabilities
- Areas where our students qualify:
  - 13.0% students qualified in speech
  - > 37.5% students, learning disability including some with dyslexia
  - 8.0% students, other health impaired
  - > 2.8% students, intellectual disability
  - 4.2% students, autism
  - > 11.6% students, developmental disability (now a criteria in use potentially until 9<sup>th</sup> birthday)
  - ▶ 3.0% students, emotional disturbance
  - > 19.0% students, multiple disabilities
    - > 3.8% students, multiple disabilities including autism
  - 0.2% students, hearing impairment
  - 0.2% students, visual impairment
  - .4% students, orthopedic impairment
  - 0% students, deaf
  - ► 0% students, TBI

### Hiring Teachers and Service Providers

### OPI Endorsement Project

- Limitations of staff not certified in special education nor in endorsement project --- cannot be special education teacher on record; cannot write IEPs or ERs
  - The OPI Special Education Endorsement Project is accepting applications for the 2024-25
    - school year.
      An annual stipend is paid to special education teachers to offset their tuition costs.
      - The Internship Program is an option for those who don't get into the Endorsement Project. It also allows for a candidate to work in special education for up to 3 years while completing their coursework when they have a different Class 1 or 2 endorsement, but it does not include a stipend.
      - The internship program is preferable rather than having teachers get a class 5 endorsement. Only one class 5 endorsement is allowed per individual in their lifetime.

### MCASE Recruitment Project

MCASE is working in conjunction with School Administrators of Montana (SAM) and the Office of Public Instruction (OPI) to recruit highly-qualified personnel to Montana.

- Part C to Part B Transition meetings
  - It is your responsibility to attend and address your district's preschool services.
  - ECI will set up the meetings and invite you; you are responsible to provide Procedural Safeguards at Transition meetings.
  - ECI invites me to attend as well to ensure the cooperative meets our responsibilities to a timely evaluation on behalf of your district.
- Co-op will provide evaluations and related services; early inclusion of therapists is recommended
