





Board of Education Minutes
September 24, 2018
Report 18-31

President Jenc called the meeting of the Board of Education to order at 5:30 pm. The meeting was held in the media center located at Owosso High School, 765 E. North Street, Owosso, Michigan.

Pledge of Allegiance

Building Reports

Owosso High School Principal Jeff Phillips welcomed the 2018-2019 foreign exchange students to the meeting. He also thanked the host families for welcoming these students into their homes. Mr. Phillips explained that his staff has really enjoyed having the students in their building and believes that Owosso High School students benefit from the experience as well. The student introductions included Rafael Franco from Brazil and his host parents Sally and Roy Thelen. Gloria Perez-Pardo Gonzales from Spain, who is residing with host family Rebecca and Todd Donehoo. Anny Vitoria Dutra Dos Anjos from Brazil and her host parents Jennifer and Keith Passow. Kiho Sekine from Japan and her host parent Phyliss Hickmott. Mr. Phillips informed the Board that the high school will continue to host monthly luncheons prepared by the District's Food Service Department that will feature dishes from each student's home country. The first luncheon is scheduled for September 25th and Anny Vitoria Dutra Dos Anjos favorite dishes from Brazil will be served.

Mr. Phillips asked the foreign exchange students to reflect on their journey to Owosso and share something that they did not anticipate prior to their arrival. One student commented that they are required to wear uniforms in her country and she likes the freedom of expressing herself by wearing what she wants at OHS. The students also remarked that they do not have homecoming or prom at their school. In addition, they stated that school days starts much earlier in their home country.

Board of Education Student Representative Carson Bornefeld introduced himself to the Board of Education. Carson informed the Board that he is the President of Student Government at Owosso High School. He explained that Student Government has been working on the *#what's your 17?* initiative, which originated from the Parkland, Florida school shooting and 17 students were killed. The initiative began during the previous school year as a means to raise awareness among students. Posters have been randomly placed around the school promoting kindness and relationships. Examples of the kindness and relationship building activities were shared by Carson.

Carson Bornefeld reported that the 2018 Homecoming Court will be announced on Friday, September 28. He announced that Spirit Week will begin on October 8 with a California Dreaming theme, October 9 is Vegas Baby, October 10 is New York State of Mind, October 11 will be Everything is Bigger in Texas, and October 12 is Blue and Gold day. The annual Powder Puff game will be sponsored by the National Honor Society and held on October 10. Carson stated that Student Council will also participate in float building for this year's Homecoming.

Carson Bornefeld presented information on an idea that was shared with the high school administration by OHS seniors Garrett Hoag and Andrew Beckley proposed. The idea allows students to show their school spirit by purchasing their own parking space that they can personalize with chalk, paint, etc.

Superintendent Tuttle applauded Carson Bornefeld and Maddie Krantz for doing a phenomenal job of boosting school spirit in the student section at home football games.

Trojan Marching Band Director's Jillian Kowalczyk and Jordan Sterk presented an example of the newly purchased marching band uniforms. Mrs. Kowalczyk remarked that they are looking forward to having student's wear the new uniforms at Band Festival on October 8th and homecoming on October 12th. She explained that administrators and Band Boosters spent approximately two and one-half years exploring various prototypes and options prior to selecting the uniforms. The current TMB uniforms will be passed down to freshmen and the freshmen uniforms will be sold or turned into keepsakes through fundraising. Mrs. Kowalczyk informed the Board that the purchase of the uniforms was made possible through many years of fundraising, annual contributions from the Band Boosters, and a very generous anonymous donation. The total costs for the marching band uniforms was approximately \$100,000 and the concert band uniforms were about \$50,000. Mrs. Kowalczyk remarked that through the years, students have taken very good care of their uniforms and have gotten 25-30 years of wear for the District. New majorette uniforms are also being created by local seamstress Donna Nault.

Superintendent Tuttle remarked that a lot of time was spent selecting the new band uniforms because of the expense and the fact that they are used for 25-30 years. The uniforms are very well made and have been taken care of by students, parents, and the band directors.

Board Correspondence

Superintendent Dr. Andrea Tuttle reported that the Blue and Gold After-School program is off to a great start under the leadership of Mrs. Jayne Brown. Students are able to take advantage of these opportunities outside of the district and within. Offsite options include DeVries Nature Conservancy, Fortitude, and the roller skating rink. In addition to book clubs, board games, and disc golf. Mrs. Brown continues to explore additional opportunities for kids. All of the after-school programs are completely full.

Superintendent Tuttle reminded the Board that the After-School program was introduced for students that may not have an opportunity to participate in activities outside of school or cannot afford to. The programs typically cost \$5 to participate and are ran by volunteers. Transportation Director Steve DeLong was praised by Superintendent Tuttle for graciously providing transportation to the programs. She also thanked elementary principals for their assistance in organizing the programs and getting students involved.

