What is it?

We Are Better Together

- Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parental involvement. These staff trainings will include strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement. Staff will also share best practices during faculty functions.
