Acts 9

- *here we meet one of the greats on whom the faith was build: Paul of Tarsus
- *studied under Gamaliel, tent maker by trade
- *a Greek speaking Jew of the Disapora
- *he hates the Church? Perhaps because it is already attractive to him
- *The Way: an early name for the Church, as in "I am the Way, etc.)
- *why are you persecuting me: whoever harms a disciple harms Jesus himself
- *three days (like the Triduum) of darkness b/c he was in spiritual darkness
- *fasting: a lost art
- *Ananias one more reluctant messenger (cf Jonah, Jeremiah, Isaiah
- *v. 15 a chosen instrument
- *laying on of Hands: God works through men to accomplish His Will v.20 proclaiming in the Synagogues: this is a prototype for how Paul worked
- v.26 they are afraid of him who would not be?
- #note the number of times we hear "he spoke" that is our call too Barnabus: son of encouragement: a levite, also a student of Gamaliel,

bp of Milan

*section ends with the church being at peace

Paul a prolific NT author: Romans, 1-2 Corinthians, 1

Thessalonians, Philippians, Galatians Philemon with other attributions

Deutero Paul: 2 Thess, Ephesians Pastorals

Concerned with *declaring Jesus as Lord

*Founding Churches,*Church Order, *Justification

*meanwhile: back with Peter - the NT ties these two together

- *Cornelius: a devout Centurion
- *the issue of diet (soon: circumcision)
- *behind this is the obligations of gentiles
- *God calls Cornelius: God is One without partiality

We note no sense of nationalism, resisting the idea of chosen people: relation of religion vs political loyalty

v. 38 "anointed" Him v. 39 "witnesses"

Cornelius converts, but "they" are all baptized