Superintendent Tuttle announced that nearly 40 high school students are involved in the Peer to Peer program. The students are matched with a peer mentor and participate in a variety of activities. Most recently, the students traveled to the GISD Base Camp Challenge Center to take part in team building and social skills.

Superintendent Tuttle referenced Carson Bornefelds's report about the high school parking lot spaces that will be personalized by students. The parking spots will be completed by students over the upcoming weekend. Superintendent Tuttle remarked that she is pleased to know that administrators listen to students and their creative ideas.

Superintendent Tuttle stated that Athletic Director Dr. Dallas Lintner will take 15 sophomores to a sportsmanship summit on September 25th. Students were selected by their coaches to participate in the leadership conference hosted by the Flint Metro League.

Superintendent Tuttle commented on how proud she is of the Salute Our Soldiers Veteran's Tribute that took place during the September 21st varsity football game. The special tribute was an opportunity for students and the community to thank the men and women who have served in the Armed Forces. Coach Devin Pringle, Dr. Dallas Lintner, Jeff Phillips, Karen Van Epps, Lori and Dave Rowilson, John Klapko and the Maintenance Department, Michele Prince and the Food Service Department, and Jessica Thompson were all thanked for making the event a huge success. All veterans received free entry into the game and were welcomed to a hospitality tent under the scoreboard for a meal served by principals. The varsity football team wore special jerseys for the game which were sponsored by community members. T-shirts were also available for purchase and all proceeds were donated to support local veterans.

Superintendent Tuttle reported that the Owosso Cares Food Backpack program is in its seventh year of providing food for students in need. To date, almost 22,000 bags of food have been distributed to OPS students that may go without a meal. Several volunteers have assisted over the years with the program.

Superintendent Tuttle thanked Liaison Officer Mike Ash for going above and beyond with his responsibilities by building relationships with students.

Superintendent Tuttle announced that the District's bus drivers attended a bus driver safety event at Bryant Elementary School. Bus safety, precautions, and rules were shared to make students more aware of the expectations that keep them safe.

Superintendent Tuttle informed the Board that the District will begin marketing the middle school to see if there is any interest in purchasing the building. She stated that WODA is exploring historical grants for the building. In addition, two other groups have expressed an interest in the building. In fairness to the community, the District would like to get the best price in addition to concerns about who will ultimately inhabit the building.

Superintendent Tuttle reported that after the meeting, the Board of Education will tour the Precision Electric building as a potential new home for the Transportation Department. The current location of the Transportation Department is in a flood plain and it does not have a lift for the bus mechanic. She stated that the District has received interest in the current transportation facility location.

Curriculum Director Steve Brooks reported that all OHS English 10 students will participate in a debate unit later in the fall. The Sherman Douglas debate format will be used by English Department staff members.

Mr. Steve Brooks announced that September 28th is a half-day of school for all students. Teachers will participate in professional development during the afternoon. Department and grade level teams will work on their teacher evaluations and units. Teachers will also be analyzing their pre-assessment data. Mr. Brooks remarked that he is confident that teacher teams will feel very comfortable once they delve into their baseline data. Owosso Public Schools continues to be leaders in the county in analyzing assessment data.

Mr. Steve Brooks informed the Board that students in grades kindergarten through eighth grade have started taking the North West Education Assessment (NWEA) online assessment in the subject areas of reading, language, mathematics and science. The assessment mirrors the M-STEP which is administered in the spring. Mr. Brooks remarked that students receive their NWEA scores immediately after taking the tests. The assessment also sets target goals for the students based on their results.

Mr. Steve Brooks reported that 14 students have enrolled in the District's welding program. One of the students is now certified and is receiving job offers in this field. Mr. Brooks expressed his sincere gratitude to Board President Tim Jenc, Crest Marine and those that made the welding program possible.

Public Participation

President Jenc stated that the Board of Education is a public body and recognizes the value of public comment on educational issues. Time has been included in the meeting's agenda for public participation. Members of the audience were reminded that they should announce their name and group affiliation when applicable and to limit their participation time to three minutes or less. Comments should be directed to the Board and be relevant to the business of the Board of Education. This is not an opportunity for dialogue with the Board of Education. The rules of common courtesy should also be observed.

Tom Manke thanked the Board of Education for offering additional classes that will allow students to obtain employment after graduation. He remarked that his Facebook page has received a lot of positive comments and support for the Owosso High School welding program.

Tom Manke stated that two adults were arraigned earlier that day for robbing two young students who were going home after Friday night's football game. He remarked that this is the first and hopefully the last time that this occurs.

