

### WINTER NO-PREP Language Pack

#### What's Included:

- Chilly Categories: The student is prompted to color items in each of the categories a different color according to the key on the top.
- Snowflake Search: The student has to find the snowflake (in a row of 4) that doesn't belong and draw an X over it. They will color the rest of the snowflakes and tell how they go together.
- Winter Stories: The student will read or listen to the winter themed story and answer the 5 questions (by verbalizing or filling in the blank). This activity targets listening/reading comprehension, wh-questions, & recall skills.
- Hot Cocoa Associations: The student will draw a line between the two items that go-together and then color each pair a different color.
- Skating with Vocabulary: The student will name the object after hearing the description and then color the ice skate.
- Winter Bingo: There are 4 different boards with winter vocabulary clue cards. The students will listen to the description of the word and color it in if they have it on their board. Whoever gets 4 in a row first, calls out "Bingo!." You could also play blackout bingo (covering all of the spaces) with everyone winning! I call out all of the cards after there is a winner for continued practice. (Full color version available in the additional folder included in this download).
- Compare/Contrast Penguins. The student will name how each pair of objects are the same and different, then color the penguin.
- A Latte Social Skills: The student will decide if each prompt is a "good friend behavior" or a "not a good friend behavior" and color the mug according to the key.
- Snowy Feelings: The student will read or listen to a short passage and then circle/color the snowflake that has the correct feeling (of the person in the story).
- Sentence Mittens: Each mitten has a sentence on it. The student will color the mitten according to the key (good sentence vs. needs work). The object is for the student to hear if there is subject/verb agreement. They are prompted to verbally correct the sentence.
- Bundled Sentences: Listen to the sentence and color it according to the key (listening for absurdities)
- Synonym Snowballs: The student will draw a line between the two snowballs that contain synonyms and color each pair a different color.
- A Pair of Antonym Snow Boots: The student will cut out the boots at the bottom of the page and glue them next to their antonym.
- Color by Multiple Meanings: The student will say two meaning of the words at the bottom of the page and color the part of the picture with corresponding number.
- Bundled Up Describing: The student is prompted to write three attributes about the object on the winter coat. There are visual cues for the 5 senses at the top of the page. After they write the 3 things, they can can color the coat.
- Scarecrow Position: Color or dot the scarecrow according to the prompt in the box.
- Pronoun Pages: Color the picture according to the pronoun prompts at the bottom.
- Pronouns Cut & Paste: Paste the pronoun word by the picture it represents
- -Ing Verbs: Say what each child is doing and then dot or color the leaf.
- Regular/Irregular Past Tense Verbs: Say what the child did yesterday by filling in the sentence. Color or dot the picture.
- Regular/Irregular Plurals: Fill in the blanks verbally as you color the pictures.
- Winter Word Work: This can be used with any vocabulary lesson. The student writes the new vocabulary in the box indicated and checks if they've heard the word or not. They will then write what they think it means. The next box asks them to write the actual meaning (dictionary definition). After that the student will write a sentence with the word in it. There are boxes for them to list a synonym, antonym, and related words. Finally the student will draw a picture about the word! This page came from my Vocabulary Journal activity!
- Snowman Story Retell or Recap: There are three options to choose from and the students will write their responses in the boxes. One has them retell the beginning, middle, & end of the story. One has them recap the characters, setting, problem, and solution. The last one has them recap characters, setting, 2 things that happened, and the moral of the story.
- Rhyming Mittens: The student is directed to say and write a word that rhymes with it in the other mitten (there is a pair of mittens with a target on one of them).
- Winter Listen Up! This activity has two scenes. The first scene is for following one step directions and the second scene is for two step directions. The therapist will read prompts listed on the right side of the paper to the student (s).
- Color A Snowman Open Ended Game: Roll a die and color the part of the snowman listed by that number! Keep rolling until the snowman is finished! In a group game, if you roll a number you already colored, your turn is skipped!
- How to Draw a Simple Snowman: There are four simple steps to guide the student on how to draw a snowman. After they finish it, I encourage them to add anything the would like!
- Drill sheets: There are two drill sheets included that could be used with any articulation or language card set or activity. For
  articulation: the student will color in the objects (snowballs or marshmallows) each time they practice a target word (60 trials
  on each sheet). For language: the student will practice a language objective/question and roll a die. They will color that
  number of objects on the drill sheet! I included full color versions (in a separate folder) for you to laminate and use with dry
  erase marker, place-markers, or play dough).


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
