**What a transitional and amazing week we've had! It's been a rich week spending time together and learning new things. There is always so much to learn. And the joy is that we will always continue to learn! It never stops! Science is a subject that is always intriguing. The weekly question is- Why does water splash? And we are engaged on learning the answer to that! We are expanding on learning about the different states of matter and adding new vocabulary like evaporation, condensation, freezing, melting, and even sublimation. It has opened new doors, doors into understanding our environment and how incredible it is! Next week in science we will be starting to learn about..."Why can't you breathe in outer space?**

**In social studies we have continued learning about economics. What is earning money and what does that look like. Then when it comes to saving money, spending money- what does that look like? And how do we budget it all?**

**In language arts we are still focusing on punctuation. Where do those apostrophes go? After which word in a sentence do you place the comma? And what about quotation marks where do those go? Just some of the things that we are learning about this week.**

**Math continues to be a favorite subject. In kindergarten we are learning to write addition sentences and how to solve them. In first grade we are learning the value of coins and how to count them. In second grade we are continuing on with three digit addition and subtraction. In third grade we are carrying on with multiplication and division. The focus is more on division and the different ways you can write a division problem. Even though the symbols look different, they mean the same thing!**

# MUSIC MATTERS!

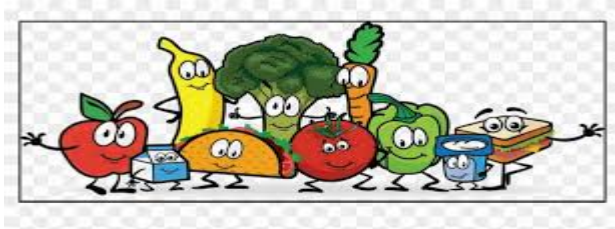


## Music Class

This week our younger students reviewed our songs and created rhythms using rhythm sticks and drums. Rhythm training sharpens the ability to hear and feel timing, which is crucial for playing music with others.