- Moved by Keyes, supported by Mowen to approve the out-of-state travel by Owosso High School students to attend and compete in the VE Southern Regional Trade Show in Pigeon Forge, TN on November 18-21, 2018 and the VE Great Lakes Trade Show in Chicago, IL on January 30-February 1, 2019. Motion carried unanimously.
- Moved by Mowen, supported by Ochodnicky to approve the out-of-state travel of an Owosso High School agri-science student to attend and participate in the 2018 Global Youth Institute in Des Moines, Iowa on October 17-20, 2018. Motion carried unanimously.
- Moved by Ochodnicky, supported by Mowen to authorize the Superintendent to sign the proposed Purchase of Service Agreement between Capital Area Community Services, Head Start and Owosso Public Schools. Motion carried unanimously.
- Moved by Keyes, supported by Krauss to approve the out-of-state travel for approximately 50 fine arts students and staff to Chicago, IL to see Hamilton on October 17, 2018. Motion carried unanimously.
- Moved by Mowen, supported by Keyes to authorize the Superintendent to sign contracts with the contractors as presented for the area of work delineated and authorize the Superintendent to approve any contingencies of 6.5% and general condition work up to 2% of the overall contract work not to exceed \$ 3,445,802. Mr. Gary Stellar of Clark Construction commented that each of the bidders has all of the required work covered completely as put out in the bid documents and they are comfortable with the quoted bids. He stated that overall, they received very good bid coverage from reputable contractors. Mr. Stellar informed the Board that they are looking to begin work in mid-October, pending the receipt of permits from the State. Trustee Ty Krauss asked if there were any local bids submitted. In response to Mr. Krauss's question, Mr. Stellar stated that they did receive some local bids and the Board will approve a bid from High Quality Glass during the October 22 Board meeting. Secretary Ochodnicky conducted a roll call vote: Ayes: Paez, Ochodnicky, Mowen, Jenc, Keyes, Krauss. Nays: none. Trustee Webster was absent. Motion carried unanimously.

For Future Action

- The Board of Education will be asked to approve the out-of-state travel for the Owosso High School Trojan Marching Band trip to Disney World and Universal Studios in Orlando, FL on March 14-20, 2019. The students will spend four and one-half days at Disney World and Universal Studios participating in the Magic Kingdom Parade as well as participating in "You're Instrumental" workshops. Jordan Sterk informed the Board that the cost per student to participate on the trip is \$1,258.
- The Board of Education will be asked to authorize the Superintendent to sign awarding contracts for elementary bond work that needs to commence subsequent to October 22, 2018 for contingencies of 6.5% and general condition work up to 2% of the overall contract work not to exceed \$833,111. It should be noted that there are three work areas and an estimate from Clark Construction that will remain to be recommended to the Board if action is taken by the Board on the work areas outlined and as presented (carpet and resilient flooring, painting, and wall coverings, food service equipment and chain link fencing).

For Information

Superintendent Tuttle reported that Zachary Roberts has accepted the Food Service position at Bryant Elementary School.

Public Participation

Tom Manke commented that he understands that the District had to accept bids as they did. Since the District is spending tax payer money on the bond project, he suggested that a press release go out to the media explaining why contractors outside of the county were hired.

In response to Mr. Manke's comments, Superintendent Tuttle explained that laws are very strict for school bond projects and the District has complied with these laws as required. She informed him that only two local contractors submitted bids for the project and one of the companies was hired.

Board Member Comments/Updates

Secretary Shelly Ochodnický remarked that she represents the Board of Education at the bond committee meetings. The one item that is discussed during all of the meetings is how the money is being spent. Mr. Gary Stellar of Clark Construction has assisted the committee with staying within the budget from the very beginning of the planning. The bond committee has put many hours into making the right decisions and wants to support local companies; however, many of these local businesses cannot support the magnitude of the bond project. Mrs. Ochodnický stated that she feels that the entire process has been very fair and rigorous. She commended the bond committee for being cognizant of what is right for the District and community.

Secretary Shelly Ochodnický reported that 125-150 people attended the Alliance for A Drug Free Shiawassee meeting at Owosso High School. She thanked the high school administrative team for hosting the county-wide event. Judge Matt Stewart was applauded for leading the drug court team. Mrs. Ochodnický stated the Alliance for a Drug Free Shiawassee meets at the SRES D in Corunna on the first Thursday of every month at 5:30 pm and new members are welcome to attend the meetings.

Secretary Shelly Ochodnický remarked that although she was unable to attend the Salute Our Soldiers Veteran's Tribute, she has heard nothing but positive comments from members of the local VFW and American Legion. The veterans hope that this becomes an annual event.

Secretary Shelly Ochodnický announced that the girls' varsity swim team is undefeated. The team took fourth in their conference meet, in spite of the teams having twice as many girls that took first and second place. Mrs. Ochodnický stated that she is very proud of the team.

Vice President Rick Mowen commented that after watching the Trojan Marching Band perform at a multitude of events, it's hard to imagine how old their uniforms are. He praised the Band Boosters, parents and students for taking great care of the uniforms. Mr. Mowen also remarked that he is amazed by how much the uniforms cost when compared to the cost a few years ago.

Trustee Ty Krauss thanked all of those involved in organizing the out-of-state trips for students and the Board for supporting these. He remarked that his daughter was fortunate to be able to participate in several of the trips when she attended OPS. The trips provide great educational opportunities and are fun for the kids.

