LETTER FROM INTERIM DIRECTOR

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Greetings DEC Families,

It is my hope that you are staying safe and enjoying the fall season. There are a few announcements, for our in-person learners, that I would like to bring to your attention. Notices have been sent out to our families, via the LDoE website, school messenger, and Facebook with information on mandatory vaccination for students ages 5-11. All students attending in-person must be fully vaccinated by January 10, 2022. A consent form is required for EOC to administer the vaccine without the parents/guardians being present. The form, along with a letter from LDoE will follow this page. The letter from LDoE explains the steps that you will need to take in order to get your child registered for the vaccine.

For Laguna Division of Early Childhood, only our five year-old students, who will continue attending in-person, will be required to be vaccinated.

EOC will offer the COVID vaccine in the Parent Resource Center (PRC) at DEC: Wednesday, November 17, 8:50 a.m. – 9:30 a.m.

As a reminder, if you choose to have your child vaccinated at DEC on Wednesday, November 17, a DEC staff member will be with your child.

There will be a 15-minute observation time after your child is vaccinated. Once the observation period has passed, a DEC staff will escort your child to their classroom. If you prefer to accompany your child for the vaccine, you have the option of taking your child to the Public Safety Complex in Mesita on Wednesday, November 10, 2021, 4:00 p.m. -6:00 p.m.

In addition, monthly COVID testing will continue for our students ages 2 and up. Our next COVID Test Clinic will take place on:

Monday, November 22 EHS and PHS students will be tested 8:35 a.m. – 9:30 a.m.

If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me. Thank you for your support as we continue to maintain COVID safe practices.

Dear Parents,

In our continued strive to keep our students, staff and communities safe, the LDOE Board of Education has approved mandatory COVID-19 vaccines for all students ages five to eleven. Please be informed that effective January 10, 2022, all students, ages five (5) to eleven (11), must be fully vaccinated in order to attend school in-person. LDOE has teamed up with EOC to vaccinate the students on school campus on:

Wednesday, November 10, 2021 beginning at 8:00am in the LMS gym.

In order to vaccinate our students, we will need our parents to:

- 1. Create a profile for each child at "VACCINENM.ORG"
- 2. Schedule your child for an appointment using **Event Code: LDOE10.** The event code is the only way you will find our event.
- 3. Completed Parent Consent Form online. The consent form is to allow EOC to administer the vaccine without parents being present. A copy of the Parent Consent Form is also attached. Please sign the consent form and return it to your child's school or you can choose to complete the "Parent Consent Form" online in your child's profile.

We have attached a flyer created by EOC, to assist you with step-by-step instructions on how to create the student profile, get them scheduled, and complete the parent consent form. I understand that following delivery of the vaccine, NMDOH will observe my child for a 30-minute period to monitor for an adverse reaction if the minor is unaccompanied. Should a reaction occur, I authorize any necessary emergency medical treatment and understand that NMDOH will notify me as soon as possible. I further acknowledge that this consent may be verified either in person or verbally by telephone before the vaccine is administered if there are questions.

WHAT WE ARE LEARNING:

Virtual Learners: Interaction with the teachers, learning the songs through sign language, engaging in books and activities.

In-person Learners: Interacting with adults and peers, getting into a routine, feeding themselves and one learning to walk.

Exploration takes center stage for the mobile infants in the Sunnyside/Chinatown classrooms. The babies are curious and are on the move, the mobile infants explore everything in a search to learn more about the environment they are in. During this period they are developing small-muscles skills as they grasp, drop, pull, push, throw and mouth objects. They develop their large muscles as they sit unassisted, crawl, walk, climb on couches and walk down steps. Teachers provide a secure base from which babies can explore and learn by building secure and trusting relationships with all babies.

Sunny Side/Chinatown News!

Sunnyside Classroom is full with eight children four virtual and four in-person learners.



Chinatown welcomes two teachers to their fold, Ms. Evelyn Garcia and Ms. Lorisa Pacheco. **Evelyn is a former Head Start teacher who** worked previously with 3-5 year olds and Lorisa is a new teacher and mother of a 15-month old boy. Both teachers bring their experiences and are learning the routines and procedures of Early **Head Start.**


