



#### What we are learning:

-Children are learning about signs on the road, and what they mean. Traffic signs tell you about traffic rules, hazards, where you are, how to get where you are going, and where services are located.

-Children know traffic signs appear in many shapes, like octagons and triangles, ovals and circles, squares and rectangles. Octagon shapes typically means STOP.

-Some colors are used for traffic signs like; Red, Yellow, Orange, Green, Blue Red (Stop), Yield, or Prohibited. Yellow-Warning... At a YIELD sign, slow or stop and give the right of way to cross traffic.

Children are utilizing the signs that are placed outside during outdoor play; Stop Sign & One Way Sign.









#### Classroom Name News!

#### **Mesita News!**


Children in Mesita Room have began to use the Keres language more in the classroom including simple commands, numbers, colors, and the morning prayer.






