RETURN-TO-SCHOOL Plan

Greetings Clark School District Families,

We realize, now more than ever, the importance of effective communication between the school district and our stakeholders. Our Administrative team, along with help from our district COVID-19 Taskforce have prepared a "Return-to-School" (RTS) plan. The RTS plan established guidelines and procedures that district personnel and students will follow to help mitigate risk to the COVID-19 virus. Our district's COVID-19 Taskforce is made up of Clark School District school board members, administrators, counselor, grade level teachers, and local health care professionals.

The protocols outlined in this document are subject to change as needed to maintain the safety of staff and students given the changing circumstances across the state and local community.

Overview:

The last two school years have been marked with numerous challenges as a result of the COVID-19 global pandemic. We feel that in-person learning in the classroom between students and teachers is the most effective and beneficial mode of student learning. Our schools play an instrumental role in the academic, social, and emotional health and success of our students. As we enter the upcoming school year, we will look to return to more normal operations, while still maintaining the ability to return to key risk mitigation processes while we continually monitor current school and community health conditions. We do not take the following decisions lightly and we base them on our shared experiences and feedback that we have taken from our school board, administration, staff, students, and stakeholders.

Summary of Action Steps that will guide district personnel:

- 1. Mitigate risk/spread by encouraging respect of personal space, self-monitoring of COVID symptoms, staying home if one feels sick, proper hand hygiene, and sanitization.
- 2. Monitor positive COVID-19 cases and its spread in the Clark School District and surrounding community, while working closely with local health care professionals to help make the necessary adjustments to mitigation strategies as needed.
- 3. Modify our school procedures, content delivery, and instructional strategies, however necessary to help ensure the health and well-being of students and staff.

Summary of Key RTS Provisions:

- 1. Parents will pre-screen their children at home for fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficult breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion, runny nose, vomiting, or diarrhea.
 - a. Call your medical professional if symptomatic.
 - b. Students shall not report to school if symptomatic.
 - c. Staff will pre-screen at home and follow the same procedure above.
- 2. If a student or staff member becomes COVID symptomatic during the school day, they will be sent home.
- 3. The Clark School District is not participating in diagnostic and screening testing for COVID-19.
- 4. Staff and students are encouraged to contact their medical healthcare provider if they are interested in receiving a COVID-19 vaccination.
- 5. The Clark School District will be working with community health programs to help facilitate Flu Shot vaccinations in both the elementary and high school buildings.
- 6. Masks are recommended in settings where physical distancing of 3 feet or less between students/staff, but are not required.

- 7. Hand washing, proper personal cough/sneeze etiquette, and frequent cleaning of work surfaces will continue to be emphasized. Hand sanitizer will still be available in hallways, common spaces, and classrooms.
- 8. Positive Cases:
 - a. Positive cases either reported by DOH or the parent. There will be two options when a positive COVID case is reported, individuals may choose one of the following:
 - i. 10-day isolation from the onset of symptoms and return when symptom free.
 - ii. 5-day isolation, may return to school and activities if symptom free and wears a mask for an additional 5-days in school, at practice, and school activities.
 - b. The school will support the need for those students and staff to isolate.
 - c. Excused absences and remote work would be offered to students.
- 9. Close Contacts:
 - a. Tracking of Close Contacts, "Contact Tracing", will no longer be done in the school setting. DOH may contact staff and students due to close contact exposure outside of school.
 - i. The school will support the need for those students and staff to quarantine when notified by the DOH.
 - ii. Close contacts will be able to attend school if they are symptom free (asymptomatic).
 - iii. Excused absences for students and remote work would be offered to students.
- 10. Communication & Personal Responsibility
 - To help maintain a safe learning environment and a continued return to a more "normal" school environment and function, the Clark School District asks parents/guardians to communicate promptly with their child's school in the event of a positive diagnosis of COVID-19.
 - b. We ask that parents err on the side of caution if COVID symptoms are present in their children that stay home until they are symptom free or see their healthcare professional.
- 11. The Clark School District will continue to meet students' social, emotional, and mental health needs through the following methods:
 - a. District provided counseling services
 - b. Self-care programming appropriate to each grade level
 - c. District coordinated counseling services
 - d. Positive relationship building between students and staff
- 12. The Clark School District will continue to meet our staff's social, emotional, and mental health needs through the following avenues:
 - a. Allow the use of personal days
 - b. Use of professional development time to check in with staff concerns and well-being.
 - c. Encourage communication and collaboration among all staff members in order to promote healthy working relationships.
 - d. Continue to develop and maintain a warm and positive school climate and culture.

Implementation of the measures in this plan are based partly on CDC, DOH, local healthcare professionals, and input from community and school stakeholders. Adaptation and flexibility are key in responding to the risk of COVID. We feel we need to balance risk mitigation and providing a quality educational experience to our students.
