Medication At School

As per Arizona School Boards Association Policy #J-5361 & JLCD-R, ANY medication MUST come through the Nurse's Office and from the parent not the student. Medication Must be unopened and in the original container.

□ I will not be giving any over the counter medication after 2:00pm, due to over medicating students.

Sick Day Guidelines (When to keep your student home)

School policy requests a child stay home if he or she:

- Has a fever of 100.4 degrees or higher. Keep your child home until his or her fever has been gone for 24 hours without medication.
- □ Has been vomiting or has been diarrhea. Keep your child home 12-24 hours after the last vomiting or diarrhea episode.
- □ Has symptoms that keep him or her from participating in school, such as:
- \Box <u>Very</u> tired or lack of appetite
 - \Box Cough that he or she cannot control
 - □ Moderate to severe headache, body aches or earache
 - □ Sore throat-a minor sore throat is ok for school, but a severe sore throat could be strep throat, even if there is no fever.

Injuries

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☆ ☆ Students with obvious injuries, such as splints, casts, crutches, etc..., need to present a note from the parent or doctor to the health office that specifies:

- \Box The nature of the injury
- \Box What accommodations will be needed
- □ When accommodations will no longer be needed

Your student will not be allowed to participate in activities such as PE and recess until he has been cleared by the doctor or a parent. On a happy note, thank you parents for getting your child's immunizations completed and turned in. A way to be proactive is to check with your pediatrician to see if shots are due. Thank you for your understanding.

Security:

At Nautilus we take the security of our students and staff very seriously. Therefore we are a closed campus.

- Students ONLY will be allowed to enter the school grounds in the morning through the gate located by the basketball courts.
- All visitors on campus must come through the front office and sign in. We ask that you do not go into the classrooms without an appointment and a visitor's badge.

Student: Drop-Off and Pick-Up

The student drop-off and pick-up system at Nautilus is effective and safe when everyone follows the procedures! The following are some "tips" to use the system more effectively!

- Please drop off students at the curb. Do not wait to be at the front of the drop off line to drop them off.
- Have students enter/exit the right side of the vehicle, if possible, as the left side is a driving lane.
- Please pull into the left lane when students have exited or entered the vehicle, to allow others to move forward and drop off their students.
- Park in the parking lot if your child needs help exiting the vehicle or you want to make sure they go into the building.

The following practices take away from the system's effectiveness – and even compromise safety!

- "Cutting/walking" across the kiss and go lanes or parking exit lanes to walk your child to the building, instead of using the supervised crosswalk.
- Dropping students off in the "driving lanes" of the parking lot.
- Dropping off/Picking up in the bus parking area.
- Waiting to be "first" in the "green curb" line, and not dropping children off upon reaching the "green curb" sidewalk.
- Remaining in the kiss and go lanes to watch a child enter the building.
- Not pulling into the left lane when able to do so after dropping off students.
- Early arrival and waiting in the pickup line for the end of the day dismissal.
