| ESSENTIAL DUTIES MAY INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO: | <p>Speech-language pathologists provide speech-language pathology services to address the needs of students with disabilities that affect speech, communication, and/or language skills. Students may receive speech-language services as a primary service or as a related service. Eligible students receive speech-language services when they demonstrate a disability that impacts educational functioning.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide direct consultation services to special education-eligible students with communication needs through individual therapy, group therapy, and/or consultation for communication disorders • Conduct case management as required, including coordinating and conducting REED, IEP, and staff meetings in accordance with Special Education rules • Provide comprehensive evaluations/re-evaluations and collaborate with IEP teams to determine eligibility and programming/services of students suspected of needing special education • Develop compliant IEPs based on student needs with appropriate measurable goals • Provide Progress Reports and ongoing data collection for adjustment of therapeutic techniques based on student needs/progress • Complete service documentation and Medicaid billing in Illuminate as required, complying with directives on tip sheets and annual training, including timely billing and maintaining therapy activity attendance logs • Serve as an active member of the Speech Pathology Department in supporting best practice, team problem-solving, and consulting on challenging cases • Participate as a member of local school teams as related to speech and language concerns; attend monthly grade-level or staff meetings when appropriate • Continue professional development related to professional goals and assigned caseload • Provide training and coaching to staff and parents regarding communication support for students with communication needs • Use technology to support learning and have the skills to research effectively, including the use of the Internet for research, Google Applications, Microsoft Word/Excel, and other educational software and programming • Regular and consistent in-person attendance • Valid driver's license with reliable transportation • Other responsibilities as deemed appropriate by the supervisor |
