Social Studies: I can learn about the culture, terrain, geography, government, and economy of Central America and the Caribbean.

Science: I can collect data to provide evidence for how the motions and complex interaction of air masses results in changes in weather conditions.

I can develop and use a model to describe how unequal heating and rotation of the Earth cause patterns of atmospheric and oceanic circulation that determine regional climates.

Reading: I can trace and evaluate the argument and specific claims in a text; then analyze how the reasoning and evidence supports or does not support the claim.

I can analyze the meaning of figurative, connotative, and technical meanings of words and phrases in a text.

Writing: I can write functional text that is appropriate to task, purpose, and audience.

Math: I can recognize real-world problems when two ordered pairs differ only by sign, and then the locations are related to reflections over one or both axes.

I can solve real world multistep geometric problems including decimal and fractional measurements.

I can solve real world problems by finding surface area for three-dimensional figures using nets with fractional edges.

I can find the missing side length of a right rectangular prism given a volume and fractional side lengths.
