#### **Reminder of Student** Excuses

The following are lawful reasons for excused absences: sickness, medical appointment, death in the family, religious holidays, and court proceedings.

#### **Medical Excuses**

Valid medical excuses should have the following information:

- Student's name
- Dates to be excused (including) beginning and ending dates if the child is out for consecutive days)
- Medical provider signature
- Excuse must be on the clinic/medical provider letterhead

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#### Reminder of Student Excuses (Cont.)

Invalid or Incomplete medical excuses include the following:

- Lab reports
- Adult family member's medical excuses or excuses for siblings, cousins, relatives (the student whose absence needs to be excused must have his/her own medical excuse)
- Doctor's lab or pharmacy orders
- Excuses with no signature of a medical provider or no signature stamp from a medical provider
- Excuses typed in a Word Document without a valid letterhead or clinic markings

#### Handwritten Excuses

No more than **2 handwritten excuses** may be submitted during each nine week period of the school year unless the child has a SCCSD Health Package on file with a physician's signature.

Valid handwritten excuses include

those documenting that a child was sick but did not go to the doctor, there was a death in the family, or the child was out to observe a religious holiday.

Handwritten excuses should include the following information:

- Student's name
- Date(s) of absence
- Reason for absence
- Parent/Guardian signature

In the event of extenuating circumstances, the parent/guardian may appeal to the principal.

School administrators will determine the appropriateness or inappropriateness of absence documentation.

All excuses must be received in the school office within two (2) school days of the student's return.