Trustee Sara Keyes stated that she also attended the Alliance for a Drug Free Shiawassee parent meeting. She commented that the meeting was very eye opening and scary. She encouraged other parents to attend the monthly meetings. Educating parents and students at young age is vital to stopping drug usage before it begins.

President Jenc called the Board of Education Committee of the Whole Meeting to order at 5:00 pm. The meeting was held at the Washington Campus, 645 Alger Street, Owosso, MI 48867.

Pledge of Allegiance

Public Participation

President Jenc stated that the Board of Education is a public body and recognizes the value of public comment on educational issues. Time has been included in the meeting's agenda for public participation. Members of the audience were reminded that they should announce their name and group affiliation when applicable and to limit their participation time to three minutes or less. Comments should be directed to the Board and be relevant to the business of the Board of Education. This is not an opportunity for dialogue with the Board of Education. The rules of common courtesy should also be observed.

There were no comments from the public.

Bond Update

Superintendent Tuttle introduced Gary Stellar, Construction Manager and Karen Middleton, Project Manager from Clark Construction Company to the Board of Education. Darrick Huff, Project Manager with Spicer Corporation was also welcomed to the meeting.

Karen Middleton informed the Board that she will be the onsite manager for the elementary, middle school and high school bond project. Ms. Middleton will be handling contracts, budgets contractual tracking, and scheduling for the bond construction. Mike Fillingier of Clark Construction will oversee quality, crew safety and field work.

Karen Middleton reported that a meeting was held earlier that day with building principals and Superintendent Tuttle. During the meeting the participants reviewed construction plans. A construction trailer will be placed on the grounds of Emerson Elementary later in the week and fencing will be installed on Friday. Traffic and student flows were studied at all elementary buildings prior to setting a logistics plan to ensure student safety at all times. Clark Construction has also worked very hard so that traffic flow will not be impeded during the construction phase. Ms. Middleton informed the Board that Central Elementary School will experience the most inconvenience during the construction phase due to the location of the building; however, all streets surrounding the school will remain open. The Board was assured that Clark Construction will work on parent concerns and school events throughout the construction phase.

The elementary design and construction plans for each elementary building was shared with the Board. A preliminary schedule was also provided. The master schedule will be updated on a weekly basis and shared with Superintendent Tuttle.

Gary Stellar reported that the plan is to have the elementary construction projects completed during the summer of 2019.

Superintendent Tuttle informed the Board that the Bond Committee will meet every Thursday at 1 pm in her office from this point forward. The Board of Education was invited to a groundbreaking ceremony on Wednesday, October 17, 2018 at 11 am on the grounds of Emerson Elementary School.

Sinking Fund

Superintendent Tuttle reminded the Board that the last collection of the existing Sinking Fund will be collected in December 2018 for 1.5 million dollars. The five-year renewal that was approved by voters in August was decreased in the amount of mills assessed from 3.0 to 2.0 (\$2.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) and will collect approximately 1 million dollars annually.

An updated copy of the Sinking Fund Planning document that lists building improvements and their prioritization was reviewed by Mr. Darrick Huff, Project Manager with Spicer Group and Mr. John Klapko, Director of Operations. Mr. Huff reported that he and John Klapko have went through all District buildings to determine areas that need improvement. He informed the Board that roofs, parking lots, and plumbing are always issues. Upon review of the prioritizations, it was agreed that Central Elementary and Emerson Elementary classrooms that currently have carpeting will go through an abatement process to remove the carpeting and old tiles. The process will be scheduled for Christmas and Spring Recess when students are not in attendance. Other areas of concern that were discussed included the high school tennis courts and stairwell improvements at Emerson Elementary School.

A history of the District's Sinking Fund was reviewed by Superintendent Tuttle. She specifically referenced sinking fund language in regards to the use of sinking fund dollars for the purchase of real estate. A discussion took place about the Precision Electric building as a potential site for an expanded transportation facility. A second tour of the Precision Electric building will be arranged with key personnel for the purpose of determining what alterations would need to be made so the building could accommodate the needs of the Transportation Department.

Sale of Buildings

A discussion regarding the process of selling school property and a variety of opportunities for the Board to consider took place. The District is exploring the sale of the middle school and acceptable uses for the building. Other properties that are being considered for possible sale include the bus garage, Cass Street warehouse, Cedar Street warehouse, and Green Meadows.

Student Count

Superintendent Tuttle expressed her pleasure with the District's student count numbers. She stated that they had budgeted to be down 75 students but were up by 15 students when compared to the October 2017 count. Owosso Public Schools was one of only three school districts in the county that had an increase in student numbers.

Willman Field

Superintendent Tuttle praised the Operations Department for their efforts to make Willman Field look great for the October 8th Band Festival that was being hosted by the District.

