Dear Parishioners.

Welcome to the Season of Lent. This is a holy season patterned after the Lord's fasting in the wilderness 40 days preparing Him for His public ministry, the 40 days of rain during Noah's ark that brought renewal to the world, and the 40-year pilgrimage in the desert with the Hebrews under Moses which prepared them to enter in the Promised Land.

Our Lenten pilgrimage of 40 days prepares us for our call to follow God more closely, renews us in the life of grace, and prepares us to enter into the Promised Land through the death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. When we conform to Him and the pattern He traces for us, we grow in holiness.

Our Church gives us for reflection this first Sunday of Lent the temptation narrative. In them, we hear of Jesus's being tempted, a fact that should bring comfort to us as it demonstrates that temptation itself is not a sin, but giving in to

Our Lord does not dialogue with the devil but speaks truth to the lies he spews through scripture. This is a great model for us – may we be so filled with the knowledge of scripture that we recognize the lies of the evil one, the world, and our own brokenness and know the truth.

I received formal word this week that the pilgrimage to the Holy Land is a go. The cost is up (about \$5,150 versus the previous \$4,900), but we are staying in a better hotel while in Jerusalem for 5 days (it is across the street from one of the main city gates of the Old City).

I have posted the flyer on my facebook page (both personal – frtoddpetersen – and professional – Fr. Todd Petersen – as well as the St. Edward Facebook page. For now, and at least a week, the registration link is private, allowing those who have expressed interest to register before we open it up to anyone else. If you are interested, here's the link:

LENTEN MESSAGE FROM POPE FRANCIS

Pope Francis said the call to hope and trust in God and in eternal life is also an important aspect of Lenten conversion. Some questions to ponder include: "Am I convinced that the Lord forgives my sins? Or do I act as if I can save myself? Do I long for salvation and call upon God's help to attain it? Do I concretely experience the hope that enables me to interpret the events of history and inspires in me a commitment to justice and fraternity, to care for our common home and in such a way that no one feels excluded?"

"This Lent, God is asking us to examine whether in our lives, in our families, in the places where we work and spend our time, we are capable of walking together with others, listening to them, resisting the temptation to become self-absorbed and to think only of our own needs," he said.


