#### **RESOLUTION NO. 14-2019-2020**

#### RESOLUTION DELEGATING AUTHORITY TO TAKE NECESSARY ACTION TO PROTECT STUDENTS AND STAFF FROM THE SPREAD OF CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

**WHEREAS,** on March 4, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom declared a statewide emergency arising from the coronavirus (COVID-19).

**WHEREAS**, on March 12, 2020, Governor Newsom issued an executive order directing Californians to cancel large public gatherings and to enforce social distancing; and

**WHEREAS,** on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared a State of Emergency due to the outbreak and spread of a coronavirus (COVID-19).

**WHEREAS,** on March 19, 2020, the City of Santa Maria declared a state of emergency arising from the coronavirus (COVID-19).

**WHEREAS,** Article I, Section 28, of the California Constitution declares that "[a]II students and staff of public, primary, elementary, junior high, and senior high school . . . have the inalienable right to attend campuses which are safe, secure and peaceful."; and

WHEREAS, Education Code section 35161 permits the Board of Education to delegate to the Superintendent broad authority to carry on activities and programs including the expenditure of funds for programs and activities which, in the determination of the Board of Education and the Superintendent are necessary to meet the needs of the District to address the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic and which are not inconsistent with the purposes for which the funds were appropriated; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED** that the Board hereby declares the existence of an ongoing public health emergency within the county arising from the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED** the Superintendent is delegated authority to take all appropriate action to respond to the coronavirus (Covid-19) pandemic, including, but not limited to, any action:

- A. To ensure and protect the welfare, safety and educational well-being of all students;
- B. To cancel or modify any activities, programs, or courses, up to and including the continuing closure of schools and program sites.

- C. To protect District property.
- D. To declare an emergency pursuant to Government Code § 3100 et seq., and to assign District employees (in their capacity as disaster service workers) to perform such disaster service activities as may be assigned to them;
- E. To make further declarations of emergency and to take emergency action as permitted by law.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED** that should any portion of this Resolution be held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED** that this Resolution is an emergency measure within the mandate and jurisdiction of the Board and is necessary for the immediate welfare of the schools and pupils thereof. Therefore, this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and shall remain in effect until repealed by formal Board action.