School Finance

Superintendent Tuttle reported that a comprehensive statewide study examining school funding in Michigan, conducted by the School Finance Research Collaborative and released in January 2018, clearly demonstrates the need to reform Michigan's school funding system. The key findings of the new report indicate that the base per-pupil cost to educate a regular education K-12 student in Michigan is \$9,590, which does not include transportation, food service or capital cost.

M-STEP/SAT

The Board was given time to take an example of the SAT reading test to see how rigorous the exam is. The SAT is given annually to students in the eleventh grade.

TMB Uniform Hats

Superintendent Tuttle informed the Board that the Band Boosters have asked if they can sell the hats from the old freshmen band uniforms. Their intention is to sell the hats at the alumni band practice and during homecoming festivities. Superintendent Tuttle remarked that her only concern is that the old uniforms have not officially been declared obsolete by the Board of Education.

Memorial Healthcare

Superintendent Tuttle shared information about a recent study that was conducted by Memorial Healthcare. The results of the study demonstrated that our local hospital ranked very high in comparison to other hospitals. However, they did not score well on the community's willingness to recommend the hospital. Superintendent Tuttle commented on how this information relates to the District and the way people perceive things within the community. She stressed the importance keeping messages and information about the District positive.

MASB Delegate Assembly

The 2018 MASB Delegate Assembly will be held on Thursday, November 1, 2018, at the Amway Grand Plaza Hotel in Grand Rapids during the 2018 MASB Annual Leadership Conference beginning at 7:30 pm. Trustee Marlene Webster and Vice President Rick Mowen agreed to represent the District as delegates at the assembly.

March 18, 2019 Board Meeting

Due to the timing of the Trojan Marching Bands trip to Florida during the week of March 18, 2019, Superintendent Tuttle asked if the Board is willing to hold the March Board meeting on March 11, 2019 in place of the committee of the whole meeting. The Board stated that they did not have a problem with moving the March Board meeting date up one week.

Subject:

OHS Trojan Marching Band Trip to Florida

Recommendation:

Resolve that the Board of Education approve the out-of-state travel for the Owosso High School Trojan Marching Band trip to Disney World and Universal Studios in Orlando, Florida, in March, 14-20, 2019.

Rationale:

The students will spend 4 1/2 days at Disney World & Universal Studios participating in the Magic Kingdom Parade as well as participating in "You're Instrumental" workshops.

Statement of Purpose/Issue:

The purpose of this trip is to provide to provide the opportunity to receive instruction from professional Disney musicians in a professional recording session and the opportunity to gain performance experience in a larger setting as well as view performances from various professional Disney musicians.

Facts/Statistics:

- This trip would involve all members of the concert and symphony bands, grades 10-12, not to exceed the current enrollment of 177 students.
- Attendance is voluntary.
- The trip will be funded through student fundraising accounts, student payment and some scholarship opportunities as well as the cost of substitute teachers for the three band directors paid by the school district.
- Money for the trip will be generated through various fundraisers held throughout the school year. Students have been fundraising toward this trip since their 6th grade year. Scholarship opportunities will also be made available.
- All OHS student handbook rules and regulations as well as OHS band handbook rules and regulations determining student conduct will be in effect. In addition, specific and strict, written guidelines, rules and regulations for the trip will also be in effect. Each band student and parent must agree to abide by the guidelines, rule, and regulations prior to a student being allowed to take the trip.
- Adequate chaperones would be attending with a ratio of no more than 10 students to 1 adult.
- Mode of transportation is motor coach.
- The accompanying itinerary gives the approximate schedule for the trip.

Subject:

Awarding of contracts for elementary bond work for Roofing, Glass and Glazing, Heating and Ventilation and Electrical Safety & Communications brought before the Board as a “For Future Action” item at the September 24, 2018 regularly scheduled board meeting.

Recommendation:

Recommend that the Board authorize the Superintendent to sign contracts with the contractors outlined in the accompanying table for the area of work delineated and authorize the Superintendent to approve any contingencies of 6.5% and general condition work up to 2% of the overall contract work not to exceed \$883,111.

Rationale:

To provide for the awarding of contracts for work areas indicated.

Statement of Purpose/Issue:

To award the contracts for the elementary bond work that has gone out to bid for the additions to all three elementary schools for the work areas indicated.

Facts/Statistics:

The bond to provide for additions to the elementary schools and for a middle/high school campus was passed by the voters in November of 2017. During the intervening months, the District staff, community members and the professionals that have been retained by the Board to provide assistance in designing and constructing the facilities have been working towards the commencement of construction. The three elementary additions went out for bid and competitive bids were received on September 11th. Clark Construction, the District’s Construction Manager, has reviewed the recommended bids to be awarded for completeness, propriety and has conducted post-bid interviews with each of the recommended Contractors. The recommended contractors, as has been consistent with all bids awarded by the Board, are the Contractors that have provided the lowest responsible bid for the work and have confirmed their commitment to performance in accordance with the Contract documents.

