You may be asking yourself, "How can I help my child grow?" Just a few simple steps will help our students, your child grow tremendously. One suggestion is to allow students to read a book or article of their choice at least twenty minutes a day. Research shows that students who read at least 20 minutes will score in the 90 percentile of their peers on standardized tests by the time they are in sixth grade. Also, ask your child what did they learn/do in their classes today. This will help the child recount what they have done in the classroom, giving you a chance to stay in the "know" of what is before the student. These are just two suggestions to start off with. We will continue to research and provide more suggestive ways to assist the students with their success this year.


Hello.


