School Responsibilities

The Continuing Learning Center:

• Facilitate positive communication between administrators, teachers, parents, and students

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least once a year in elementary schools) during which this covenant will be discussed as it relates to the child's individual achievement. Specifically, these conferences will be held:

- Conferences can be scheduled through the main office, teachers, and counselors.
• Conferences will be held during the teacher's planning period, before school, or after school Teachers may contact parents for conferences as needed

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their child's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:

- Progress reports will be submitted by the 5th week of each quarter Report cards
• will be issued at the end of each quarter
• Grades are available through Schoology throughout the school year

4. Provide parents with reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available to consult with parents as follows:

- Parents can contact faculty and staff by calling the main office at 221-2122, note/letter, email, or through the school's website.

5. Provide parents with opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

- Parents are encouraged to participate in the Parent Advisory Committee
• Parents may observe classroom activities with prior approval from the administrator
• All parents must report to the main office to apply for a visitor ID card

6. Ensure regular, meaningful, two-way communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent possible, in a language that family members can understand.

- Parents can contact school staff by phone, email, or in person. Responses will be made within 24-48 hours in an understandable language.
• If a different language is requested, the MCPSS ESL Office will provide the necessary documents or an interpreter to assist you.

Parental Responsibilities

We, as parents, will support our children's learning in the following ways:

- Be responsible for my child's punctuality and attendance.
• Participate, as appropriate, in decisions related to my children's education.
• Stay informed about my child's education and communicate with the school by quickly reading all school or school district notices.
• Serve, to the extent possible, in advisory groups, such as Title I advisory committees and parent-family engagement committees
• Support and reinforce school/classroom discipline policies and the MCPSS Student Code of Conduct
• Provide a uniform in accordance with school policy