In addition to the base bids, Clark Construction is recommending the following authorizations from the Board:

- 2.0% General Conditions fund – this will be utilized for such items as safety fencing & signage, temporary roads, construction office trailer, temporary facilities, document reproductions and snow removal. Only those items that are considered customary and necessary will be recommended by Clark to the District Administration for approval and be billed through the Clark Construction billing.
- 6.5% Contingency fund – the contingency fund would be established for changes in work that have not been able to be anticipated by the bid documents. These will not be approved prior to consultation with the Owosso Public Schools Administration and will be in the form of Change Orders to the basic contract. This has been a normal and customary practice utilized by the District to administer the sinking fund to allow flexibility of the projects to move forward without coming back to the Board unless there is a significant change required.

It should be noted that all payments will be made from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds that took place in May of 2018 and have been designated for the purpose outlined above. The calculations, thus far for all preliminary bids received that have not yet been awarded, reflect that the bids are within the confines of the budget for the project as established during the bond and design phases of the projects.

Facts/Statistics:

Under the “Required Documentation” section of the Michigan Department of Education 2017-18 Pupil Accounting Manual is the indication of the following required documentation to be retained by the District:

“The school district's board of education shall adopt a list of approved courses. The list includes all courses offered by the district for credit or grade promotion, and is used when determining which courses may be included in membership for state aid purposes, as well as for auditing purposes when examining the membership counted for state school aid on the count days. The list of approved courses must include traditional offerings and courses offered through other means, such as experiential or online learning opportunities.”

In addition, to the Pupil Accounting Manual, the requirement for such Board approval is contained within Board Policy 2220 “Adoption of Courses of Study” in compliance with Michigan Compiled Law. In the past this was done through the approval by the Board of Education of new classes that were being offered in the upcoming school year. In order to reflect all of the changes in the courses being offered at the secondary level, including Middle School, it was considered prudent to supply the Board of Education a complete listing of all of the courses being offered during the 2017-18 school year which is accompanying this Board report. All courses being offered have gone through the appropriate review to determine alignment with curriculum standards and provide assurance that the courses enhance the ability of the District to “provide for a comprehensive instructional program to serve the educational needs of the students of this District” as outlined in Board Policy 2220.

It should be noted that “course” offerings are not applicable for the elementary level but comprehensive “new adoptions” of curriculum at the elementary level are brought before the Board for approval to satisfy the necessary requirements.

Subject:

Awarding of contracts for elementary bond work for Carpet and Resilient Flooring, Painting and Food Service Equipment. It should be noted that the final bid categories of Fencing and Asphalt work will be brought before the Board for consideration closer to the spring time.

Recommendation:

Recommend that the Board authorize the Superintendent to sign contracts with the contractors outlined in the accompanying table for the area of work delineated and authorize the Superintendent to approve any contingencies of 6.5% and general condition work up to 2% of the overall contract work not to exceed \$224,194.

Rationale:

To provide for the awarding of contracts for work areas indicated.

Statement of Purpose/Issue:

To award the contracts for the elementary bond work that has gone out to bid for the additions to all three elementary schools for the work areas indicated.

Facts/Statistics:

The bond to provide for additions to the elementary schools and for a middle/high school campus was passed by the voters in November of 2017. During the intervening months, the District staff, community members and the professionals that have been retained by the Board to provide assistance in designing and constructing the facilities have been working towards the commencement of construction. The three elementary additions went out for bid and competitive bids were received on September 11th. Clark Construction, the District's Construction Manager, has reviewed the recommended bids to be awarded for completeness, propriety and has conducted post-bid interviews with each of the recommended Contractors. The recommended contractors, as has been consistent with all bids awarded by the Board, are the Contractors that have provided the lowest responsible bid for the work and have confirmed their commitment to performance in accordance with the Contract documents.

In addition to the base bids, Clark Construction is recommending the following authorizations from the Board:

- 2.0% General Conditions fund – this will be utilized for such items as safety fencing & signage, temporary roads, construction office trailer, temporary facilities, document reproductions and snow removal. Only those items that are considered customary and necessary will be recommended by Clark to the District Administration for approval and be billed through the Clark Construction billing.
- 6.5% Contingency fund – the contingency fund would be established for changes in work that have not been able to be anticipated by the bid documents. These will not be approved prior to consultation with the Owosso Public Schools Administration and will be in the form of Change Orders to the basic contract. This has been a normal and customary practice utilized by the District to administer the sinking fund to allow flexibility of the projects to move forward without coming back to the Board unless there is a significant change required.

