2025 - 2026 Budget Development

- October 21: Board of Education approved Budget Development Schedule (tentative)
- December 2024 March 2025: Meetings (formal and informal) held with CSA, Maintenance Coordinator, Child Study Team members, etc. to determine staffing needs, student placement recommendations/enrollment projections, facility/maintenance priorities, technology needs (student/staff level); Fixed costs (employee benefits, district insurances, transportation, utilities, leases, etc.) incorporated into projected budget
- February 25: Governor Murphy's Budget Message
- February 27: State Aid figures released

(\$93,790) decrease in Equalization Aid
\$72,369 increase in Categorical Aids
\$106,260 increase in School Choice Aid
(\$29,182) decrease in Preschool Expansion Aid

- March 17: Board of Education approved the preliminary budget for submission to the County Office of Education (Budget submitted by March 19 deadline)
- April 21: Budget officially approved by the County Office of Education
- April 28: Public Hearing & final adoption of budget by Board of Education

2025 - 2026 Budget Victories...

Net Increase of \$84,839 in State Aid

- Compared to Net Decrease of \$239,194 in '24-25
- Stabilized School Budget Aid Grant \$107,637 in '24-25

- <u>Year 4 of Preschool</u> Program Our students are coming home!
- <u>Shared CST</u> and related services support

Building Professionalism:

- <u>Continued training</u> for teachers and admin on Danielson Evaluation Model & OnCourse platform; Addition of OnCourse enhancements to support effective and targeted teaching
- <u>Provide PD</u> opportunities on various topics/subject areas/as needed (General Fund budget & Title IIA Grant funding) via in-person training, virtual training, recorded training, onsite presenters

- Purchase electronic curricular resources for ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies
- <u>Purchase supplies</u> for Special Areas as needed
- <u>Continue technology</u> purchases (devices, software, materials) for students and staff to maintain availability of updated resources (General Fund budget and REAP Grant funding); Network support services to protect infrastructure & provide direction

Raising Standards:

- <u>Continue to update</u> all areas of the curriculum to current NJ Student Learning Standards
- <u>Maintain i-Ready</u> curriculum supports and i-Ready assessment
- <u>Achieve full</u> implementation of the NJSLS and ensure ALL students reach their highest potential using student-centered programs and supports
- <u>Continue the focus</u> on organizing classrooms for a variety of learning opportunities that encourage whole group activities, small group activities, independent learning, and cooperative learning

- <u>Student handbooks</u>, social media coverage, district website, messaging system, OnCourse SIS



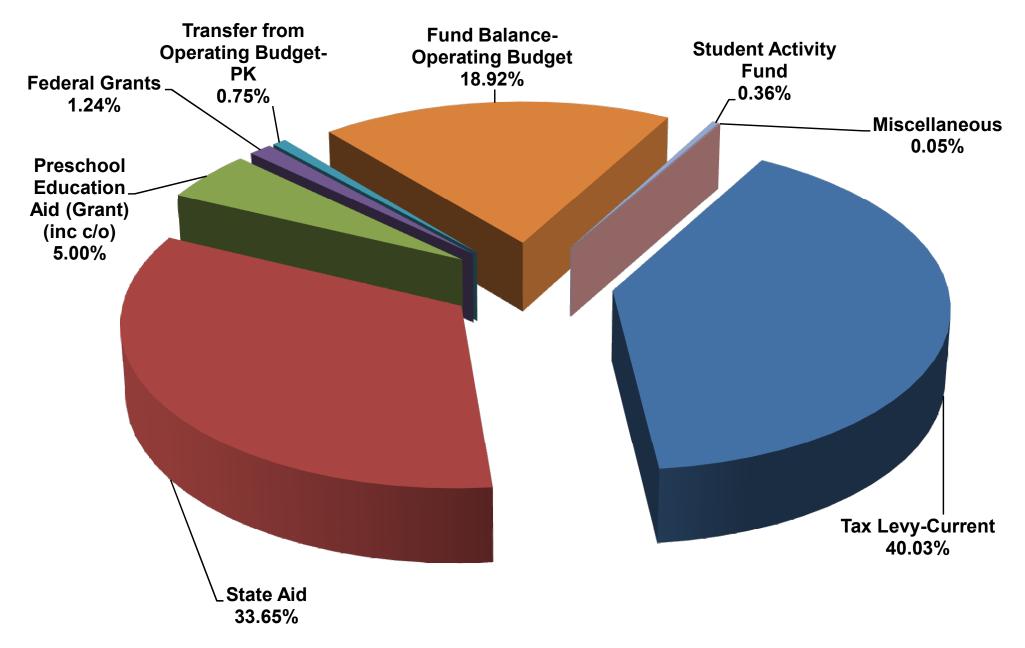

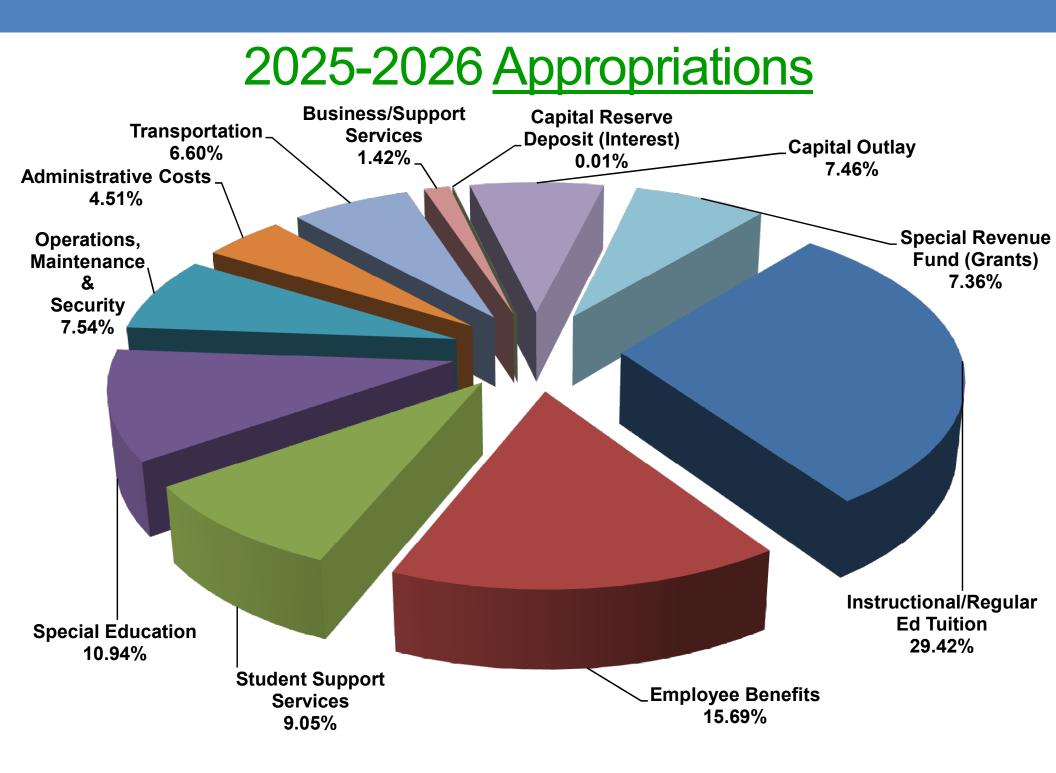
