Exploring Shoes This Month

This month, our focus is on shoes. Students will be encouraged to observe the various types of shoes, their distinct textures and practical uses. They will exercise self-help skills by learning how to take off and put on their shoes, as well as care for them by brushing away dirt or mud. Children will also practice matching shoes by noticing differences and similarities between them. As the season brings changes in the weather, the children will discover the effects of stepping into rain or mud puddles. Additionally, they will be introduced to new vocabulary, including terms like: "shoe prints", "tracks", "soft", "bumpy", "squishy" and more.

Our kids will also have the chance to experience the sensation of wind while joining in various activities with scarves, sheer fabrics, flags, sticks adorned with ribbon streamers, or long feathers tied to strings. Furthermore, families will receive a take-home activity designed to deepen their children's understanding.

We are happy to celebrate Dr. Seuss with a week full of engaging activities! We have selected the beloved book "The Cat in the Hat." Families are invited to join us for our Dr. Seuss book parade at the week's conclusion. We will provide more information as the event comes closer!

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





In the month of March we will have Spring Break, make sure they are still taking a nap throughout the day, to keep them on routine. Have your child walk to the classroom; this helps build those large muscles in their legs.



CASA BLANCA CLASSROOM

Greetings Families.

We are hoping that everyone is doing well to fight off all the illnesses that have been floating around the schools this past month. We have been discussing the many ways of how germs can get into our bodies and how we can prevent this from happening. We talked about covering our sneezes and coughs with the interior of our elbows. We showed the children the proper handwashing techniques. The children were asked, "when do we wash our hands?" and we got great responses. We were told, after using the restroom, when we blow and clean our nose, and when we come back from the playground. The children do know why we wash our hands properly. It is just a matter of being consistent. Please remind the children to wash their hands and practice good hygiene when they are out and about.

The weather has also been very unpredictable. We have had some serious cold weather lately. We have also had some really nice warm weather, as well. My advice to you is to please send your child with a heavy coat or layer your children up with two jackets or sweaters. A stocking cap will also work. Just as a reminder, we still take the children out on the playground if it isn't too windy. So a jacket and a hat or hood would be very practical.

As we begin the month of March, we will be introducing a new theme for study: Gardening. This is a very exciting time for many of us who enjoy being outdoors and working in a garden. We will decide as a class as to what we would like to plant. Obviously, we will plant some white corn, beans and squash. We would also like to plant some flowers and take of them inside the classroom.

Outdoors in March also means looking for all the wild edibles that are scattered all over the land. It is one of the events that many of our people look forward to, including myself, every spring. Of course, I am talking about going *scha muu'* (wild celery) and *haa dra nii'* (wild onion) picking. It is very relaxing and can be shared with family members. Take a lunch and make a day out of it. As far as the classroom going, we will see if it is feasible and safe. As with being in the outdoors, there are also wild animals that may be waking up at this time, especially rattlesnakes. However, if you go on your own, make sure to take some pictures of your outing.

In March, we will also be having our spring break beginning on the week of March 16-19. Families are encouraged to take some time off and spend time with your children. Take a road trip around the State of New Mexico. Perhaps, take a trip out of state. Or, you could even take a trip around the reservation and visit family members, elders, and all the other places here at home. Make sure you do return in order to celebrate our first feast day of the year in the Village of Laguna. We are hoping that everyone will be able to participate at the dance or maybe as a vendor. Or maybe just as a spectator and supporter of all the crafts and foods that will be sold.

So, Mrs. Pedro and I would like to thank all of our families for being patient with our school last month. We had many days where we were short staffed and had no buses running due to circumstances beyond our control. We are doing our best to provide quality education and staffing here at our school during those days. Unfortunately, there are those hard decisions that administration must make, only to make sure that our students are safe. Again, thank you for your patience.

Hello Paguate classroom families,
Hope you all are staying warm, the weather lately has been cold and windy.

As we get into another month, we teachers are happy to say were getting closer to the school year coming to an end we have 3 more months left of learning to do.

For the remainder of the school year, we will be focusing on our letters, numbers, practicing our daily classroom safety rules, classroom routines, using and implementing our learning skills and getting ready for the next level of learning. The children are getting good with tracing their name, letters, shapes and numbers. We will also continue practicing using our Creative Curriculum, Cultural Life Ways, and our Conscious Discipline.

Teachers of the Paguate classroom are very happy and proud of your children learning the Keres language. Please continue to encourage your child to say the Keres prayer during family meal times. They are also able to say our morning prayer to get our day started, knowing the direction to face, when asked. Simple, basic Keres words are used daily. Ask your child what they are learning and continue using the language at home. What little you may know is a lot for your child.

The Creative Curriculum, we are going to be exploring with gardening. We will be teaching the kids how to plant with soil and seeds along with the pots being used and being out in the sun to help them grow. Our STEAM is exploring wind. Please look out for the Classroom Calendar with fun Activities to do with your child. Thank you, Parents/Guardians, for sending your children to school every day. We are looking forward to an awesome finish. The weather is still cold, please dress children according to weather. If your child is going to be out, please call the school or get in contact with the teachers so they can be excused for the day.

Warm Greeting Families

Here we are in the month of March! Seems that the school year is flying by. Children have been increasing their knowledge about buildings. We spent time looking at different shapes of buildings. What are some materials that are used to build a strong house, after reading Three Little Pigs.

Children examined some pottery that was brought in to look at the shapes that are used while painting. Children then had a chance to paint their own potteries.

During the month of February, we have another friend who has now come out of wearing pull-ups and is now toilet trained. YAY FRIEND!!! We are proud of you.





Dear Parents and Guardians,

Friendly reminder, please keep sick children at home. By sending a sick child to school, with a fever, cough or sneezing, we risk spreading infections to others and possibly making a sick child's illness worse.

Symptoms to watch for:

- Fever (100.4°F or higher)
- Persistent cough
- Sore throat
- Persistent runny or stuffy nose
- Congestion
- Body aches
- Headache
- Chills
- Fatigue
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

If your child exhibits any of these symptoms, please consider keeping them home and seeking medical advice if symptoms persist.

Encourage your child to wear a mask if they have mild symptoms but need to be around others, especially if they are recovering from an illness. Reinforce good hygiene practices, such as frequent handwashing, using hand sanitizer, and covering coughs and sneezes with a tissue or elbow. If your child is experiencing symptoms, their teacher may choose to have your child wear a mask while at the program. If so, you will receive notification.



*The number of back-and-forth conversations (conversation turns) children experience, relates with brain activity/structure.

Use these tips to increase words & taking turns when talking, reading, or singing with your child.



1. **Talk about** what you're doing and thinking.
2. **Comment on** what they are doing or looking at.
3. **Name things** that they are interested in.
4. **Get down to their level:** face to face.
5. **Touch, hug, hold.**
6. **Tune in and respond** to what they look at, do, or say.
7. **Wait for their response,** give them time to answer.
8. **Copy their words** and add more words.
9. **Make faces, use gestures.**
10. **Take turns-**don't do all the talking.
11. **Repeat and add** to what they say and do.
12. **Follow their lead,** do what interests them.
13. **Encourage them,** be positive.
14. **Be silly!**

REMINDERS