It should be noted that all payments will be made from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds that took place in May of 2018 and have been designated for the purpose outlined above. 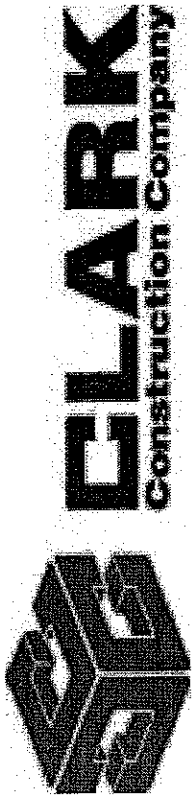

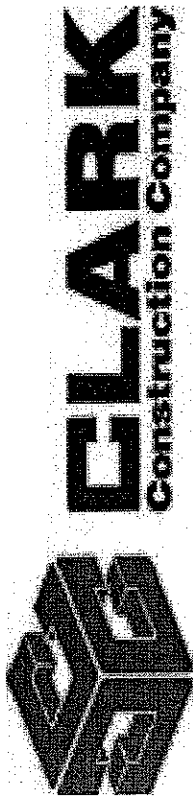

Declaration of Obsolete buildings – Cass Street and Cedar Street Warehouse

Recommendation

Resolve that the Board of Education authorize the Superintendent to proceed with pursuing options for disposing of the Cass and Cedar Street facilities if an alternative location for the services provided out of these buildings is found that is acceptable to the Board.

Facts/Statistics:

Pursuant to Board Policy #7300, “the Board shall direct the periodic review of all District property and authorize the disposition by sale, donation, trade, or discard of any property not required for school purposes”.

The Cass Street facility contains a storage area, housed the previous location for the District’s print shop (which has since been relocated to the Washington campus) and provides a space for the mechanic to fix vehicles that need undercarriage work. The Cedar Street facility houses the maintenance/grounds storage and a centralized location for the team to meet. The facilities are not ideal for these uses and are in need of costly repairs. Options for meeting the current needs of these facilities along with the needs of the Transportation garage are being considered. If a viable option is found and is approved by the Board, these two facilities will be deemed obsolete and will need to be disposed of in a manner acceptable for the long term viability of the Board. The Jerome Street facility would be retained for use in parking for Willman field.

Any proceeds from the sale of these buildings would be returned to the General fund.

Sinking Fund Project Administration

Recommendation:

Resolve that the Board of Education approve the contract with Spicer Group, as presented, for retention of their services for the Sinking Fund Project Administration.

Rationale:

The District has been satisfied with the service provided by Spicer for assisting with the administration and architectural services for the sinking fund over the years

Facts/Statistics:

The District has identified a sinking fund plan, which is funded by the millage that was renewed by the voters in August of 2018 with that particular renewal taking effect in December of 2019. The District anticipates the projects that will be asked to be administered by Spicer entail the renovation of floors at Emerson and Central:

- The projects that would fall under the auspices of the project manager are multi-trade projects that require a complex knowledge of the trades involved.
- These projects are time consuming in nature to manage, which would draw District personnel away from other important operational areas.
- The bidding process requires a full knowledge of the players involved including the integrity of the bidders. A project manager would be held accountable for this process as well as the outcome thereby minimizing the risk to the District associated with these projects and the related contracted service.
- Communication is key in carrying out these projects. A project manager will be responsible for communicating to District personnel regarding the progress on these projects as well as meeting budgetary guidelines.
- The purpose of the contract administration will be to monitor progress during the course of construction activities to ensure systems are in compliance with the construction documents. This will provide protection for the District that the projects involved are being done correctly and that the District is acting as a good steward of the taxpayers funds.
- The total estimated fee for 2018-19 is \$44,560 which is inclusive of the required air monitoring costs associated with these projects. Fees will be paid for out of sinking fund proceeds.

This document contains Spicer Group's proposal to you to act as the Owner's Representative and provide Professional Design Services for the Owosso Public School's Facilities Improvement Sinking Fund.

BACKGROUND:

The voters of Owosso Public Schools have entrusted a millage-financed sinking fund in the Board of Education to provide miscellaneous capital improvements at facilities owned by the Owosso Public Schools. Improvements are needed in order to provide the staff and students with a positive physical environment conducive to learning. To attain the most value from these improvements, professional administration of the sinking fund is warranted. Spicer Group has been involved in the 2002 through 2018 sinking fund improvements and we believe this relationship to be of great benefit to both parties. We feel that it is imperative to start the design and permitting of the 2019 improvements as soon as possible to allow the work to be completed over the Christmas and Easter breaks and the summer if necessary.

SCOPE OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES:

Spicer's proposed services follow. They are phased as annual segments to reflect the orderly and reasonable progress of the project and, unless directed by you, we will only proceed from one year to the next with your concurrence and approval. This proposal will remain valid for sixty days. In the following narrative, "you" or "your" means Owosso Public Schools and "we" or "our" means Spicer Group, Inc.

1.01 SINKING FUND ADMINISTRATION

- 1.01.1 Meet with you to walk through the facilities. Based upon input from you, we shall coordinate, plan, develop, and detail the master schedule of identified improvements, including confirmation that the projects or portions of a project qualifies for payment out of the sinking fund per State of Michigan guidelines. This schedule, including appropriate cost estimates, will be revised from time-to-time on a semi-annual basis and will be reflective of the perspectives of the school district at large, the subject facility, construction "window" time periods, and budget. We will help you identify projects that will be done in house by the Operations Staff.
- 1.01.2 Update you periodically on the status and progress of each activity related to the sinking fund. This may include verbal reports at your meetings, memos, or information you may want to use for public or press release purposes. The frequency of these updates will be determined by you.
- 1.01.3 Advise and recommend to you any alternatives that may be more cost-efficient, that will achieve the same purpose, and that will add value to the project(s).

