ANALYZE CRAFT AND STRUCTURE

ELEMENTS OF A SHORT STORY: PLOT

A plot is the series of connected events in a story. The plot often centers on how characters face a **conflict**, or a struggle between opposing forces. Plot development can be separated into the five stages described here:

Stage	Example		
Exposition: The characters, setting, and situation are introduced.	Bree and Shauna are software developers planning a presentation of their new app to a major tech company.		
Rising Action: The conflict and events that explain the characters' actions are introduced.	They have tested the app countless times without problems, but the day before the presentation, they discover a bug.		
Climax: The conflict reaches its most intense or exciting point.	They work all day, but can't fix it. Finally, Bree picks up her phone, ready to call and cancel the presentation. At the last second, Shauna calls out, "Wait! I have it!"		
Falling Action: Events "calm down" after the climax.	That afternoon and evening, Bree and Shauna test the revised software several times: no bugs!		
Resolution: The plot ends. Usually, the conflict is settled.	They make their presentation and are offered a contract with the tech company to produce the app.