2.01 PROCUREMENT SERVICES

- 2.01.1 Upon your approval for construction, assist you in the bidding process for construction services. This will include advertising for bids in appropriate publications, hosting any necessary pre-bid meetings and walk through, coordinating any necessary addenda and assisting you when bids are opened. We will evaluate the low bids with emphasis on the bidder's ability to satisfactorily complete the project within the specified time and the bidder's ability to adequately staff, insure, bond, equip, and finance its efforts. In concert with the architect of record, if applicable, we will prepare letters of recommendation for you regarding approval of the award of the construction contract.
- 2.01.2 It is NOT the intent of the Procurement Services scope to develop and implement more than three (3) sets of bidding and or procurement documents to support the 2019 Sinking Fund.

3.01 PROJECT ADMINISTRATION

- 3.01.1 During each design or construction phase, we will provide general administrative oversight to assure adherence to the contract's scope, budget, and schedule. This will include attendance at necessary pre-design, and post-bid conferences meetings and project team progress meetings at a frequency determined by you.
- 3.01.2 Provide general construction observation oversight, review and recommend any changes to the work; review and recommend approval of progress payments and change orders and provide periodic reports on the financial status of the project budget.
- 3.01.3 Inform and update you as to the progress of the particular project with memos and attendance at your meetings. This will include a weekly project meeting with you during the construction season.

4.01 FIELD SERVICES

- 4.01.1 As needed, if needed, and as approved by you and upon our recommendation we will provide specialized on site construction inspection and material testing services during certain identified segments of the construction project to assure a value and quality construction product and conformance to the approved bidding documents.

5.01 PROFESSIONAL DESIGN SERVICES

- 5.01.1 During the design phase of the project we will meet with School district personnel for input prior to beginning the design.
- 5.01.2 Provide outside field investigation to verify existing conditions in as much as feasible.
- 5.01.3 Prepare plans and specifications for permitting and construction for the abatement and replacement of carpet and 9x9 tile with VCT at Central and Emerson Elementary Schools.
- 5.01.4 Meet with School District personnel to review project documents and incorporate input from review
- 5.01.5 Submit bidding documents to the State of Michigan for project approval, if required.
- 5.01.6 Review shop drawings submitted by the contractor.
- 5.01.7 Provide air monitoring and air clearances for the areas being impacted by the work through a sub-consultant, AKT Peerless.

- 5.01.8 At the end of construction provide the School District with record documents of the completed work.
- 5.01.9 Design Professionals responsible for the design will be involved with the construction process as needed to address design related issues.

SERVICES NOT INCLUDED:

We will not be providing any construction services. Professional Environmental Services will need to be obtained once the exact scope of potential abatement is understood.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES:

Additional services related to this project will be furnished by us after you review the scope and authorize the work. Our fee for the additional services will be determined at the time they are agreed to and rendered.

FEE SCHEDULE:

Our proposed fee schedule follows. We will submit monthly invoices to you for our basic professional services, any additional authorized services, and any reimbursable expenses. For each annual segment, our total proposed fee will be an amount equal to the schedule as follows:

- A. Administration – hourly rates not to exceed \$4,500.00
- B. Procurement – hourly rates not to exceed \$1,500.
- C. Field Services– hourly rates not to exceed \$22,000. A budget of \$20,000 is a part of this line item to allow Spicer to hire an Environmental sub-consultant to perform 3rd party air monitoring and clearances of the asbestos abatement. Spicer Group will not be marking these invoices up and the District will be billed the direct costs from our sub-consultant, AKT Peerless. This is the methodology we have used in previous flooring abatement projects.
- D. Professional Design Services – 6.9% of the construction costs (estimated at \$240,000) - \$16,560.
- E. Our total estimate fee for basic services for 2018 Sinking Fund - \$44,560.

Upon each annual amendment of this Agreement for subsequent segments, the fee will be negotiated and proposed in a similar fashion reflective of the services you request.

As the fee is hourly, not to exceed, our invoice will be based upon our actual effort and our standard hourly rates.

We have calculated these fees based on our understanding of what you want us to do and what you have told us. Should we approach the amount of the fee for any reason before we are finished with the work, if the scope changes or our understanding was incorrect, we will notify you and discuss with you the option of adjusting the amount of the fee or adjusting the scope of services.

In addition, attached to this letter is a copy of our general conditions for our services which are part of this agreement. Any changes to this agreement must be agreed to by both of us.

If this proposal meets with your approval, please acknowledge this approval with an authorized signature below and return the enclosed copy to us. Upon receipt, we will start our services promptly.
